I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Volcanic Earthquake

The Philippine Seismic Network (PSN) plotted a total of **747 volcanic earthquakes** as of **26 January 2020, 5:00 AM**. 176 of these registered at magnitudes 1.2 - 4.1 and were felt at Intensities I - V.

If the eruption column remains at 5.0 km or below, the ash plumes may be drifted to the Municipalities west and northwest of Taal Volcano. However, if a major eruption occurs within the forecast period and the column exceeds 7.0 km, ash plumes may also be drifted over the western parts of Laguna and Quezon.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total <u>98,187 families / 376,327 persons</u> (previous report: 90,533 families / 348,563 persons) were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of <u>37,203 / 135,365 persons</u> (previous report: 37,445 / 137,994 persons) are taking temporary shelter in <u>497 evacuation centers</u> (previous report: 488 ECs) while <u>43,824 families / 168,569 persons</u> (previous report: 38,102 families / 148,271 persons) are served outside ECs.

Tomas, Taysan, and Tuy in Batangas; Alfonso, Amadeo, Dasmariñas, General Emilio Aguinaldo, Indang, Maragondon, Mendez (Mendez- Nuñez), Naic, Silang, Tagaytay City, and Ternate in Cavite; Alaminos, Bay, Cabuyao, City of Calamba, Cavinti, Kalayaan, Los Baños, Magdalena, Nagcarlan, San Pablo City, Santa Cruz, and City of Sta. Rosa in Laguna; Candelaria, Dolores, Gumaca, Infanta, Pagbilao, Pitogo, San Antonio, Sariaya, and Tiaong in Quezon; and Caloocan, Makati, Malabon, Manila, Marikina, Muntinlupa, Parañaque, Taguig, Quezon City, San Juan and Valenzuela in NCR hosted IDPs from affected municipalities.

- q. 1701st RRIBde provided assistance to the LGU and organizers during the repacking and distribution of relief goods at Tagaytay City Hall Compound, Cavite.
- r. Charlie Coy, 401st RRIBn and ROTC cadets provided manpower assistance to Brgy. Officials and Staff of MDRRMO during the installation/establishment of mega collapsible tent in the vicinity of Brgy. Caloocan, Balayan, Batangas to be used as temporary shelter for the evacuees.

5. Department of Health (DOH)

DOH Centers for Health Development (MM, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Ilocos, Cagayan Valley, Bicol)

Continuous coordination with the Local Government Units, Disaster Risk Reduction and Coordinating Councils (DRRMCs), deployed teams, and participated in the continuous assessment and response operations while augmenting resource needs.

6. Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)

- a. Delivered 3,750 face mask to four (4) DEOs in Batangas Province coming from the DPWH Central Office; 1,120 N95 face masks from Regions CALABARZON and V; 1,200 N95 mask; and 21,300 ordinary face masks from Region III.
- b. Utilized maintenance Crew and dump trucks for relief distributions.
- c. Transported sacks of rice and relief goods from NFA Office, Batangas to Cuenca Central School, Cuenca, Batangas, and Balete, Batangas.
- d. Conducted regravelling of unpaved roads at Brgy. Laurel, San Pascual, Batangas.

7. Department of Agriculture (DA)

- a. DA-BAI provided one truck for animal rescue and evacuation, and initially delivered 20 bags of feeds. Additional 250 bags of animal feeds (100 bags cattle feeds, 100 bags hog grower, and 50 bags chicken grower mash) were delivered to DA Livestock Operations Center in Lipa City, Batangas.
- b. Allocated a total amount of ₱5,300,000.00 for the rehabilitation of coconut plantation in the municipalities of Batangas. The said budget is allocated for the procurement of local coconut seedlings and intercropping package (banana and coffee).
- c. A total of 148 animals (26 sow, 4 boar, 44 gilts, 18 piglets, and 56 assorted birds and poultry) were rescued on the Learning Site of ATI in Kinalaglagan, Mataas na Kahoy. The rescued animals were brought to Don Leon Farm in San Juan, Batangas.

d. DA-BSWM conducted soil sampling in ash fall affected areas in Cavite and Batangas and initially recommended that plowing can be done to incorporate volcanic ash to the original soil for the rehabilitation of agricultural areas. Monitoring and sample collection will be done within 10 km distance once normal condition resumes.

8. Philippine National Police (PNP)
