### **PRESENT WEATHER:**

AT **3:00 AM** TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM "QUIEL" (NAKRI) WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT **400 KM WEST NORTHWEST OF CORON, PALAWAN (13.4°N, 116.8°E)** WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF **85 KM/H** NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO **105 KM/H. IT IS MOVING EAST SOUTHEAST SLOWLY.** TAIL-END OF A COLD FRONT AFFECTING NORTHERN LUZON.
