



P-D-I-T-R STRATEGY

With reference to the National Action Plan (NAP) for COVID-19, the National Task Force is intensifying efforts to PREVENT the spread of the COVID-19, TEST individuals, and communities, ISOLATE those that are identified to be confirmed cases, TREAT and provide with appropriate health care, and REINTEGRATE them back to the community.

DETECTs

DETECT entails active screening of those presenting with signs and symptoms of COVID-19 in the community as well as other disease surveillance activities. For this purpose, contact tracing teams have been organized and provided with appropriate training. Summary is as follows:




ISOLATE

Isolate involves implementation of measures to separate those identified as exposed and confirmed cases and provide medical interventions to further prevent the spread of the disease. 


Status of Beds for Mega LIGTAS facilities

TREAT

For the TREAT strategy, One Hospital Command has been established to facilitate a centralized referral system. Further, wards, isolation, and intensive care units are in operation to provide treatment services for COVID-19 positives. The occupancy rate for all beds dedicated to COVID-19 (Ward, Isolation, Intensive Care) among reporting hospitals is summarized as follows.

NARRATIVE REPORT 15 December 2021

ACTIONS TAKEN: Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (MROF)

The Task Group on Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (TG-MROF) was created by the National Incident Command-National Task Force COVID 19 to solely cater to the medical and social needs of Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs). The TG-MROF in coordination with various government agencies, private entities, and other task groups created to response with the prevailing crisis, regional task units, and local government agencies that are task to facilitate the safe return of the ROFs back to their home provinces.

Members: DND, DOTr, DOLE, DILG, DFA, DOT, DSWD, DOH, OCD, OWWA, BOQ, CAAP, MARINA, PCG, PNP and AFP

ARRIVALS: As of 14 December 2021, a total of <u>1,875,778</u> Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) arrived at the NAIA Terminals 1, 2, and 3, Clark International Airport, Mactan-Cebu International Airport, Laoag International Airport, South Harbor, Subic, Bataan, Zamboanga, and Batangas Port. Of which, a total of <u>1,451,125</u> are OFWs (<u>844,200</u> are land-based and <u>606,925</u> are sea-based) and <u>419,295</u> are non-OFWs.

A total of <u>5,358</u> deceased ROFs had arrived in the country from 07 July 2020 – 14 December 2021. Of which, <u>633</u> died due to COVID-19.

TESTING: From May 9, 2020 to 31 January 2021, a total of 810,134 ROFs were tested thru RT-PCR.

6TH DAY OF SWABBING OPERATIONS: From 01 February to 13 May 2021, a total of <u>233,767</u> Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) were tested thru RT-PCR, on the 6th day of their quarantine period.

7TH DAY OF SWABBING OPERATIONS: As of 23 October, a total of <u>432,951</u> Returning Overseas **Filipinos (ROFs)** were tested thru RT-PCR on the 7th day of their quarantine period. Of which, <u>247,206</u> were tested by PCG, <u>42,376</u> were tested by BOQ Clark, <u>36,528</u> were tested by Detoxicare, <u>41,629</u> were tested by PADL, <u>52,624</u> were tested by DOH-RESU 7, <u>266</u> were tested by M. Mariano Memorial Hospital, <u>3,945</u> were tested by Southern Philippine Medical Center, and <u>8,377</u> were tested by BOQ Subic.

QUARANTINE: As of 14 December, a total of <u>24,482</u> ROFs were confirmed positive with COVID-19. Of which, <u>91</u> are admitted at <u>13</u> quarantine facilities, <u>24,363</u> were able to recover and <u>28</u> died.

OSS-MROF BALIK PROBINSYA AND UWIAN NA PROGRAM: As of 13 December 2021, a total of <u>895,976</u> ROFs were assisted back to their home provinces. Of which, <u>360,727</u> were assisted by land, <u>439,157</u> by air, and <u>96,092</u> by sea.

OWWA COVID-19 RELATED ASSISTANCE TO OFWs: From March 2020 to 10 October, 2021, a total of <u>829,067</u> OFWs were assisted by OWWA on their "Returned to Home Regions" program and <u>801,037</u> OFWs are also assisted through "OFW Kalinga" program.

RETURNING FILIPINOS (REFs) from SABAH: As of 22 May 2021, a total of <u>3,289</u> REFs from Sabah had arrived in the country. While as of 21 June 2021, a total of <u>4,683</u> remaining Filipinos are still in Sabah for transfer.

TRAVEL BANNED COUNTRIES: As of 08 December 2021, the IATF approved the imposition of travel restriction on South Africa, Botswana, Namibia, Zimbabwe, Lesotho, Eswatini, Mozambique, Austria, Czech Republic, Hungary, The Netherlands, Switzerland, Belgium, Italy, France and Portugal by placing it under the Red List while 44 countries were listed under Green List effective from December 10, 2021 until December 15, 2021.
