#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

## A. Volcanic Earthquake

The Taal Volcano Network (TVN) plotted a total of 2,172 volcanic earthquakes as of 06 February 2020, 7:32 PM.

#### II. EFFECTS

## A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total <u>133,696 families / 501,908 persons</u> (previous report: 133,407 families / 501,022 persons) were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of <u>6,206 families / 21,732 persons</u> (previous report: <u>6,299 families / 22,152 persons</u>) are taking temporary shelter in <u>128 evacuation centers</u> (previous report: 127 evacuation centers) while <u>58,785 families / 220,741 persons</u> (previous report: 58,638 families / 220,304 persons) are served outside ECs.
- The LGUs of Alitagtag, Balayan, Batangas City, Bauan, Calaca, Calatagan, Ibaan, Lian, Lipa City, Lobo, Malvar, Nasugbu, Padre Garcia, Rosario, San Jose, San Luis, San Pascual, Santa Teresita, Sto.
