STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS ARE EXPECTED TO AFFECT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

THE NORTHERN AND EASTERN SEABOARDS OF NORTHERN LUZON (Batanes, Calayan, Babuyan, Cagayan, and Isabela)	Cloudy skies with scattered rains	(45-63)/(24-34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5
THE WESTERN SEABOARD OF NORTHERN LUZON (Ilocos Norte)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rains.	(45-63)/(24-34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5
THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF CENTRAL LUZON (Aurora)	Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms	(45 - 63) / (24 - 34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 - 4.5
THE EASTERN SEABOARDS OF SOUTHERN LUZON AND OF VISAYAS (Camarines Norte, Northern Camarines Sur, Quezon including Polilio Island, Catanduanes, Eastern Samar, Eastern section of Southern Leyte)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms.	(45-63)/(24-34)	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5

Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels are alerted against big waves.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and

reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties. Submit report on actions taken.
