I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Volcanic Earthquake

A total of **542 volcanic earthquakes** were recorded in Taal region as of **10:00 PM.** Of which, **170 were felt**, ranging from Magnitude 1.2 - 4.1 and Intensity of I - V.

If the eruption column remains at 7 km or below, the ash plumes will be drifted to the municipalities west and southwest of Taal Volcano. However, if a major eruption occurs within the forecast period and the column exceeds 7 km, ash plumes will also be drifted over the eastern and southeastern portions of Batangas and some municipalities of Quezon, Mindoro, and Marinduque.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total <u>14,918 families / 65,184 persons</u> (previous report: <u>12,486 families / 53,019 persons</u>) were affected in the Batangas and Cavite. Of which, a total of <u>12,370 families / 53,832 persons</u> (previous report: 10,000 families / 43,681 persons) are taking temporary shelter in <u>244 evacuation centers</u>.
- The LGUs of Alitagtag, Balayan, Batangas City, Bauan, Calaca, Calatagan, Lian, San Pascual, Sto. Tomas, and Tuy in Batangas, and Alfonso and Tagaytay City in Cavite hosted IDPs from affected municipalities.

III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE

A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC)

1. Office of Civil Defense (OCD)

- a. Facilitated the conduct of Response Cluster Meeting for Worst Case Scenario and Initial Planning ICOW Taal Volcano Eruption on 15 January 2020.
- b. Provided transportation of the donated FNFIs from UP Padayon to Batangas Province.
- c. Facilitated CSC's request for 1 truck to deliver FNFIs (bottled water, biscuits, cup noodles, blankets, toiletries, towels, cooking utensils) to Batangas.
- d. Facilitated the request endorsed by DSWD to OCD for water and electricity supply for the affected residents in Balaan 2, Silang Cavite. OCD coordinated with Manila Water concerning this request.
- e. Continuous facilitation of requests from various donors (public, private, and NGOs) for the delivery of disaster relief and appropriate coordination.
- f. Facilitated the procurement of 10,000 boxes of N95 facemasks.

Coordinated with World Food Programme (WFP) in the provision of Mobile Storage Units as part of their cooperation agreement with DSWD. DSWD-NRLMB shall provide Logistics Plan and coordination on this provision.

- a. Assigned DILG Designated Duty Officer at the NDRRM Opcen;
- b. Attended and participated in the NDRRM Operation Center Response Cluster Meeting on 15 January 2020.
- c. CODIX continuously monitored reports from concerned DILG Regional Offices and LGUs of preparedness and response actions for Taal Volcano eruption operations.

4. Department of Education (DepEd)

Attended Response Cluster Meeting on Planning for Worst Case Scenario on 15 January 2020.

- b. BFP Cuenca and San Nicolas Stations conducted roving and monitoring within their respective AOR.
- c. BFP Tanauan Station conducted rescue operation and monitoring of evacuees.
- d. BFP Talisay Station's personnel proceeded to Tanauan City to be on standby and monitor the volcanic activities of Taal.

- e. BFP Malvar Station conducted monitoring of evacuees.
- f. BFP Lemery Station conducted evacuation, rescue, and flushing.
- g. In Quezon, BFP Dolores Station conducted flushing at Central Elementary School and Palad St. Brgy. Bagong Anyo. Likewise, BFP San Antonio Station distributed relief goods to the evacuees from Batangas province.

PNP Maritime Group

- a. Provided immediate assistance in the evacuations of different LGUs.
- b. Activated 301st Tactical OpCen.
- c. Distributed flyers re "Gabayan sa Kahandaan sa ashfall".
- d. Conducted and assisted in the repacking and distribution of food, water, face masks, first aid kits, clothes, blankets, and sleeping mats.
- e. Assisted DPWH in road clearing and shoveling of ashes along National Highway in Lemery, Batangas.
- f. Provided assistance in the transport of relief goods.

Police Regional Office (PRO) CALABARZON

14 January 2020

At 4:20 PM, PNP-MG personnel were deployed at Dreamzone Capitol Site and distributed relief goods to the evacuees situated thereat. Likewise, on the same day, security preparation was discussed for the visit of the Philippine President and the safety and security of evacuees/victims of Taal Volcano eruption.

15 January 2020

- a. At 9:00 AM, conducted force evacuation with AFP and PCG particularly at Brgy. Niogan, Laurel, and nearby cities/municipalities mostly affected by volcanic eruption.
- b. At 11:30 AM, Rapid Emergency Telecommunications Team (RETT) was activated and ready for dispatch with standby commo equipment. CEU CALABARZON Technical Team proceeded to Lemery MPS along with 1 portable gen set and 20pcs extra battery packs for their use.
- c. NCRPO personnel arrived at Batangas PPO for augmentation
- d. Conducted inspection on Incident Command Post re Taal Volcano eruption.
- e. At 12:30 PM, conducted Relief Operation and Medical Mission at Sto. Tomas North Central led by Team NCRPO and 5 District Directors.
- f. At 12:45 PM, Bulacan PPO, PDRRMO Bulacan Rescue Team, and Bulacan Contingent arrived at People's Mansion, Batangas City to conduct rescue, medical, and relief operations with 4 trucks of relief packs, 1 ambulance, 1 rescue truck, 7 PNP marked vehicle and Personnel Protected Equipment (PPEs).
- g. At 1:00 PM, personnel of General Trias City Police Station (GTCPS) provided security coverage during the distribution of relief goods from the City government of General Trias Cavite to the victims in Tanauan North Central Elementary School and Poblacion III, Sto. Tomas, Batangas.
- h. Composite team of Agoncillo MPS, 730th CG, PAF, 3 teams from 2nd BPMFC and local BFP blocked Brgys Sta Cruz and Pansipit, Agoncillo to prevent civilians from entering the town proper for their own safety.

IV. COST OF ASSISTANCE

A total of <u>P5,551,216.60</u> (previous report: <u>P5,475,788.60</u>) worth of assistance was provided by DSWD and DOH to the affected families.
