

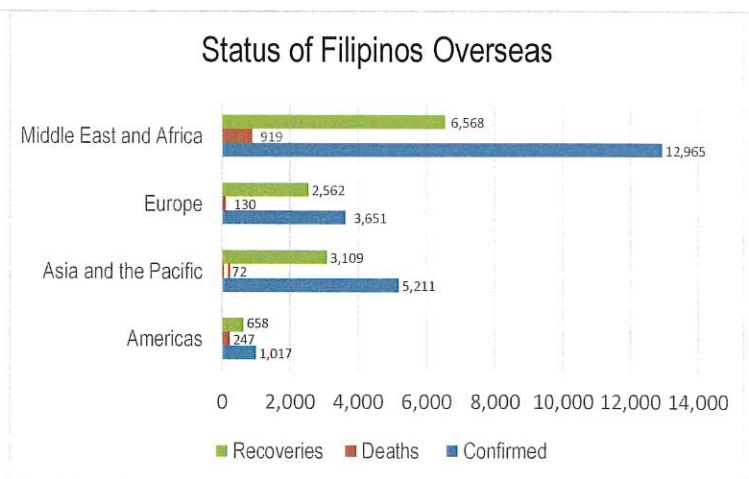

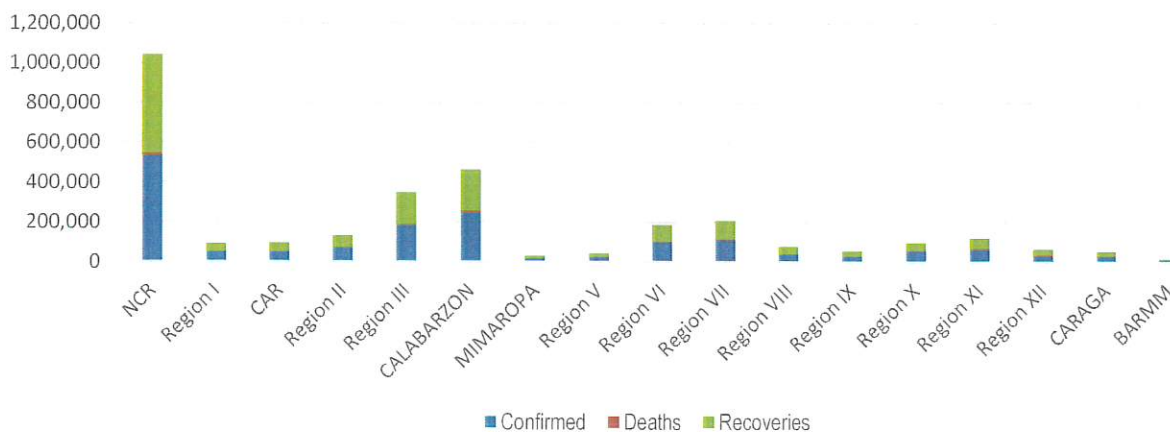

Summary of Cases per Region

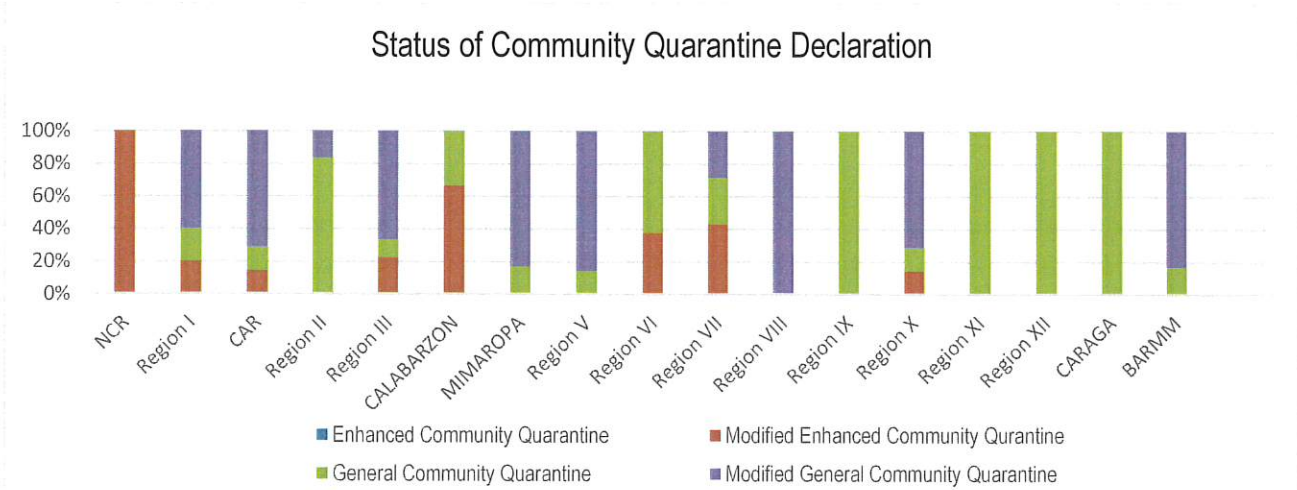


# P-D-I-T-R STRATEGY

With reference to the National Action Plan (NAP) for COVID-19, the National Task Force is intensifying efforts to PREVENT the spread of the COVID-19, TEST individuals, and communities, ISOLATE those that are identified to be confirmed cases, TREAT and provide with appropriate health care, and REINTEGRATE them back to the community.

## PREVENT

PREVENT enables to change mindsets and behaviors to advocate for shared responsibility in ensuring compliance to minimum public health standards and protocols and address stigma and division in the communities, workplaces, schools. To implement the PREVENT strategy, community quarantine declarations are made in various localities, enforcing stricter regulations and disease preventive measures particular for areas with high cases. The status of community quarantine declarations is summarized as follows:



## DETECT

DETECT entails active screening of those presenting with signs and symptoms of COVID-19 in the community as well as other disease surveillance activities. For this purpose, contact tracing teams have been organized and provided with appropriate training. Summary is as follows:

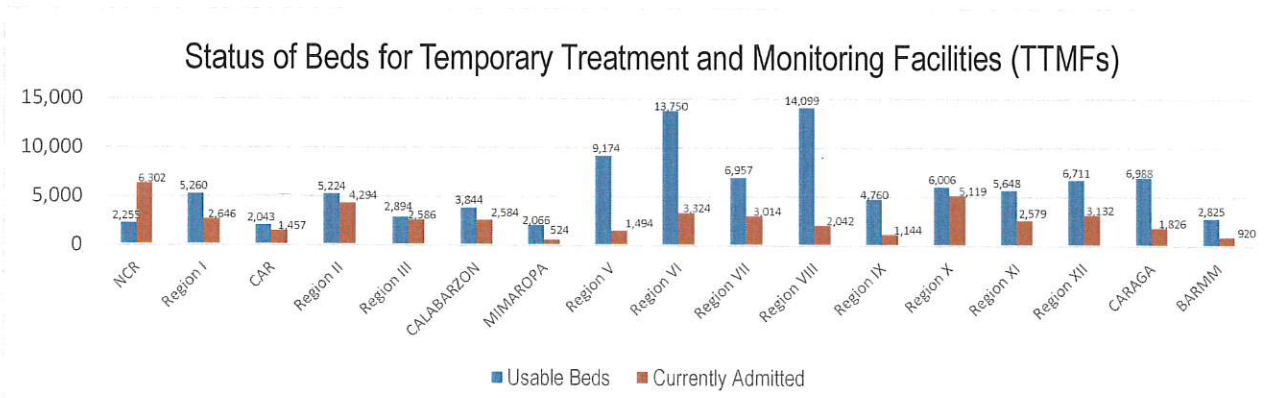

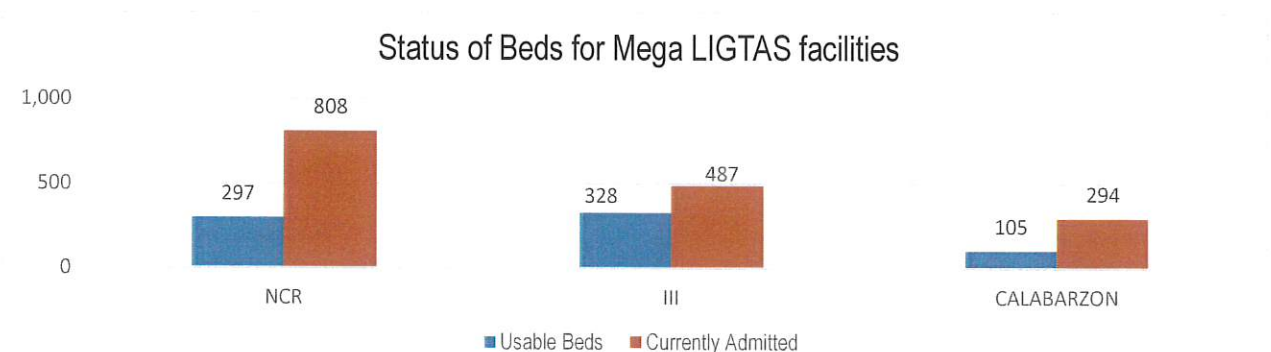
## ISOLATE

Isolate involves implementation of measures to separate those identified as exposed and confirmed cases and provide medical interventions to further prevent the spread of the disease. 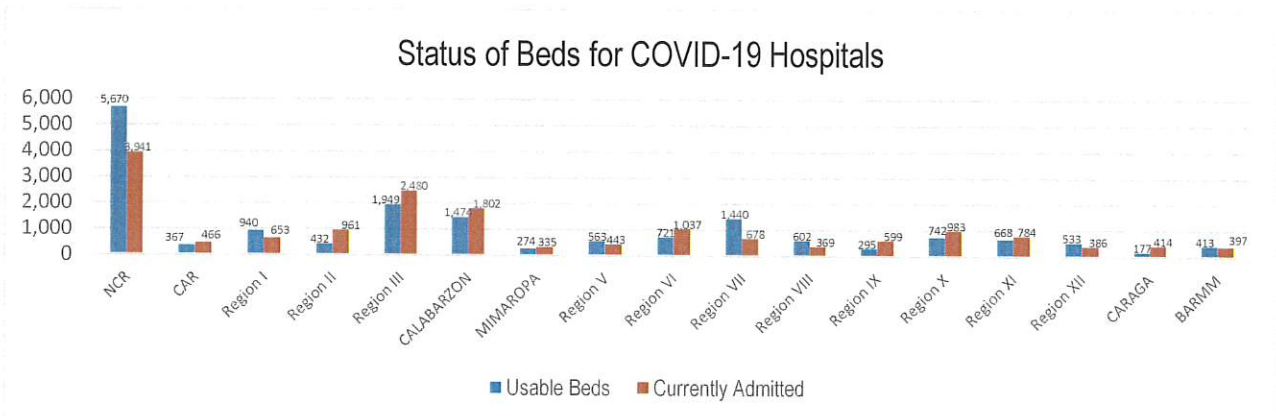

# TREAT

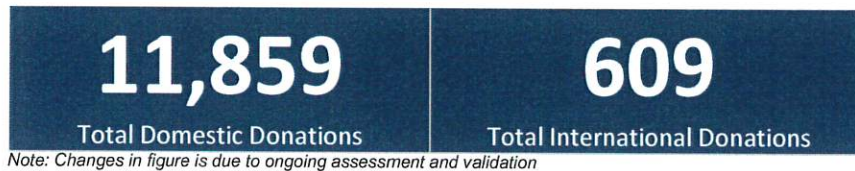

Further, wards, isolation, and intensive care units are in operation to provide treatment services for COVID-19 positives. 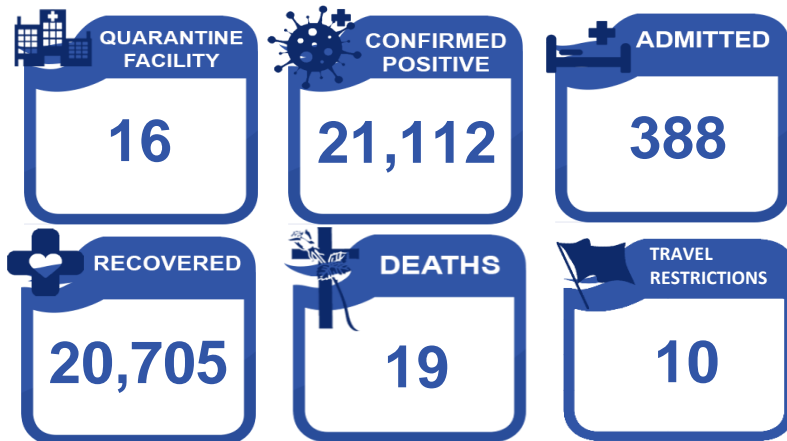

**NARRATIVE REPORT**  
**26 August 2021**

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**ACTIONS TAKEN:** Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (MROF)

The Task Group on Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (TG-MROF) was created by the National Incident Command-National Task Force COVID 19 to solely cater to the medical and social needs of Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs). The TG-MROF in coordination with various government agencies, private entities, and other task groups created to respond with the prevailing crisis, regional task units, and local government agencies that are task to facilitate the safe return of the ROFs back to their home provinces.

**Members:** DND, DOTr, DOLE, DILG, DFA, DOT, DSWD, DOH, OCD, OWWA, BOQ, CAAP, MARINA, PCG, PNP and AFP

**ARRIVALS:** As of 25 August 2021, a total of 1,397,332 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) arrived at the NAIA Terminals 1, 2, and 3, Clark International Airport, Mactan-Cebu International Airport, Laoag International Airport, South Harbor, Subic, Bataan, Zamboanga, and Batangas Port. Of which, a total of 1,114,267 are OFWs (635,091 are land-based and 479,176 are sea-based) and 278,543 are non-OFWs.

A total of 4,522 deceased ROFs had arrived in the country from 07 July 2020 – 26 August 2021. Of which, 616 died due to COVID-19.

**TESTING:** From May 9, 2020 to 31 January 2021, a total of 810,134 ROFs were tested thru RT-PCR.

**6<sup>TH</sup> DAY OF SWABBING OPERATIONS:** From 01 February to 13 May 2021, a total of 233,767 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) were tested thru RT-PCR, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of their quarantine period.

**7<sup>TH</sup> DAY OF SWABBING OPERATIONS:** As of 25 August, a total of 271,383 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) were tested thru RT-PCR on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of their quarantine period. Of which, 158,529 were tested by PCG, 26,331 were tested by BOQ Clark, 30,284 were tested by Detoxicare, 26,134 were tested by PADL, 24,334 were tested by DOH-RESU 7, 266 were tested by M. Mariano Memorial Hospital, 1,932 were tested by Southern Philippine Medical Center, and 3,573 were tested by BOQ Subic.

**QUARANTINE:** As of 26 August 2021, a total of 21,112 ROFs were confirmed positive with COVID-19. Of which, 388 are admitted at 16 quarantine facilities, 20,705 were able to recover and 19 died.

**OSS-MROF BALIK PROBINSYA AND UWIAN NA PROGRAM:** As of 25 August 2021, a total of 743,273 ROFs were assisted back to their home provinces. Of which, 286,335 were assisted by land, 360,846 by air, and 96,092 by sea.

**OWWA COVID-19 RELATED ASSISTANCE TO OFWs:** From March 2020 to 21 July, 2021, a total of 624,648 OFWs were assisted by OWWA on their "Returned to Home Regions" program and 640,133 OFWs are also assisted through "OFW Kalinga" program.

**RETURNING FILIPINOS (REFs) from SABAH:** As of 22 May 2021, a total of 3,289 REFs from Sabah had arrived in the country. While as of 21 June 2021, a total of 4,683 remaining Filipinos are still in Sabah for transfer.

**TRAVEL BANNED COUNTRIES:** As of 12 August 2021, Travelers from 10 countries namely India, Pakistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, United Arab Emirates, Oman, Indonesia, Thailand, and Malaysia are prohibited to enter the Philippines until 31 August 2021.

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
