THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF MINDANAO (Dinagat Island, Siargao, Surigao del Sur, Davao Oriental, and Davao Occidental)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms	45 - 63 / 24 - 34	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5
