



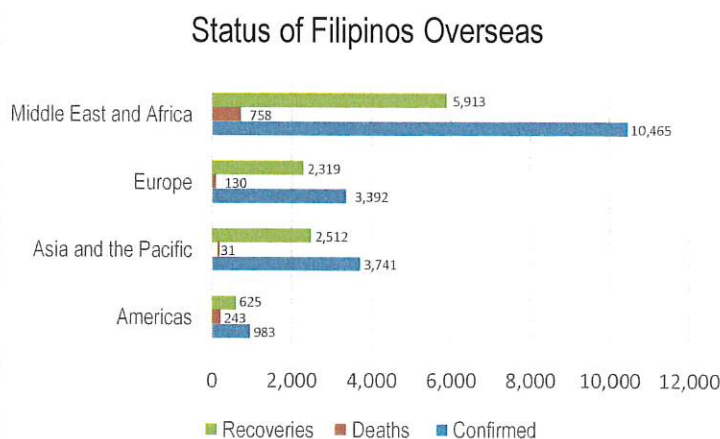

GLOBAL SITUATION



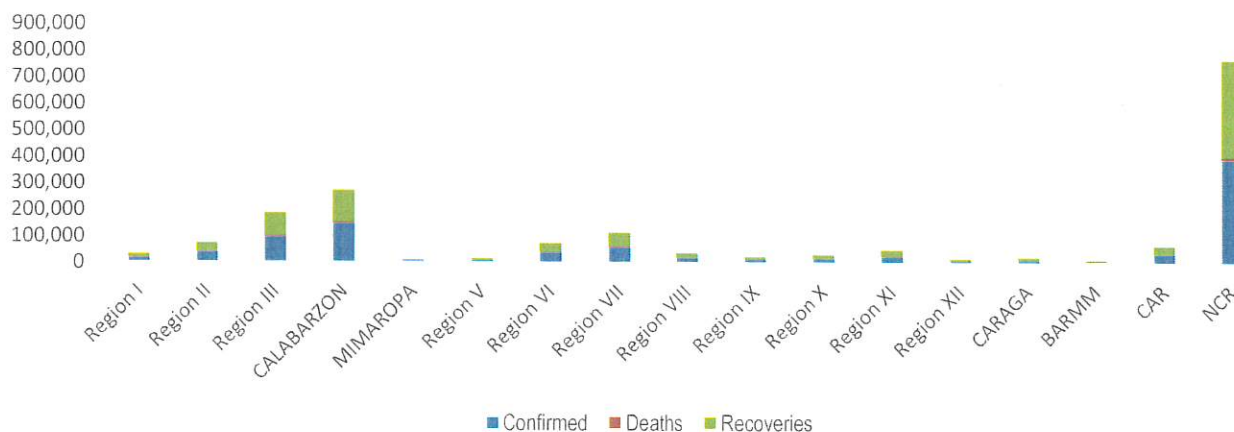

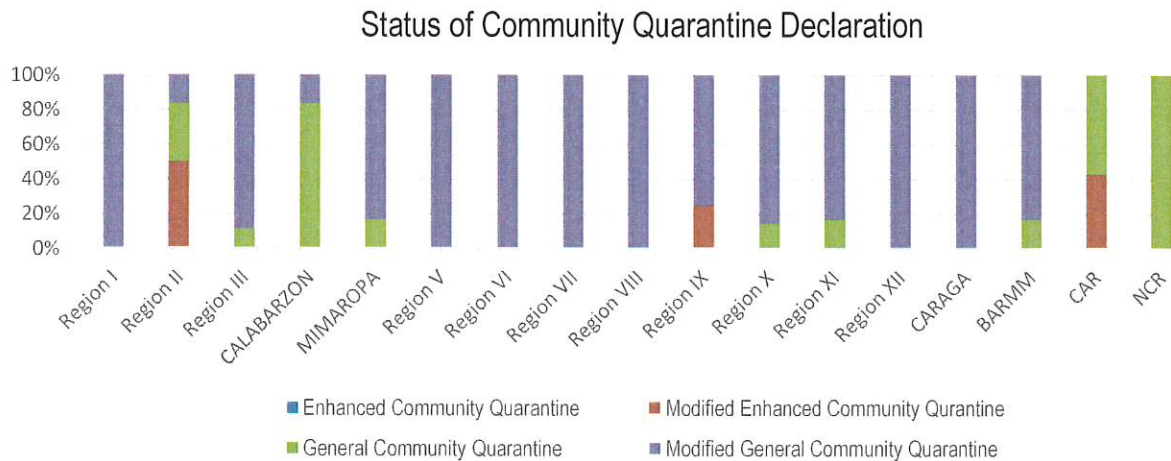


P-D-I-T-R STRATEGY

With reference to the National Action Plan (NAP) for COVID-19, the National Task Force is intensifying efforts to PREVENT the spread of the COVID-19, TEST individuals and communities, ISOLATE those that are identified to be confirmed cases, TREAT and provide with appropriate health care, and REINTEGRATE them back to the community.

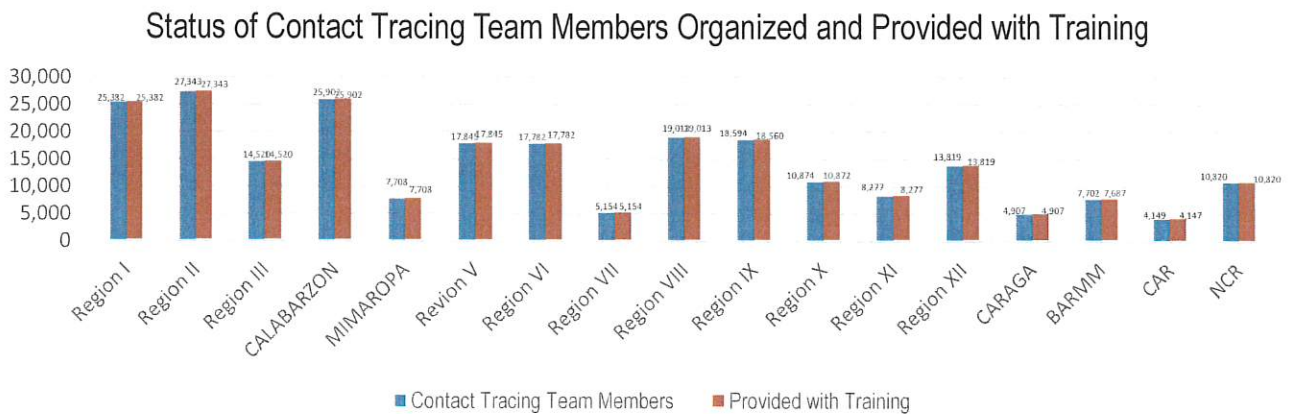
PREVENT

PREVENT enables to change mindsets and behaviors to advocate for a shared responsibility in ensuring compliance to minimum public health standards and protocols and address stigma and division in the communities, workplaces, schools. To implement the PREVENT strategy, community quarantine declarations are made in various localities, enforcing stricter regulations and disease preventive measures particular for areas with high cases. Status of community quarantine declarations is summarized as follows:



DETECT

DETECT entails active screening of those presenting with signs and symptoms of COVID-19 in the community as well as other disease surveillance activities. For this purpose, contact tracing teams have been organized and provided with appropriate training. Summary is as follows:

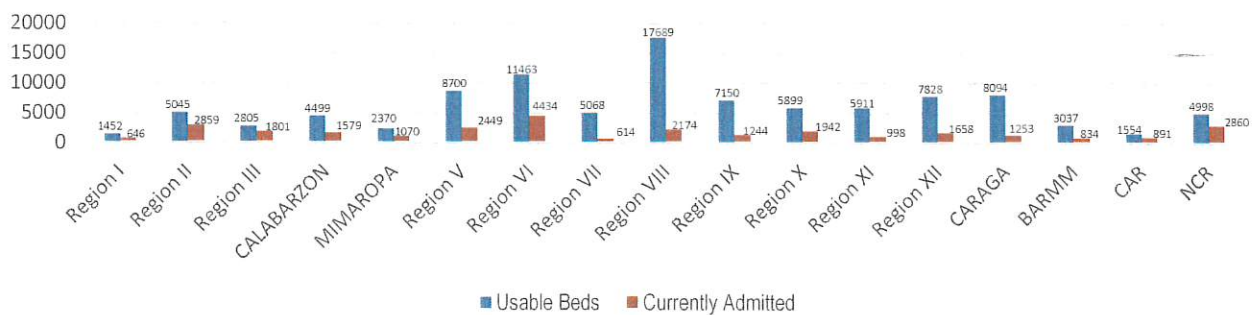

ISOLATE

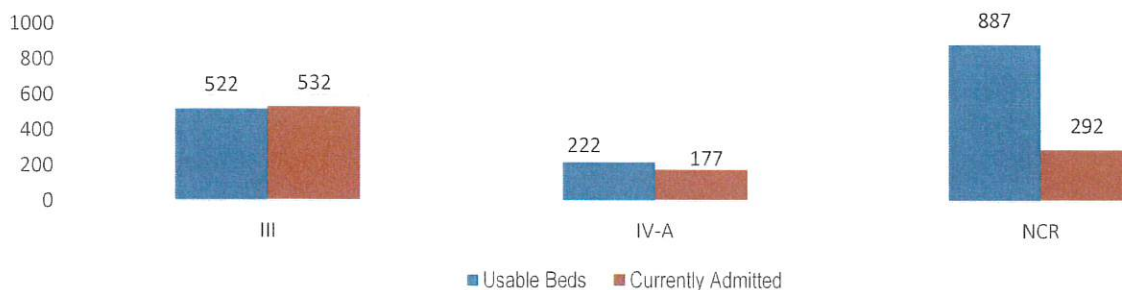

Status of Beds for Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMFs)



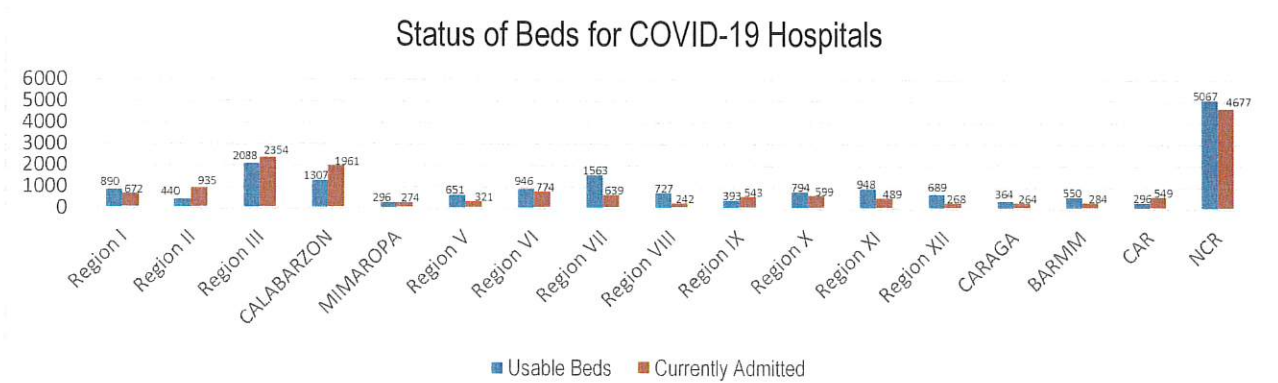

For the TREAT strategy, One Hospital Command has been established to facilitate a centralized referral system. **NARRATIVE REPORT
14 May 2021**

ACTIONS TAKEN: Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (MROF)

The Task Group on Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (TG-MROF) was created by the National Incident Command-National Task Force COVID 19 to solely cater to the medical and social needs of Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs). The TG-MROF in coordination with various government agencies, private entities, and other task groups created to respond with the prevailing crisis, regional task units, and local government agencies that are task to facilitate the safe return of the ROFs back to their home provinces.

Members: DND, DOTr, DOLE, DILG, DFA, DOT, DSWD, DOH, OCD, OWWA, BOQ, CAAP, MARINA, PCG, PNP and AFP

ARRIVALS: As of 12 May 2021, a total of 1,093,420 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) arrived at the NAIA Terminals 1, 2, and 3, Clark International Airport, Mactan-Cebu International Airport, South Harbor, Subic, Bataan, and Zamboanga Port. Of which, 520,289 are land-based OFWs, 373,153 are sea-based OFWs and 202,534 are Non-OFWs.

A total of 3,444 deceased ROFs had arrived in the country from 01 July 2020 – 13 May 2021. Of which, 471 died due to COVID-19.

TESTING: From May 9, 2020 to 31 January 2021, a total of 810,134 ROFs were tested thru RT-PCR.

6TH DAY OF SWABBING: As of 12 May 2021, a total of 232,144 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) were tested thru RT-PCR on the 6th day of their quarantine period. Of which, 153,193 were tested by PCG, 25,082 were tested by BOQ, 19,794 were tested by Detoxicare, 22,727 were tested by PADL, and 11,348 were tested by PrimeCare.

QUARANTINE: As of 12 May 2021, a total of 17,317 ROFs were confirmed positive with COVID-19. Of which, 277 are admitted at 15 quarantine facilities, 17,025 were able to recover and 15 died.

DEPARTURES: As of 11 May 2021, TG-MROF was able to assist 616,657 ROFs back to their home provinces. Of which, 234,504 were assisted by land, 287,912 by air, and 94,241 by sea.

ASSISTANCE: As of 25 April 2021, a total of 833,221 OFWs were assisted thru OWWA. Of which, 269,495 were assisted through the "Hatid-sundo" Program, 537,136 through the "OFW Kalinga" Program, 7,123 were assisted through the "Tulong Marino" Program and 19,467 assistances to stranded OFWs in the region.

RETURNING FILIPINOS (REFs) from SABAH: As of 17 April 2021, a total of 2,953 REFs from Sabah arrived in the country and were assisted to go back in their home provinces.

TRAVEL BANNED COUNTRIES: As of 07 May 2021, Travelers from 5 countries are prohibited to enter the Philippines until 14 May, 2021. A total of 40 countries were issued a travel restrictions by the Philippines since 26 December 2020.
