I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Volcanic Earthquake

The **Taal Volcano Network (TVN)** plotted a total of **1,788 volcanic earthquakes** as of **01 February 2020, 2:00 PM.** Of these earthquakes, **179** registered at magnitudes 1.2 – 4.1 and were felt at Intensities I – V.

II. EFFECTS

A. Affected Population (TAB A)

- A total <u>127,974 families / 478,876 persons</u> (previous report: <u>126,952 families / 473,332 persons</u>) were affected in the Provinces of Batangas, Quezon, Laguna, and Cavite.
- Of which, a total of <u>7,583 families / 26,588 persons</u> (previous report: <u>10,848 families / 37,163 persons</u> are taking temporary shelter in <u>170 evacuation centers</u> (previous report: <u>248 evacuation centers</u>) while <u>61,137 families / 226,222 persons</u> (previous report: <u>61,391 families / 227,999 persons</u>) are served outside ECs.
