#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

## A. Volcanic Earthquake

The Taal Volcano Network (TVN) plotted a total of 2,132 volcanic earthquakes as of 06 February 2020, 1:39 AM.

#### II. EFFECTS

## A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total <u>133,407 families / 501,022 persons</u> (previous report: 129,171 families / 483,389 persons) were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of <u>6,299 families / 22,152 persons</u> (previous report: <u>5,953 families / 20,927 persons</u>) are taking temporary shelter in <u>127 evacuation centers</u> (previous report: 129) while <u>58,638 families / 220,304 persons</u> (previous report: 55,036 families / 204,912 persons) are served outside ECs.
- The LGUs of Alitagtag, Balayan, Batangas City, Bauan, Calaca, Calatagan, Ibaan, Lian, Lipa City, Lobo, Malvar, Nasugbu, Padre Garcia, Rosario, San Jose, San Luis, San Pascual, Santa Teresita, Sto. ## B. Status of Lifelines

## Roads
