I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Volcanic Earthquake

A total of **714 volcanic earthquakes** were plotted in Taal region as of **20 January 2020, 6:00 AM**. Of which, **176 were felt**, ranging from **Magnitude 1.2 – 4.1** and **Intensity of I – V**.

If the eruption column remains at **3.0 km** or below, the ash plumes will be drifted to the municipalities **southwest and west** of Taal Volcano. However, if a major eruption occurs within the forecast period and the column exceeds **5 km**, ash plumes will also be drifted over the **Metro Manila, Laguna, and some parts of Rizal and northern Quezon**.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total **53,716 families / 215,773 persons** (previous report: 50,599 families / 203,763 persons) were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of **29,424 families / 112,757 persons** (previous report: 26,767 families / 104,377 persons) are taking temporary shelter in **416 evacuation centers** (previous report: 408 evacuation centers) while **17,505 families / 69,304 persons** are served outside ECs (previous report: 17,391 families / 68,755 persons).
- The LGUs of Alitagtag, Balayan, Batangas City, Bauan, Calatagan, Ibaan, Lian, Lipa City, Malvar, Nasugbu, Rosario, San Jose, San Juan, San Luis, San Pascual, Santa Teresita, Sto. Tomas, Taysan, and Tuy in Batangas; Alfonso, Dasmariñas, Indang, Maragondon, Mendez (Mendez- Nuñez), Naic, Silang, Tagaytay City, and Ternate in Cavite; Cabuyao, City of Calamba, Cavinti, Kalayaan, Nagcarlan, San Pablo City, Santa Cruz, and City of Sta. Rosa in Laguna; and Candelaria, Dolores, Gumaca, Infanta, Pagbilao, Perez, Pitogo, San Antonio, Sariaya, and Tiaong in Quezon hosted IDPs from affected municipalities.

B. Status of Lifelines

Roads

- On 13 January 2020, a total of **3 road sections** were reported closed due to ashfall. Said roads were opened on 14 January 2020.
- On 15 January 2020, Tanauan-Talisay-Tagaytay Road was closed again due to ashfall.
- **To this date, all road sections are passable but a total of 7 road sections were reported closed due to lockdown as safety precautions for the community.**

- c. DA Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) conducted laboratory analyses for water and fish samples in Taal Lake.

Personnel from NHQ Reactionary Standby Support Force (RSSF) and Agoncillo MPS conducted checkpoint along the road of Brgy. Sta Cruz, Agoncillo, Batangas to prevent residents from returning to their residences for their safety.
