PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Storm "Ramon" {Kalmaegi} was estimated based on all available data at **490 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (16.9° N, 126.3° E)** with maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h. It remains almost stationary. Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern Luzon.

Occidental Mindoro - Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Abra de Ilog, Cagaray, Labangan, Magbando, Lumintao, Anahawin, Monpong, Amnay, Pola, Pagbahan, Mamburao and Ibod.

Lucia, Lugan Malaybalay, Maapon, Bucal (Lalangan), Lakayat, Tignoan, Agos, Anibawan (Polilio Island) and Upper Kilbay – Catabangan. • Laguna - Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Pagsanjan, Pila-Sta. Cruz, San Juan and San Cristobal. • Cavite - Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Laboc (Balsahan), Cañas, Ilang-Ilang and Imus. • Batangas – Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Lian, Banabang-Molino, Pansipit, Kapumpong, Rosario-Lobo and Upper Bolbok (Lawaya). • Rizal – Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Upper Marikina and Kaliwa.

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Catanduanes - Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Cabuyan, Bato and Pajo. • Camarines Sur- Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Lower Kilbay, Catabangan, Ragay, Tinalmud, Tambang and Lagonoy. • Camarines Norte - Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Labo and Daet Basud. • Sorsogon – Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Lower Donsol, Ogod, Putiao, Cadacan, Banauang-Duan, Fabrica (Tugbugan) and Matinog. • Albay – Particularly rivers and its tributaries of Guinale and Upper Donsol.

People living near the mountain slopes and low-lying areas near the above-mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) concerned are still advised to take necessary precautionary measures.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
