PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "Ramon" (Kalmaegi) was estimated based on all available data at **205 km East Northeast of Casiguran, Aurora (17.2° N, 123.8° E)** with maximum sustained winds of **85 km/h** near the center and gustiness of up to **105 km/h**. It is moving west at **10 km/h**.

WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Isabela - particularly Dikatayan, Dinilican and Palanan-Pinacanauan.• Cagayan - particularly Linao, Lower Abulug, Lower Pamplona, Cabcungan, Aunugay, Baua, Palawaig and Taboan.• QUIRINO – all Rivers and Tributaries

No. 01 for CAR (Cordillera Administrative Region)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Apayao - particularly Upper Abulug.• Benguet – particularly Upper Bauang.• Ifugao – all rivers and its tributaries.• Mountain Province – all rivers and its tributaries.• Abra – Particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin.• Kalinga – all rivers and its tributaries

People living near the mountain slopes and low-lying areas near the above-mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) concerned are still advised to take necessary precautionary measures.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
