#### **I. CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS AND TROPICAL CYCLONE ANALYSIS**

##### **03 December 2014**

- A Typhoon (TY), with International Name "HAGUPIT", was spotted outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR)

##### **04 December 2014**

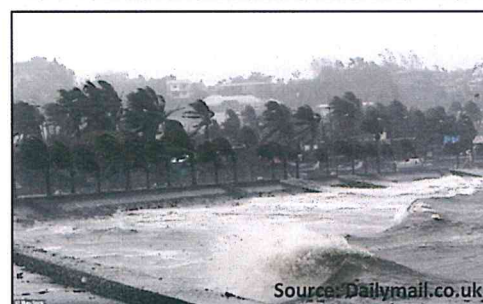
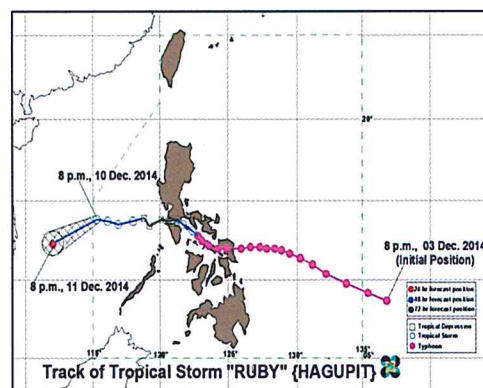
- In the early morning, TY "HAGUPIT" entered PAR with winds of 175 kph near the center with gust of 210 kph and was named "RUBY" making it the 18th Tropical Cyclone to enter PAR
- It intensified further as it continues to move west northwest towards Eastern Visayas and Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) No. 1 was hoisted in Samar and Leyte Province

##### **05 December 2014**

- TY "RUBY" further intensified at 215 kph near the center with gust of 250 kph as it continued moving towards west northwest towards the Eastern Samar-Northern Samar area at a slower pace of 15 kph
- In the evening of the same day, it slightly weakened as it continues to move West Northwest at 10 kph towards the Eastern Samar – Northern Samar area. PSWS No. 3 was hoisted over Samar Provinces, PSWS No. 2 over Leyte Provinces, Central Visayas, Bicol Region, and Dinagat Island, and PSWS No. 1 over the rest of Southern Luzon, rest of Visayas, and Northeastern Mindanao

##### **06 December 2014**

- TY "RUBY" weakened to 175 kph near the center and continued to threaten Samar Provinces. In the evening, "RUBY" made its first landfall in the vicinity of Dolores,



Eastern Samar while maintaining its intensity. "RUBY" is the 6th tropical cyclone to made landfall/cross over the country

### **07 December 2014**

- "RUBY" made its 2nd landfall over Cataingan, Masbate and weakened at 140 kph

### **08 December 2014**

- "RUBY" traversed the Sibuyan Sea while moving towards Marinduque. It made its 3rd and 4th landfall in Marinduque in the morning and in Laiya, Batangas in the afternoon, respectively

### **09 December 2014**

- While traversing the rugged terrain of Batangas, TY "RUBY" has weakened into a Tropical Depression (TD) at 60 kph and moved towards Lubang Island

### **10 December 2014**

- TD "RUBY" has maintained its strength while traversing the West Philippine Sea and in the evening, "RUBY" exited the PAR

## **II. EFFECTS**

### **A. AFFECTED POPULATION (Tab A)**



1. A total of **992,729 families / 4,363,677 persons** were affected in Regions III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, CARAGA, and NCR.

2. Of which, about **709,109 families / 3,112,148 persons** were served inside and outside evacuation centers (ECs).



Inside **12,794 ECs**:

**643,224 families / 2,812,558 persons**

Outside ECs:

**65,885 families / 299,590 persons**

### **B. CASUALTIES (Tab B)**

1. **Twenty-four (24) deaths** were reported in Regions IV-A, IV-B, VII, and VIII.
2. A total of **1,913 injured persons** were reported in Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, and VIII.

### **C. STATUS OF LIFELINES**

#### **Power (Tab C)**

1. A total of **195 areas** (municipality, city, and province) have experienced power interruptions / outages in Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, and VIII.

#### **Roads and Bridges (Tab D)**

1. A total of **34 road sections** and **11 bridges** were not passable due to flooding, landslide, and debris (toppled trees and electric posts) in Regions II, IV-A, IV-B, V, and VIII.



#### D. CLASS SUSPENSION (Tab E)

1. A total of **19 provinces and 66 cities/municipalities** have suspended their classes due to the effects of the typhoon.
2. On 04 December 2014, work in both government and private offices were suspended in Metro Manila.

#### E. DAMAGED HOUSES (Tab F)

1. A total of **292,067 damaged houses** were reported in Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CARAGA, in which **42,634 were totally damaged** and **249,433 were partially damaged**.



#### F. COST OF DAMAGES (Tab G)

1. A total of **₱5,656,669,006.00** worth of damages in infrastructure and agriculture was reported in Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, and VIII:

**Infrastructure : ₱2,048,474,523.00**

**Agriculture: ₱3,608,194,483.00**
