### **PRESENT WEATHER:**

AT **3:00 PM** TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM “QUIEL” (NAKRI) WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT **455 KM WEST NORTHWEST OF CORON, PALAWAN (13.7°N, 116.4°E)** WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF **75 KM/H** NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO **90 KM/H**. IT REMAINS **ALMOST STATIONARY**. TAIL-END OF A COLD FRONT AFFECTING NORTHERN LUZON.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
