Severe Weather Bulletin No. 14 re Tropical Storm "URDUJA"

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Storm "URDUJA" has slightly intensified as it continues to move slowly off the Eastern Coast of Samar Island.

- Expected to make landfall over Northern Samar-Eastern Samar area between tomorrow morning and afternoon.
- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 500 km diameter of the Tropical Storm.
- Scattered to widespread rains will continue over Eastern Visayas and CARAGA is
 expected to prevail over Bicol Region and the rest of Visayas within 24 hours.
 Residents of these areas are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides and
 coordinate with their respective local government and disaster risk reduction
 and management offices.
- Sea travel remains risky over the eastern seaboards of Bicol region and of Visayas due to the approaching Tropical Storm.

#2 (61-120kph expected in 24 hrs)		Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran,		- Light to Moderate damage to high risk structures; - Very light to light damage to medium-risk structures; - No damage to very light damage to low risk structures - Unshielded, old dilapidated schoolhouses, makeshift shanties, and other structures of light materials are partially damaged or unroofed A number of nipa and cogon houses may be partially or totally unroofed Some old galvanized iron (G.I.) roofs may be peeled or blown off Some wooden, old electric posts are tilted or downed Some damage to poorly constructed signs/billboards - In general, the winds may bring light to moderate damage to the exposed communities. Most banana plants, a few mango trees, ipil-ipil and similar types of trees are downed or broken - Some coconut trees may be tilted with few others broken - Rice and corn may be adversely affected - Considerable damage to shrubbery and trees with some heavy-foliaged trees blown down.

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged - Twigs of small trees may be broken - Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage.
