






P-D-I-T-R STRATEGY

With reference to the National Action Plan (NAP) for COVID-19, the National Task Force is intensifying efforts to PREVENT the spread of the COVID-19, TEST individuals and communities, ISOLATE those that are identified to be confirmed cases, TREAT and provide with appropriate health care, and REINTEGRATE them back to the community.

PREVENT

PREVENT enables to change mindsets and behaviors to advocate for a shared responsibility in ensuring compliance to minimum public health standards and protocols and address stigma and division in the communities, workplaces, schools. To implement the PREVENT strategy, community quarantine declarations are made in various localities, enforcing stricter regulations and disease preventive measures particular for areas with high cases. Status of community quarantine declarations is summarized as follows:



DETECT

DETECT entails active screening of those presenting with signs and symptoms of COVID-19 in the community as well as other disease surveillance activities. For this purpose, contact tracing teams have been organized and provided with appropriate training. Summary is as follows:





ISOLATE

Isolate involves implementation of measures to separate those identified as exposed and confirmed cases and provide medical interventions to further prevent the spread of the disease. This strategy involves setting up of Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMFs). The summary of TTMFs established is as follows:



For the TREAT strategy, One Hospital Command has been established to facilitate centralized referral system. Further, wards, isolation and intensive care units are in operation to provide treatment services for COVID-19 positives. NARRATIVE REPORT 4 May 2021

ACTIONS TAKEN: Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (MROF)

The Task Group on Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (TG-MROF) was created by the National Incident Command-Naţional Task Force COVID 19 to solely cater to the medical and social needs of Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs). The TG-MROF in coordination with various government agencies, private entities, and other task groups created toresponsewith the prevailing crisis, regional task units, and local government agencies that are task to facilitate the safe return of the ROFs back to their home provinces.

Members: DND, DOTr, DOLE, DILG, DFA, DOT, DSWD, DOH, OCD, OWWA, BOQ, CAAP, MARINA, PCG, PNP and AFP

ARRIVALS: As of 2 May 2021, a total of <u>1,070,788</u> **Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs)** arrived at the NAIA Terminals 1, 2, and 3, Clark International Airport, Mactan-Cebu International Airport, South Harbor, Subic, Bataan, and Zamboanga Port. Of which, <u>506,201</u> are **land-based** OFWs, <u>364,910</u> are **sea-based** OFWs and <u>196,322</u> are **Non-OFWs**.

A total of <u>3,355</u> deceased ROFs had arrived in the country from 01July 2020 – 3 May 2021. Of which, 454 died due to COVID-19.

TESTING: From May 9, 2020 to 31 January 2021, a total of **810,134** ROFs weretestedthru RT-PCR.

6TH DAY OF SWABBING: As of 2 May 2021, a total of <u>212,526</u> Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) were tested thru RT-PCR on the 6th day of their quarantine period. Of which, <u>141,221</u> were tested by PCG, <u>22,073</u> were tested by BOQ, <u>17,557</u> were tested by Detoxicare, <u>20,327</u> were tested by PADL, and <u>11,348</u> were tested by PrimeCare.

QUARANTINE: As of 3 May 2021, a total of <u>16,928</u> ROFs were confirmed positive with COVID-19. Of which, <u>372</u> are admitted at <u>13</u> quarantine facilities, <u>16,541</u> were able to recover and <u>15</u> died.

As of 31 December 2020, a total of $\underline{243}$ Non-OFWs under quarantine in $\underline{2}$ Accommodation Establishments (AEs) in Batangas.

DEPARTURES: As of 2 May 2021, TG-MROF was able to assist <u>597,987</u> ROFs back to their home provinces. Of which, <u>230,510</u> were assisted by land, <u>276,378</u> by air, and <u>91,099</u> by sea.

ASSISTANCE: As of 25 April 2021, a total of <u>833,221</u> OFWs were assisted thru OWWA. Of which, <u>269,495</u> were assisted through the "Hatid-sundo" Program, <u>537,136</u> through the "OFW Kalinga" Program, <u>7,123</u> were assisted through the "Tulong Marino" Program and <u>19,467</u> assistances to stranded OFWs in the region.

RETURNING FILIPINOS (REFs) from SABAH: As of 17 April 2021, a total of <u>2,953</u> REFs from Sabah arrived in the country and were assisted to go back in their home provinces.

TRAVEL BANNED COUNTRIES: As of 29 April 2021, Philippines bans entry by foreign nationals from <u>36 countries</u> due to concerns over COVID-19 variant.
