I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Volcanic Earthquake

The Taal Volcano Network (TVN) plotted a total of **2,032 volcanic earthquakes** as of **04 February 2020, 1:00 PM**.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total **129,171 families / 483,389 persons** (previous report: 129,010 families/ 482,925 persons) were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of **5,953 families / 20,927 persons** (previous report: 6,830 families / 23,915 persons) are taking temporary shelter in **129 evacuation centers** (previous report: 152 evacuation centers) while **55,036 families / 204,912 persons** (previous report: 60,373 families / 224,188 persons) are served outside ECs.

B. Status of Lifelines
