#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

#### A. Volcanic Earthquake

A total of **725 volcanic earthquakes were plotted** in Taal region as of **22 January 2020**, **6:00 AM**. Of which, 176 were felt, ranging from Magnitude 1.2 - 4.1 and Intensity of I - V.

If the eruption column remains at 3.0 km or below, the ash plumes will be drifted to the municipalities southwest and west of Taal Volcano. However, if a major eruption occurs within the forecast period and the column exceeds 5.0 km, ash plumes may also be drifted over eastern part of Laguna, and some parts of Rizal and Marinduque.

#### II. EFFECTS

## A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total <u>71,717 families / 282,021 persons</u> were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of <u>39,052 families / 148,987 persons</u> are taking temporary shelter in <u>493 evacuation centers</u> while <u>23,133 families / 90,017</u> are served outside ECs.
- The LGUs of Alitagtag, Balayan, Batangas City, Bauan, Calatagan, Ibaan, Lian, Lipa City, Lobo, Malvar, Nasugbu, Padre Garcia, Rosario, San Jose, San Juan, San Luis, San Pascual, Santa Teresita, Sto. Tomas, Taysan, and Tuy in Batangas; Alfonso, Amadeo, Dasmariñas, General Emilio Aguinaldo, Indang, Maragondon, Mendez (Mendez- Nuñez), Naic, Silang, Tagaytay City, and Ternate in Cavite; Cabuyao, City of Calamba, Cavinti, Kalayaan, Nagcarlan, San Pablo City, Santa Cruz, and City of Sta. Rosa in Laguna; and Candelaria, Dolores, Gumaca, Infanta, Pagbilao, Pitogo, San Antonio, Sariaya, and Tiaong in Quezon hosted IDPs from affected municipalities.

- g. WASH Rapid Health Assessment Team visited 3 evacuation centers and conducted extensive meeting with LGU of Balayan, Batangas.

## 4. Philippine National Police (PNP)

- a. Deployed 2,767 SAR personnel from the National and Regional PNP headquarters as of 22 January 2020. Further, a total of 10,132 SAR personnel are on standby.
- b. Deployed 1,956 personnel (NCRPO and PRO CALABARZON) in evacuation areas for security and law and order concerns.
- c. A total of 132,509 civilians have been rescued by PNP.
- d. A total of 244 personnel from PRO CALABARZON were deployed in areas vacated by affected residents.
- e. ITMS RSSF and Lemery PS personnel conducted lockdown/checkpoint at Pansipit Bridge, Brgy. Nagpuloc, Lemery, Batangas.
- f. Police Community Affairs and Development Group (PCADG) proceeded to Solaire, Pasay City to pick-up relief goods and assisted the Officers Ladies Club in repacking goods for the victims of Taal volcano eruption.
- g. NHQ Finance Service Reactionary Standby Support Force (FS-RSSF) and Silang Municipal Police Station conducted clean-up drive at Central Elementary School in Silang, Cavite.
- h. Balete Municipal Police Station and Police Security and Protection Group (PSPG-RSSF) conducted checkpoint at lock down boundary in Malabanan-Balete, Batangas.
- i. Information Technology and Management Service (ITMS-RSSF) and Lemery PS personnel conducted lockdown/checkpoint at Pansipit Bridge, Brgy. Nagpuloc Lemery, Batangas.
- j. Rendered invocation and Biblical Reflection prior to deployment at Evacuation Centers.

#### 5. Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)

a. Deployed a total of 1,434 BFP personnel from Fire Suppression, Special Rescue Unit (SRU), and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Team and a total of 222 assets (200 Fire Trucks, 5 Rescue/Hazmat Trucks, and 17 Ambulances).
