I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

At 10:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at **180 km South Southeast of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (8.2°N, 119.2°E)**. This LPA is not expected to develop into a tropical depression and may dissipate within 24 to 48 hours. However, this weather disturbance will bring light to moderate with isolated heavy rains during thunderstorms over Palawan. The next update on this LPA will be incorporated in the 4:00 PM Public Weather Forecast today. Meanwhile, the tail-end of a cold front has receded and is no longer affecting the country.

With this development, this is the final advisory for these weather systems.

Residents in the aforementioned areas, especially those living in highly susceptible to flooding and rain-induced landslides are advised to take appropriate actions, coordinate with the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (LDRRMOs), and continue monitoring for updates including the thunderstorms or rainfall advisories, heavy rainfall warnings issued by the PAGASA Regional Services Division.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN:

NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Weather Advisory No. 03 (FINAL)** to OCD Regional Offices **MIMAROPA and V**, through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
