AT 3:00 PM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TYPHOOON "TISOY" {KAMMURI} WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 605 KM EAST OF VIRAC, CATANDUANES (13.1degN, 129.8degE) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 140KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 170KM/H. IT IS MOVING WEST AT 20KM/H. NORTHEAST MONSOON AFFECTING LUZON.
