"QUIEL" INTENSIFIES INTO A TYPHOON WHILE MOVING SOUTHWESTWARD.

- "QUIEL" intensified into a Typhoon at 2PM. Slight intensification in the next 24 hours remain likely.
- Between today and tomorrow afternoon, moderate with occasional heavy rains will be experienced over Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Isabela, Apayao and Ilocos Norte. Light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains will affect Mindoro Provinces, Palawan and Western Visayas.
- Residents of the aforementioned areas, especially those living in areas
 identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to floods and rain-induced
 landslides, are advised to take precautionary measures, coordinate with local
 disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for
 updates, especially the Thunderstorm or Rainfall Advisories and Heavy
 Rainfall Warnings to be issued by PAGASA Regional Services Division.
- Sea travel is risky, especially for small sea vessels, over the seaboards of northern Luzon and western seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon due to prevailing or forecast rough sea conditions.
- "QUIEL" is forecast exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) between tonight and tomorrow morning and head generally westward towards Vietnam.
- Active tropical cyclone outside the PAR: At 2:00 PM today, the eye of Severe Tropical Storm "HALONG" was located based on all available data at 3,525 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (28.1°N, 155.8°E) with maximum sustained winds of 100 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 125 km/h. It is moving Northeast at 35 km/h and is now outside the Tropical Cyclone Information domain. This will be the final update on this weather system,

Location of eye/center:	 At 4:00 PM today, the center of Typhoon "QUIEL" was estimated based on all available data at 430 km West of Coron, Palawan (12.5 °N, 116.3 °E)
Strength:	 Maximum sustained winds of 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 150 kph
Movement:	 Moving Southwest at 10 kph
Forecast Positions:	 24 Hour(Tomorrow afternoon): 155 km North of Pagasa Island, Palawan (Outside PAR) (12.4°N, 113.9°E) 48 Hour(Sunday afternoon):415 km West Northwest of Pagasa Island, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR)(13.0°N, 110.9°E) 72 Hour(Monday afternoon): 700 km West Northwest of Pagasa Island, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR)(13.9°N, 108.4°E)
