I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

27 January 2020, 5:00 PM

At 8:00 AM, Taal Volcano's status was lowered from Alert Level 4 (hazardous eruption imminent) to Alert Level 3 (decreased tendency towards hazardous eruption). The volcano's condition has generally declined in the two weeks following the 12-13 January 2020 main eruptive phase.

From 5:00 AM to 4:00 PM, the Taal Volcano Network (TVN), which can record small earthquakes undetectable by PSN, 46 volcanic earthquakes including 1 tremor earthquake.

Since 8:00 AM, Taal Volcano exhibited wispy to weak emission of white steam plumes.

Alert Level 3 is in effect over Taal Volcano. Alert Level 3 means that there is a decreased tendency towards hazardous explosive eruption but should not be interpreted that unrest has ceased or that the threat of a hazardous eruption has disappeared. Should an uptrend or pronounced change in monitored parameters forewarn a potential hazardous explosive eruption, the Alert Level may be raised back to Alert Level 4. People residing within areas at high risk to base surges who have returned after the Alert Level was stepped down must thus be prepared for a quick and organized evacuation at such time. Conversely, should there be a persistent downtrend in monitored parameters after a sufficient observation period, the Alert Level will be further lowered to Alert Level 2.

DOST-PHIVOLCS reminds the public that at Alert Level 3, sudden steam-driven and even weak phreatomagmatic explosions, volcanic earthquakes, ashfall and lethal volcanic gas expulsions can occur and threaten areas within TVI and nearby lakeshores. DOSTPHIVOLCS recommends that entry into TVI, Taal's Permanent Danger Zone, as well as into areas over Taal Lake and communities west of TVI within a seven (7) kilometer-radius from the Main Crater must be strictly prohibited. Local government units are advised to assess areas outside the seven-kilometer radius for damages and road accessibilities and to strengthen preparedness, contingency and communication measures in case of renewed unrest. People are

also advised to observe precautions due to ground displacement across fissures, frequent ashfall and minor earthquakes. Communities beside active river channels particularly where ash from the main eruption phase has been thickly deposited should increase vigilance when there is heavy and prolonged rainfall since the ash can be washed away and form lahars along the channels. Civil aviation authorities must advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano as airborne ash and ballistic fragments from sudden explosions and wind-remobilized ash may pose hazards to aircrafts. PHIVOLCS-DOST is closely monitoring Taal Volcano's activity and any new significant development will be immediately communicated to all stakeholders.

The Philippine Seismic Network (PSN) plotted a total of **752 volcanic earthquakes** as of **27 January 2020, 4:00 PM**. 176 of these registered at magnitudes 1.2 – 4.1 and were felt at Intensities I – V.

If the eruption column remains at 5.0 km or below, the ash plumes may be drifted to the Municipalities north to southeast of Taal Volcano. However, if a major eruption occurs within the forecast period and the column exceeds 7.0 km, ash plumes may also be drifted over the eastern part of Batangas, western part of Laguna, some parts of Quezon, and Marinduque provinces.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population

- A total **103,443 families / 394,094 persons** were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of **38,377 families / 137,447 persons** are taking temporary shelter in **532 evacuation centers** while **44,414 families / 170,653 persons** are served outside ECs.
- The LGUs of Alitagtag, Balayan, Batangas City, Bauan, Calatagan, Ibaan, Lian, Lipa City, Lobo, Malvar, Nasugbu, Padre Garcia, Rosario, San Jose, San Juan, San Luis, San Pascual, Santa Teresita, Sto. Tomas, Taysan, and Tuy in Batangas; Alfonso, Amadeo, Dasmariñas, General Emilio Aguinaldo, Indang, Maragondon, Mendez (Mendez-Nuñez), Naic, Silang, Tagaytay City, and Ternate in Cavite; Alaminos, Bay,

Cabuyao, City of Calamba, Cavinti, Kalayaan, Los Baños, Magdalena, Nagcarlan, San Pablo City, Santa Cruz, and City of Sta. Rosa in Laguna; Candelaria, Dolores, Gumaca, Infanta, Pagbilao, Pitogo, San Antonio, Sariaya, and Tiaong in Quezon; and Caloocan, Makati, Malabon, Manila, Marikina, Muntinlupa, Parañaque, Taguig, Quezon City, San Juan and Valenzuela in NCR hosted IDPs from affected municipalities.
