I. Initial Report regarding Aviation Incident at San Pedro, Laguna (CALABARZON)

A. Situation Overview

At around 8:00 AM, 05 March 2020, a helicopter crash in Laperal Compound, Barangay San Antonio, San Pedro, Laguna was reported. The chopper with body number RP 3086 bell 429 accidentally hit the high-tension wire while on take-off. The said chopper carried 8 passengers involving PNP officials.

B. Casualties

All of 8 helicopter passengers were reported injured, and were brought to the nearest hospitals:

C. Actions Taken

- OCD CALABARZON is closely monitoring the incident and coordinating with the PDRRMO Laguna, San Pedro CDRRMO, and PNP.
- HPG Personnel and Medical Personnel responded to the incident, and a fire truck on standby to control the fire.
- Local HPG and PNP condoned and secured the area.

I. Final Report regarding 34th People Power Anniversary Commemoration (NCR)

A. Situation Overview

In commemoration of the peaceful demonstration that occurred in 1986 at the Epifanio De Los Santos Avenue (EDSA), every 25th of February is declared a Special Non-working Holiday. A number of people are expected to celebrate and flock along EDSA (Ortigas-Santolan), EDSA Shrine, People Power Monument (Corner White Plains Avenue) and other public places in Metro Manila. The Metro Manila Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council closely monitored any eventualities thru coordination and collaboration with council members and City DRRMOs.

B. Actions Taken

OCD NCR

- Issued Memorandum MMDRRMC Memorandum No. 9, s. 2020 regarding Alert Status in Observance of People Power Revolution Commemoration advising the Member Agencies and Local DRRMOs to be on heightened alert.
- Heightened alert status and continuously monitor the situation through the LDRRMOs for any eventualities on a 24/7 shifting schedule at OCD NCR Operations Center.

NCRPO

- Conducted Interagency Security Preparations Meeting on 9:00 AM, 24 February 2020 at QCPD Conference Room, Camp Karingal, Quezon City.
- Monitored for threats identified by intelligence community.
- Mobilized crowd control personnel in different hot locations to maintain peace and order.

NICA NCR

- Presented the threat assessment in connection with the activity to include the following agendas: Human Rights Violations, Press Freedom and Ouster groups.
- Monitored the activities of identified groups: protesters, ousters and other possible threats during the activity.

DILG NCR

- Issued Memorandum to DILG Field Offices to accomplish the monitoring template with regard to peace and order situation:
 - Details of rallies, protests or other related activities, including the venues and involved personalities;
 - Affected routes, which may cause traffic congestions;
 - Actions undertaken by the city/municipal governments to maintain and ensure the peace and order and public safety within their areas of responsibility;
- Maintained close coordination with all seventeen (17) LGUs and shall be providing additional updates as necessary.

DSWD NCR

- Monitored weather conditions and other emergencies through telephone, internet, cell phone by the Disaster Response Management Division Staff and Quick Response Team Leaders.

- DROMIC Focal Person prepared and consolidated disaster reports generated from the 24 hours monitoring.
- Provided Disaster Assistance Family Access Card to requesting LGUs.
- Ensured to maximize the availability and accessibility of four vehicles for possible deployment.
- Activated Quick Response Teams of DSWD-NCR and placed on standby in response to any eventualities.
- Coordinated with the Local Government Units thru their respective Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) for reports on incidents requiring augmentation assistance from the FO-NCR.
- With Standby Fund amounting to ₱3,000,000.00.
- Prepositioned the following stockpiles and commodities on standby:

Metro Manila Center for Health Development (MMCHD)

- Raised Code White Alert and advised personnel to remain vigilant and monitor the development of the event.
- Directed all Regional Medical Teams, WASH/Health Education Teams, and District Health Teams to be on-call status and render 12-hours duty once activated.

CDRRMC Las Piñas City

- Heightened alert status in anticipation of the influx of people in public places of the city on 8:00 AM, 24 February 2020 to 5:00PM, 25 February 2020.
- Placed all Emergency Response Personnel on standby for any disaster related eventualities that may arise from this occasion.
- Heightened alert status of all PNP Las Piñas City personnel to be on standby at their designated police precincts for possible civil disturbance management.
- Informed all barangays to closely monitor and manage the situation in their area of responsibility and coordinate with the CDRRM Operations Center.
- monitored the situation on the ground at the CDRRM Operations Center through coordination with all concerned stakeholders.

CDRRMC Malabon City

- Placed Coordination, Command & Control (C3) with 21 Barangays, Volunteer, other stakeholders, response personnel, vehicles, and equipment on standby for any eventualities.
- Monitored all media platforms regarding the event and maintains coordination with OCD, MMDA and DILG for the reports related to the event.

CDRRMC Manila City

- Heightened alert and continuously monitoring for any eventualities.

- Placed Manila City Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Staff and Response Personnel are on standby for possible deployment.
- Prepositioned the following response assets on standby:

CDRRMC Parañaque City

- Disseminated advisories and MMDA bulletins through social media platforms.
- Monitored situation in EDSA Shrine and its vicinity through MMDA.
- Advised motorists on road closures and re-routing along EDSA, Ortigas, and Katipunan Avenue.
- Coordinated with 16 Barangay DRRM Committees regarding possible emergency situations.

CDRRMC Quezon City

- Coordinated with QC Task Force – Transport and Traffic Management (QCTF-TTM) and QCDRRMC.
- Deployed Emergency Preparedness and Response Team.

CDRRMC Mandaluyong City

Tasked the PNP Mandaluyong as force multiplier with the Eastern Police District.
