I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Volcanic Earthquake

The Philippine Seismic Network (PSN) plotted a total of **743 volcanic earthquakes** as of **25 January 2020, 4:00 AM**. 176 of these registered at magnitudes 1.2 – 4.1 and were felt at Intensities I – V.

If the eruption column remains at 5.0 km or below, the ash plumes may be drifted to the Municipalities west and northwest of Taal Volcano. However, if a major eruption occurs within the forecast period and the column exceeds 7.0 km, ash plumes may also be drifted over the western parts of Laguna and Quezon.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total **90,533 families / 348,563 persons** (previous report: 88,842 families / 346,244 persons) were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of **37,445 / 137,994 persons** (previous report: 37,311 / 137,538 persons) are taking temporary shelter in **488 evacuation centers** while **38,102 families / 148,271 persons** (previous report: 37,230 families / 144,907 persons) are served outside ECs.
- The LGUs of Alitagtag, Balayan, Batangas City, Bauan, Calatagan, Ibaan, Lian, Lipa City, Lobo, Malvar, Nasugbu, Padre Garcia, Rosario, San Jose, San Juan, San Luis, San Pascual, Santa Teresita, Sto. Tomas, Taysan, and Tuy in Batangas; Alfonso, Amadeo, Dasmariñas, General Emilio Aguinaldo, Indang, Maragondon, Mendez (Mendez- Nuñez), Naic, Silang, Tagaytay City, and Ternate in Cavite; Alaminos, Bay, Cabuyao, City of Calamba, Cavinti, Kalayaan, Los Baños, Magdalena, Nagcarlan, San Pablo City, Santa Cruz, and City of Sta. Rosa in Laguna; Candelaria, Dolores, Gumaca, Infanta, Pagbilao, Pitogo, San Antonio, Sariaya, and Tiaong in Quezon; and Caloocan, **Makati**, Malabon, Manila, **Marikina**, Muntinlupa, Parañaque, Taguig, Quezon City, San Juan and **Valenzuela** in NCR hosted IDPs from affected municipalities.

B. Status of Lifelines

- e. 12 personnel from NHQ picked-up 480 pails of assorted goods, 402 bottles of water (7 liters), 12 packs of diapers (288pcs.), and 16 boxes of coffees (384 packs) at Solaire, Pasay City.
- f. 12 personnel from NHQ distributed relief goods containing 69 pails of assorted food packs, 70 bottles of water (7 liters), and 4 boxes of diapers to Brgy. - e. Deployed resources such as 2 buses, 2 service pick-up, 2 Fire trucks, 1 flat bed truck, 1 rescue pick-up, 1 EMS, 1 Ambulance, and 54 human resources on board.
- f. SSSD together with CSWD representative from Tanauan City distributed 160 partition tents, 150 sleeping mats, 150 blankets, and mobile showers for the evacuees.
- g. QCDRRMO Team went to Bolbok Batangas Sports Complex for check-in procedures to Provincial Incident Command Management Team and Incident Command Post.
- h. SSDD personnel donated 160 partition tents, 150 sleeping mats, and 686 sanitary napkins, and diapers to Sto. Tomas, Batangas Evacuation Center.
