<b>THE NORTHERN AND EASTERN SEABOARDS OF LUZON AND THE EASTERN SEABOARDS OF VISAYAS</b> (Batanes, Calayan, Cagayan, Isabela, Aurora, Northern Quezon [Gen. Nakar], Polillo Group of Islands [Panukulan, Northern Burdeos, the northern and eastern coasts of Patnanungan and Jomalig], northern coasts of Camarines Provinces, northern and eastern coasts of Catanduanes, eastern coast of Albay [Rapu-Rapu Island and Batan Island], eastern coast of Sorsogon, northern and eastern coasts of Samar Provinces)	Cloudy skies with rains	45 - 63 / 24 - 34	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5
<b>THE WESTERN SEABOARD OF NORTHERN LUZON, AND THE SOUTHERN AND WESTERN SEABOARD OF SOUTHERN LUZON</b> (Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Palawan, and the southern portion of Mindoro Provinces)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated light rains	45 - 63 / 24 - 34	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5

<b>THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF MINDANAO</b> (Dinagat Island, Siargao, Surigao del Sur, Davao Oriental and Southern Portion of Davao Occidental)	Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with rainshowers	45 - 63 / 24 - 34	Rough to very rough	2.8 to 4.5
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Fishing boats and other small seacrafts are advised not to venture out into the sea while larger sea vessels alerted against big waves.
