#### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

##### **A. Volcanic Earthquake**

The Taal Volcano Network (TVN) plotted a total of **1,977 volcanic earthquakes** as of **03 February 2020, 12:00 PM.**

#### **II. EFFECTS**

##### **A. Affected Population (TAB A)**

- A total **129,010 families / 482,925 persons** (previous report: 128,311 families / 480,410 persons) were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of **6,830 families / 23,915 persons** (previous report: 7,155 families / 25,327 persons) are taking temporary shelter in **152 evacuation centers** (previous report: 162 ECs) while **60,373 families / 224,188 persons** (previous report: 61,157 families / 226,538 persons) are served outside ECs.
- The LGUs of Alitagtag, Balayan, Balete, Batangas City, Bauan, Calaca, Calatagan, Ibaan, Lian, Lipa City, Lobo, Malvar, Nasugbu, Padre Garcia, Rosario, San Jose, San Luis, San Pascual, Santa Teresita, Sto. Tomas, Taysan, and Tuy in Batangas; Alfonso, Amadeo, Bacoor, Carmona, Dasmariñas, General Emilio Aguinaldo, General Trias, Indang, Maragondon, Mendez (Mendez-Nuñez), Naic, Silang, Tagaytay City, and Ternate in Cavite; Alaminos, Bay, Cabuyao, City of Calamba, Cavinti, Kalayaan, Los Baños, Magdalena, Majayjay, Nagcarlan, Pakil, Pila, San Pablo City, Santa Cruz, and City of Sta. Rosa, and Siniloan in Laguna; Candelaria, Dolores, Gumaca, Infanta, Pagbilao, Pitogo, Real, Sampaloc, San Antonio, Sariaya, City of Tayabas, and Tiaong in Quezon; Angono, City of Antipolo, Baras, Binangonan, Cainta, Cardona, Jala-Jala, Morong, Pililla, Rodriguez (Montalban), Tanay, Taytay, and Teresa in Rizal; and Caloocan, Makati, Malabon, Manila, Marikina, Muntinlupa, Parañaque, Taguig, Quezon City, San Juan, and Valenzuela in NCR hosted IDPs from affected municipalities.
