STRONG TO GALE FORCE WINDS ARE EXPECTED TO AFFECT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

SEABOARDS	WEATHER	WIND FORCE (KPH / KNOTS)	SEA CONDITION	WAVE HEIGHT (meters)
THE EASTERN SEABOARDS OF SOUTHERN LUZON, VISAYAS, AND MINDANAO (Northern and Eastern Coasts of Catanduanes, Eastern Coast of Sorsogon, Northern and Eastern Coasts of Northern Samar, Eastern Coast of Eastern Samar, Siargao, Surigao Del Sur, and Eastern Coast of Davao Oriental)	Cloudy skies with light rains	45-63 / 24-34	Rough to very rough	2.8 -4.5

Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels alerted against big waves.

You are hereby directed to still undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the Public, and Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) concerned are still advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate this advisory through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions.
