"QUIEL" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH AND IS ABOUT TO EXIT THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (PAR).

- Between today and tomorrow evening, the Tail-End of a Cold Front will bring light to moderate with occasional heavy rains over Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Isabela, Apayao and Ilocos Norte.
- Residents of the aforementioned areas, especially those living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to floods and rain-induced landslides, are advised to take precautionary measures, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates, especially the Thunderstorm or Rainfall Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings to be issued by PAGASA Regional Services Division.
- Sea travel is risky, especially for small sea vessels, over the seaboards of northern Luzon and western seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon due to prevailing or forecast rough sea conditions.
- "QUIEL" is forecast exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) between 11PM today and 2AM tomorrow then it will head generally westward towards Vietnam.

Location of eye/center:	 At 10:00 PM today, the center of Typhoon "QUIEL" was estimated based on all available data at 535 km West of Coron, Palawan (12.5 °N, 115.3 °E)
Strength:	 Maximum sustained winds of 120 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 150 kph
Movement:	 Moving Southwest at 15 kph
Forecast Positions:	 24 Hour(Tomorrow evening): 800 km West of Coron, Palawan (Outside PAR) (12.7°N, 112.9°E) 48 Hour(Sunday evening): 1,120 km West of Coron, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR)(13.3°N, 110.0°E)

72 Hour(Monday evening): 1,385 km West Northwest of Coron,
 Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR)(14.5°N, 107.7°E)
