STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS IS EXPECTED TO AFFECT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged -Twigs of small trees may be brokenRice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage	
Wave Height: (Open Sea) 1.25-4.0 meters					

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 350 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Scattered to widespread rain is expected over Visayas and Bicol Region.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Bicol Region, of Eastern Visayas due to moderate to rough seas associated with the approaching Tropical Depression.
