PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 AM today, the center of Severe Tropical Storm "SARAH" (FUNG-WONG) was estimated based on all available data at 335 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes (22.3 °N, 124.5 °E), with maximum sustained winds of 95 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 115 km/h. It is moving North at 20 km/h. Meanwhile, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) (formerly "RAMON") was estimated based on all available data at 665 km West Southwest of Subic, Zambales or 560 km West of Coron, Palawan (11.6 °N, 115.1 °E).

stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
