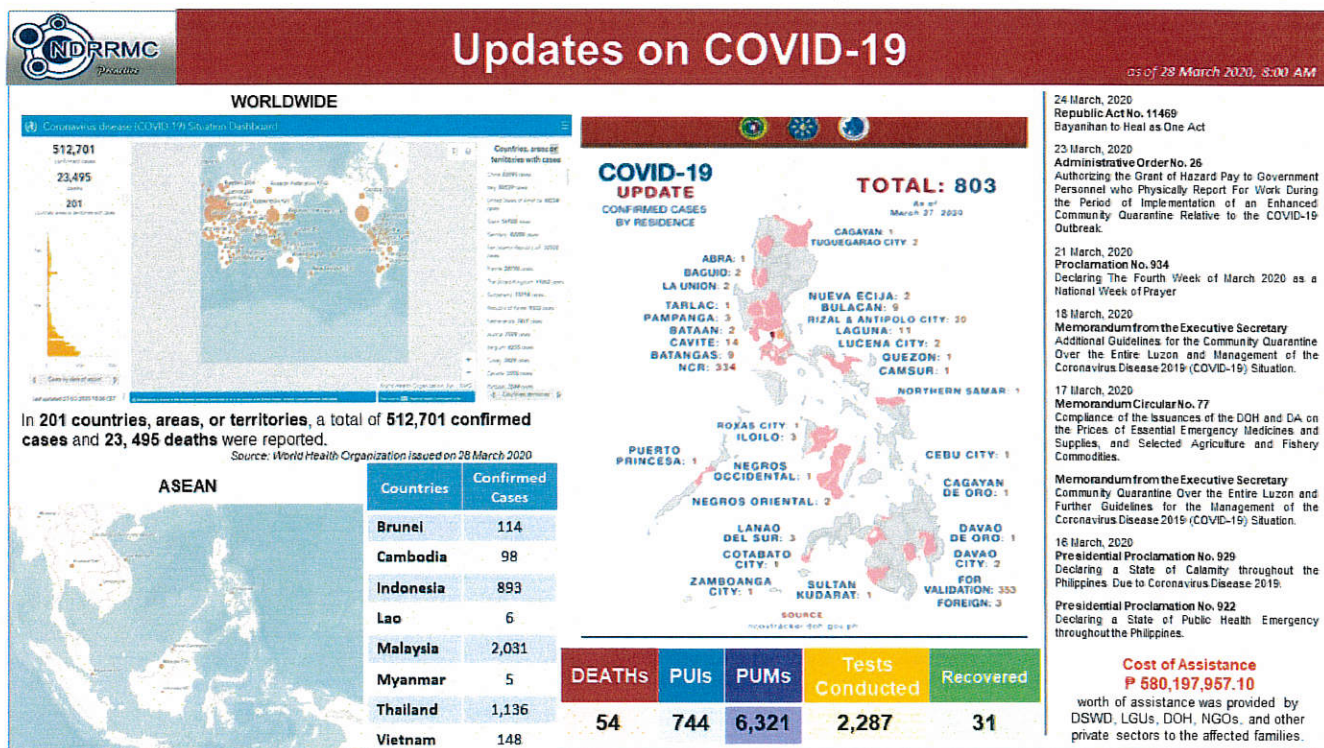

As of **29 March 2020**, a total of **1,075 confirmed COVID-19 cases** were monitored/reported. Of which, **68** persons were declared dead while **35** persons have already recovered. Meanwhile, **744** persons are considered Persons Under Investigations (PUIs).

I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) is a new strain of coronavirus that has not been previously identified in humans. The 2019-nCoV has caused severe pneumonia in several cases in China and has been exported to a range of countries and cities.

On 31 December 2019, a clustering of pneumonia cases of unknown etiology was reported in Wuhan, China. The outbreak was later determined to be caused by a novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV), a new coronavirus strain that has not been previously identified in humans.

Common signs of coronavirus infection include flu-like and respiratory symptoms, fever, cough, shortness of breath, and breathing difficulties. In severe cases, it can cause pneumonia, acute respiratory syndrome, kidney failure, and even death. *Source: DOH*

On 11 February 2020, the International Committee on Taxonomy of Viruses (ICTV) announced “severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2)” as the name of the new virus. This name was chosen because the virus is genetically related to the coronavirus responsible for the SARS outbreak of 2003. While related, the two viruses are different. Hence, the World Health Organization (WHO) announced “COVID-19” as the name of this new disease following guidelines previously developed with the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO).

The first case in the Philippines was confirmed and reported by DOH on 30 January 2020. Following this, the national government issued directives and resolutions:

II. EFFECTS

A. Suspension of Work

Suspension of Work

- Per Memorandum from the Executive Secretary, starting 17 March 2020, a work from home arrangement will be implemented in the Executive Branch, except PNP, AFP, PCG, and health and emergency frontline services, border control and other critical services, which shall ensure a skeletal work force.
- Work in all government offices were declared suspended on 14 March 2020 except for frontline services.

B. Suspension of Domestic and International Travel

On 17 March 2020, all mass transport system was suspended until 12 April 2020 due to the Luzon-wide “enhanced community quarantine” to control the COVID-19 outbreak.
