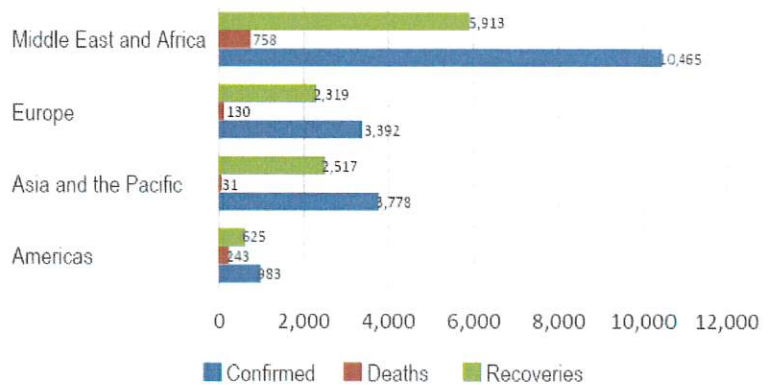

Status of Filipinos Overseas

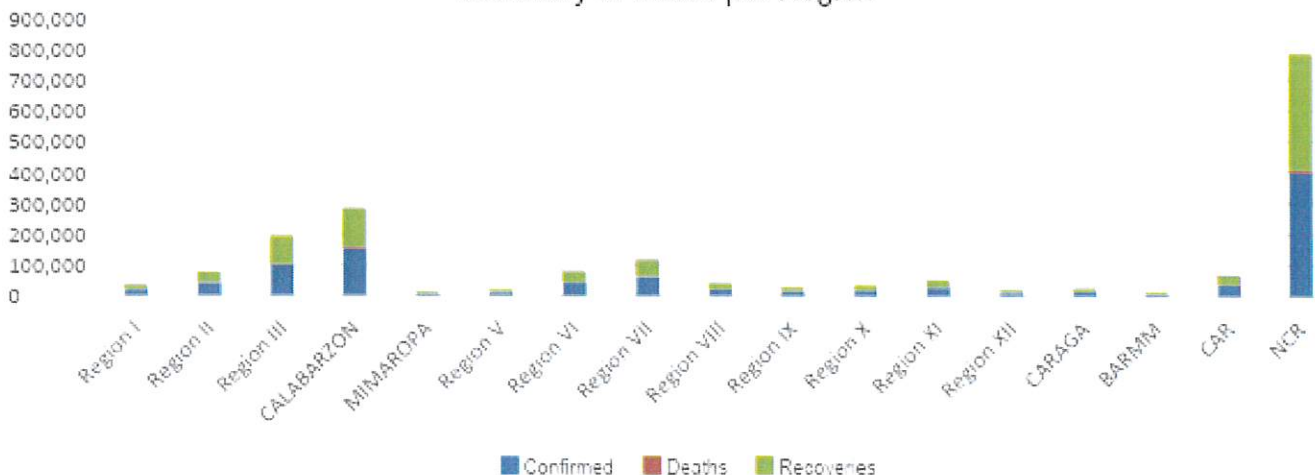

Summary of Cases per Region

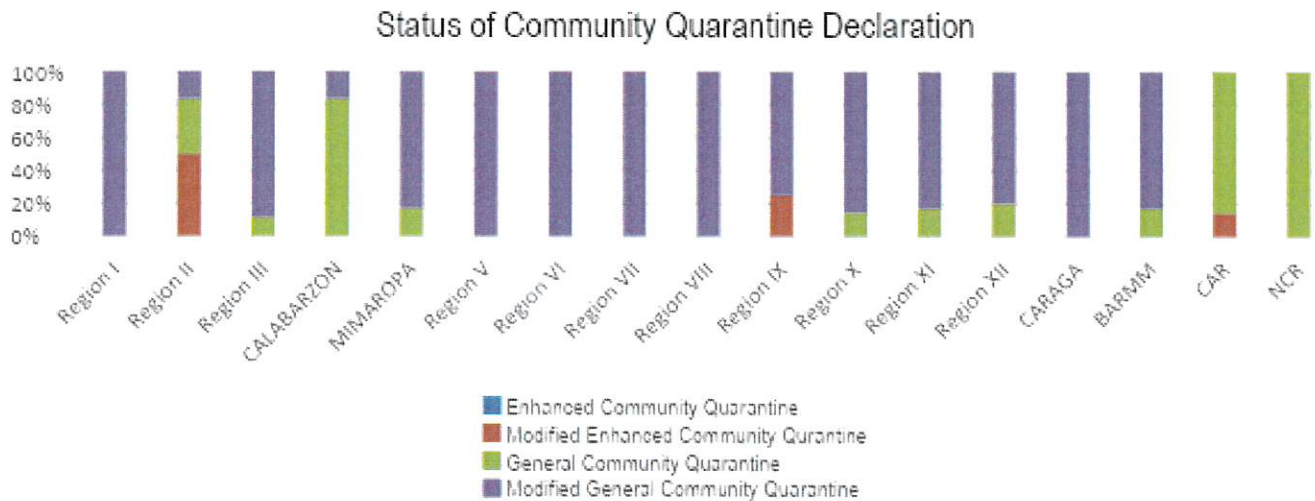


# P-D-I-T-R STRATEGY

With reference to the National Action Plan (NAP) for COVID-19, the National Task Force is intensifying efforts to PREVENT the spread of the COVID-19, TEST individuals and communities, ISOLATE those that are identified to be confirmed cases, TREAT and provide with appropriate health care, and REINTEGRATE them back to the community.

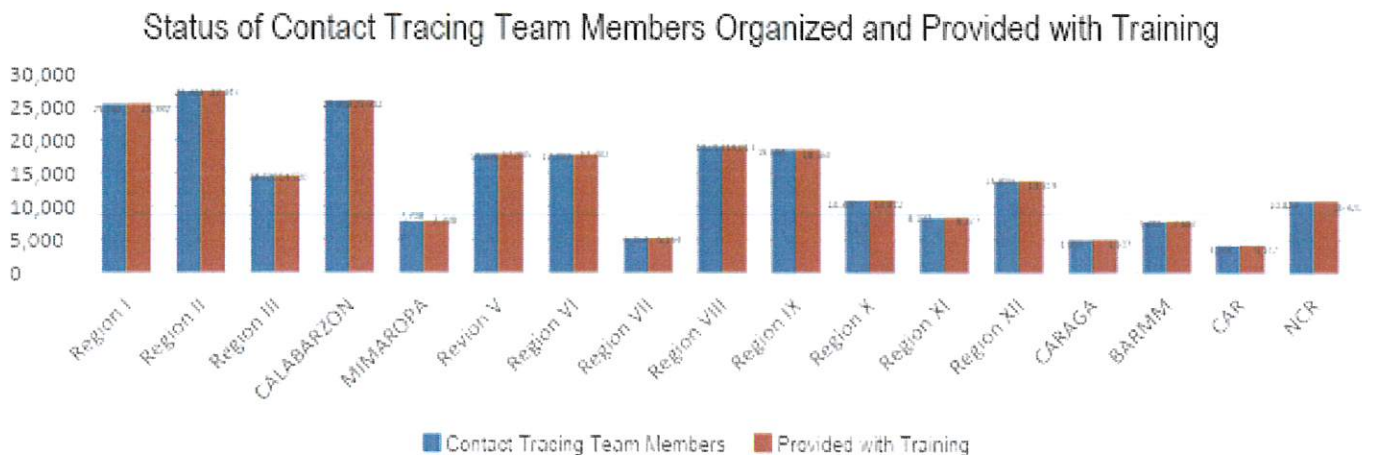
## PREVENT

PREVENT enables to change mindsets and behaviors to advocate for a shared responsibility in ensuring compliance to minimum public health standards and protocols and address stigma and division in the communities, workplaces, schools. To implement the PREVENT strategy, community quarantine declarations are made in various localities, enforcing stricter regulations and disease preventive measures particular for areas with high cases. Status of community quarantine declarations is summarized as follows:



## DETECT

DETECT entails active screening of those presenting with signs and symptoms of COVID-19 in the community as well as other disease surveillance activities. For this purpose, contact tracing teams have been organized and provided with appropriate training. Summary is as follows:

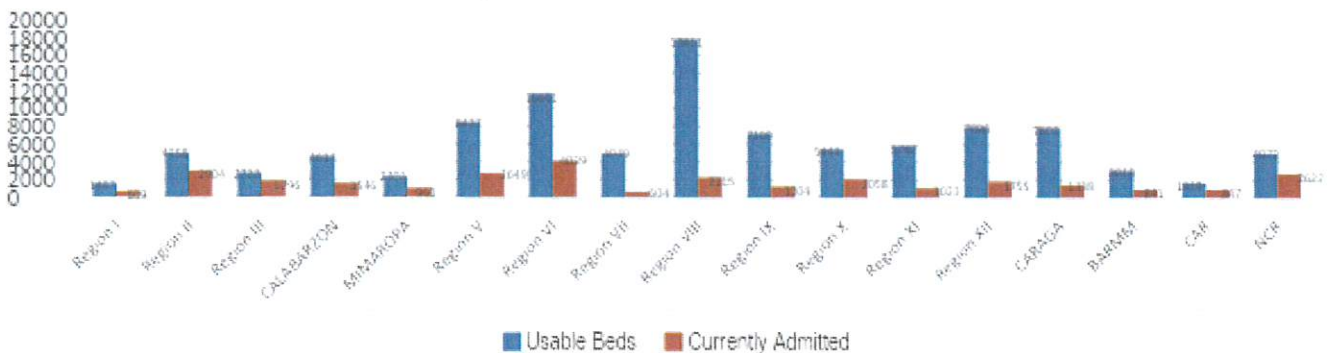

## ISOLATE

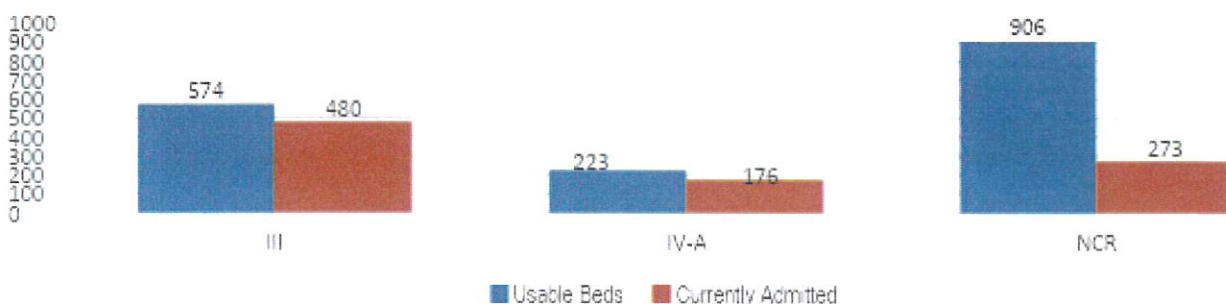
Isolate involves implementation of measures to separate those identified as exposed and confirmed cases and provide medical interventions to further prevent the spread of the disease. Status of Beds for Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMFs)



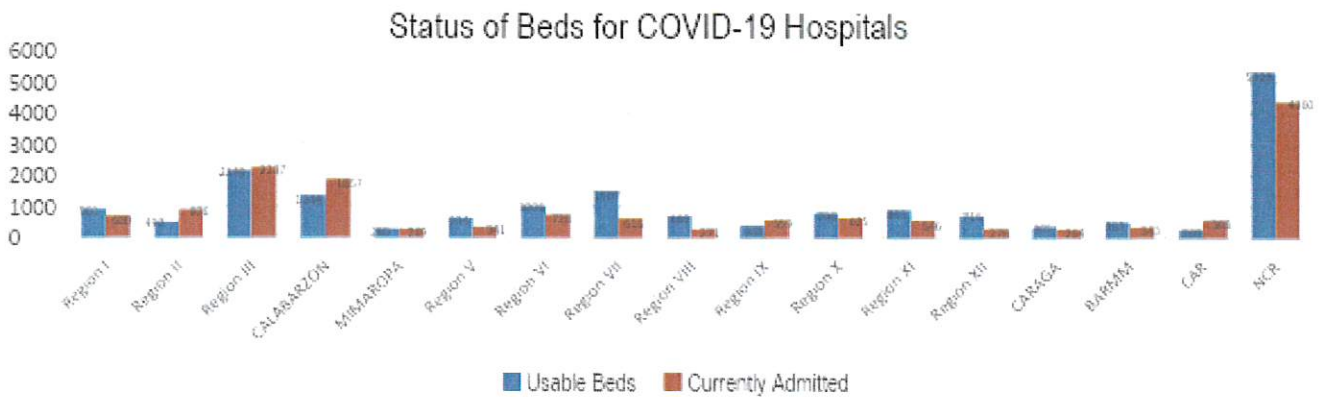

For the TREAT strategy, One Hospital Command has been established to facilitate a centralized referral system. Further, wards, isolation and intensive care units are in operation to provide treatment services for COVID-19 positives. 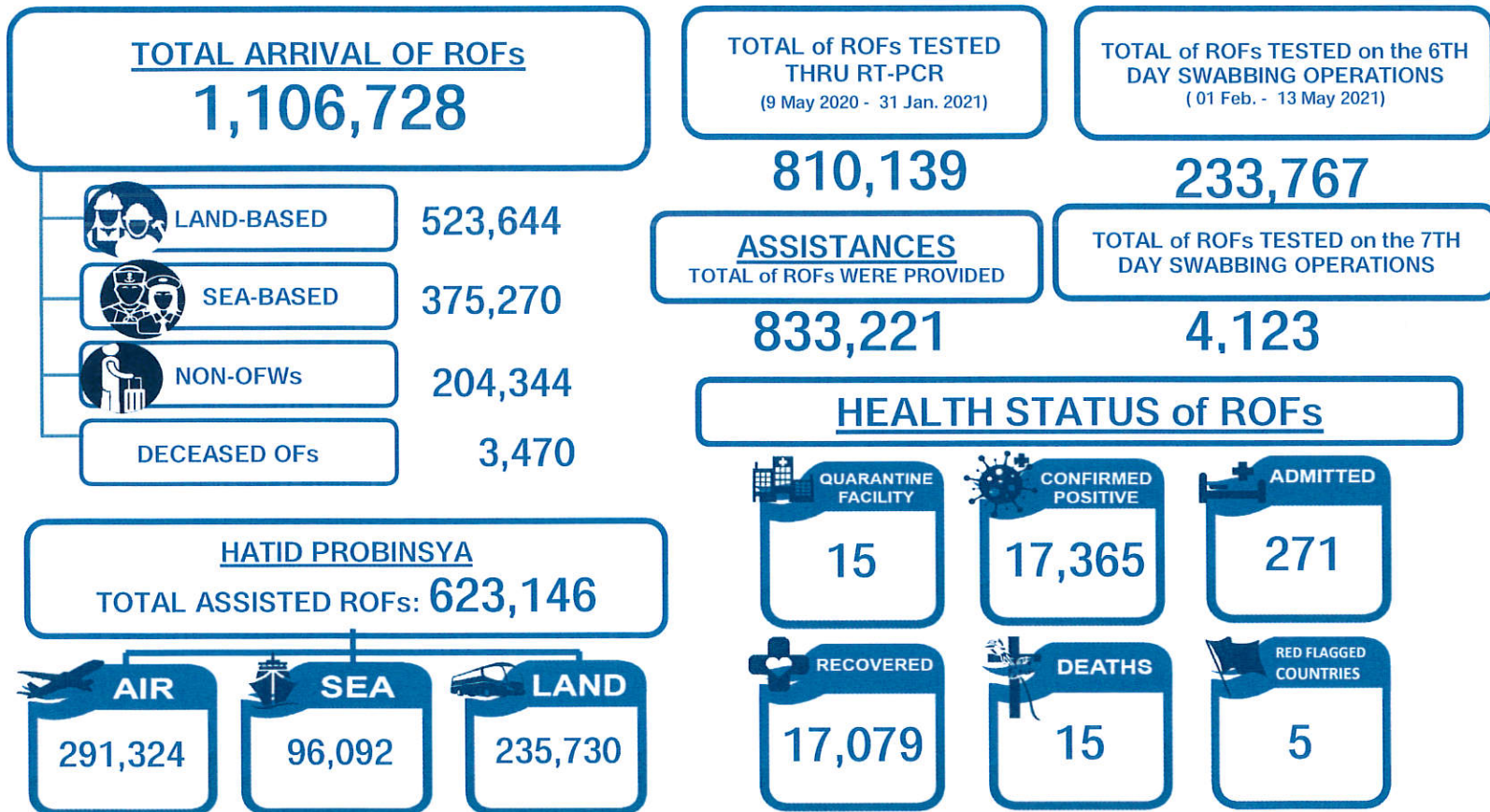

**Task Group on Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos**

**NARRATIVE REPORT**

17 May 2021

ACTIONS TAKEN: Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (MROF)

The Task Group on Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (TG-MROF) was created by the National Incident Command-National Task Force COVID 19 to solely cater to the medical and social needs of Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs). The TG-MROF in coordination with various government agencies, private entities, and other task groups created to respond with the prevailing crisis, regional task units, and local government agencies that are task to facilitate the safe return of the ROFs back to their home provinces.

**Members:** DND, DOTr, DOLE, DILG, DFA, DOT, DSWD, DOH, OCD, OWWA, BOQ, CAAP, MARINA, PCG, PNP and AFP

**ARRIVALS:** As of 15 May 2021, a total of 1,106,728 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) arrived at the NAIA Terminals 1, 2, and 3, Clark International Airport, Mactan-Cebu International Airport, South Harbor, Subic, Bataan, and Zamboanga Port. Of which, 523,644 are land-based OFWs, 375,270 are sea-based OFWs and 204,344 are Non-OFWs.

A total of 3,470 deceased ROFs had arrived in the country from 01 July 2020 – 16 May 2021. Of which, 473 died due to COVID-19.

**TESTING:** From May 9, 2020 to 31 January 2021, a total of 810,134 ROFs were tested thru RT-PCR.

**6<sup>TH</sup> DAY OF SWABBING:** From 01 February to 13 May 2021, a total of 233,767 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) were tested thru RT-PCR, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of their quarantine period.

**7<sup>TH</sup> DAY OF SWABBING:** As of 15 May 2021, a total of 4,123 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) were tested thru RT-PCR on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of their quarantine period. Of which, 2,840 were tested by PCG, 600 were tested by BOQ Clark, 221 were tested by Detoxicare and 462 were tested by PADL.

**QUARANTINE:** As of 16 May 2021, a total of 17,365 ROFs were confirmed positive with COVID-19. Of which, 271 are admitted at 15 quarantine facilities, 17,079 were able to recover and 15 died.

**DEPARTURES:** As of 15 May 2021, TG-MROF was able to assist 623,146 ROFs back to their home provinces. Of which, 235,730 were assisted by land, 291,324 by air, and 96,092 by sea.

**ASSISTANCE:** As of 25 April 2021, a total of 833,221 OFWs were assisted thru OWWA. Of which, 269,495 were assisted through the "Hatid-sundo" Program, 537,136 through the "OFW Kalinga" Program, 7,123 were assisted through the "Tulong Marino" Program and 19,467 assistances to stranded OFWs in the region.

**RETURNING FILIPINOS (REFs) from SABAH:** As of 17 April 2021, a total of 2,953 REFs from Sabah arrived in the country and were assisted to go back in their home provinces.

**TRAVEL BANNED COUNTRIES:** As of 14 May 2021, Travelers from 7 countries are prohibited to enter the Philippines until 31 May, 2021. A total of 42 countries were issued a travel restrictions by the Philippines since 26 December 2020.

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
