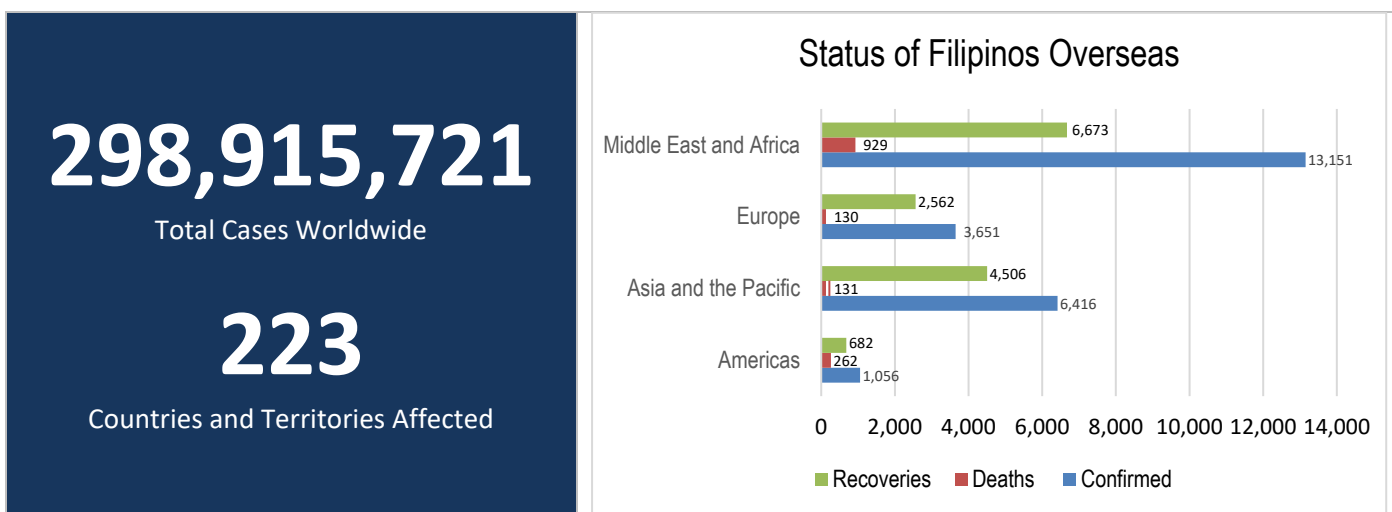

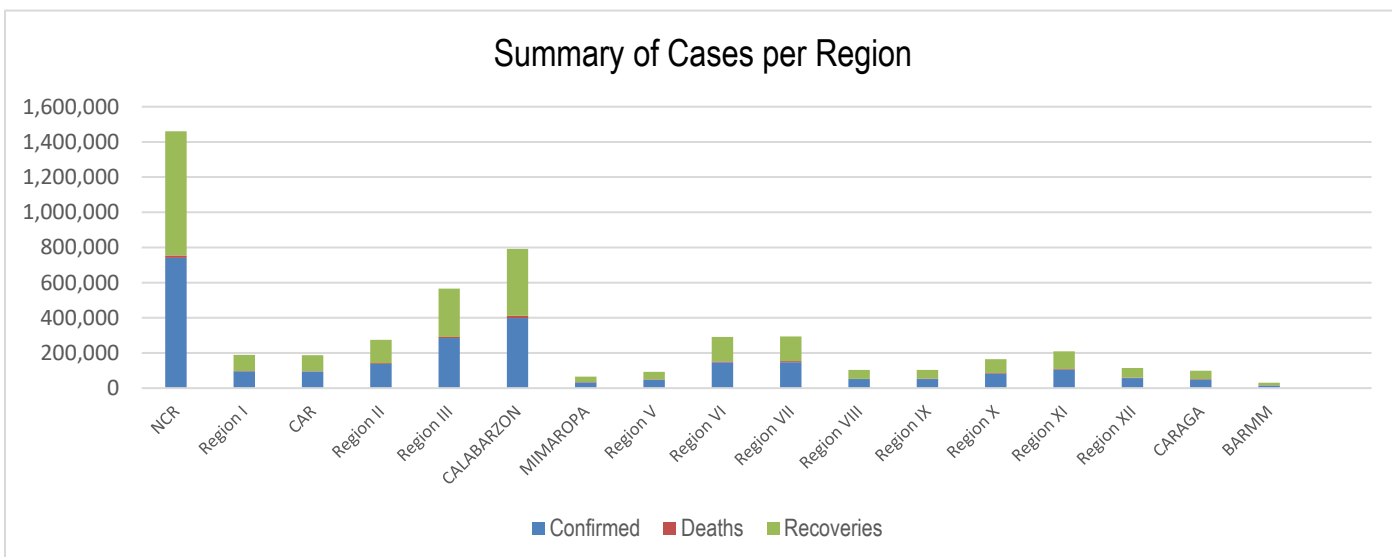

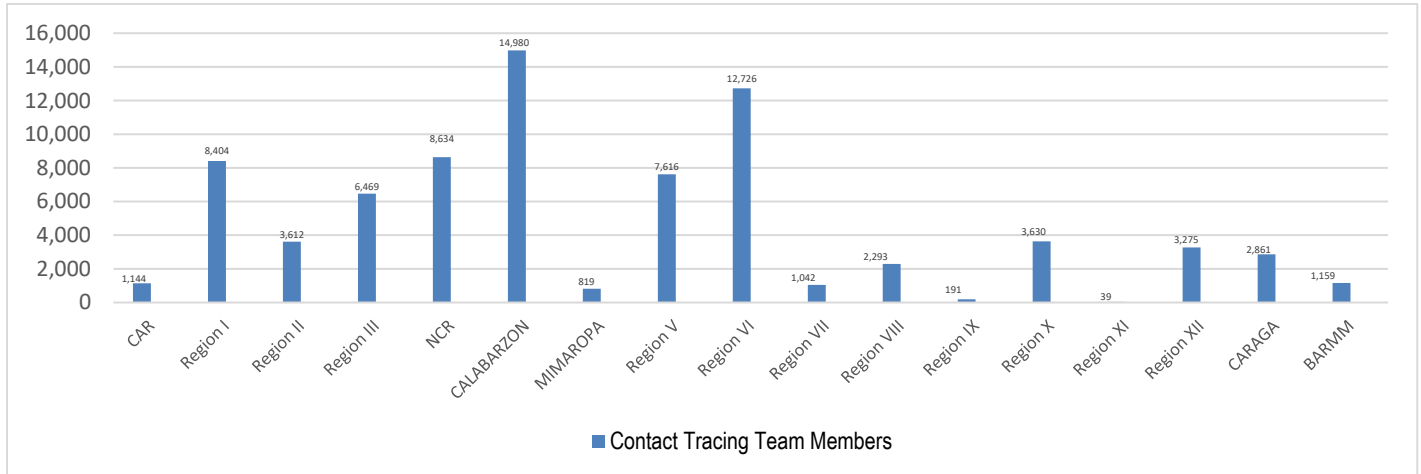


P-D-I-T-R STRATEGY

With reference to the National Action Plan (NAP) for COVID-19, the National Task Force is intensifying efforts to PREVENT the spread of the COVID-19, TEST individuals, and communities, ISOLATE those that are identified to be confirmed cases, TREAT and provide with appropriate health care, and REINTEGRATE them back to the community.

DETECTS

DETECT entails active screening of those presenting with signs and symptoms of COVID-19 in the community as well as other disease surveillance activities. For this purpose, contact tracing teams have been organized and provided with appropriate training. Summary is as follows:

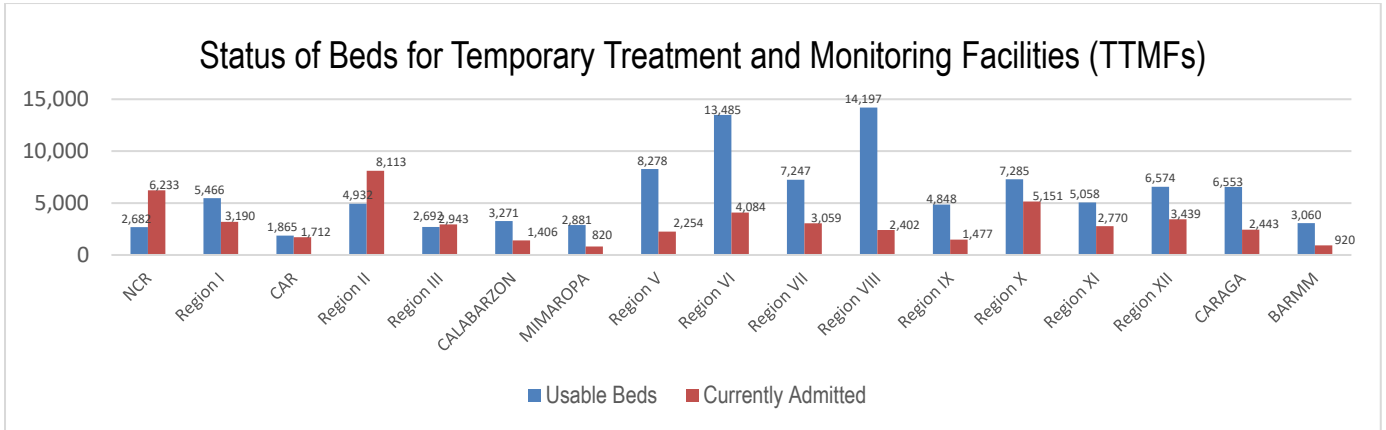

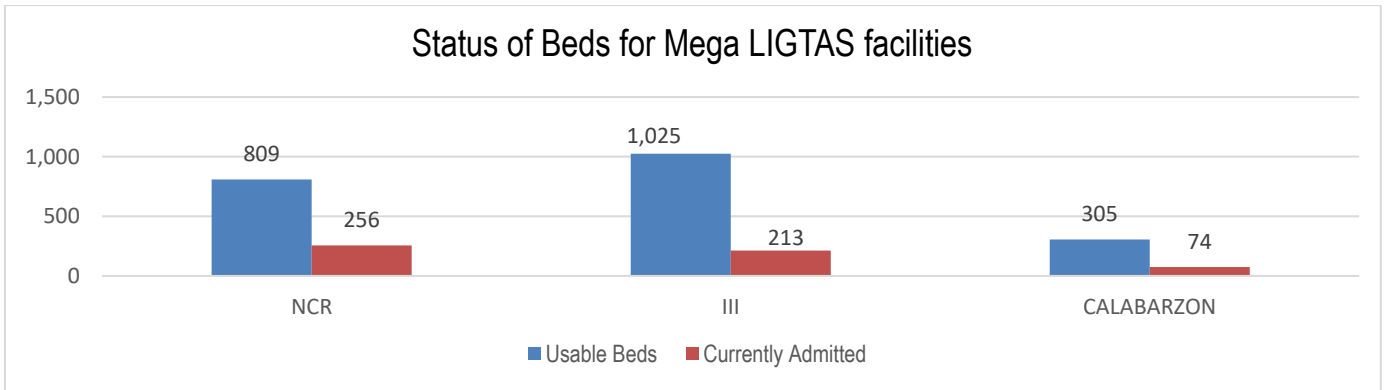
ISOLATE

Isolate involves implementation of measures to separate those identified as exposed and confirmed cases and provide medical interventions to further prevent the spread of the disease. This strategy involves setting up of Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMFs). The summary of TTMFs established is as follows:

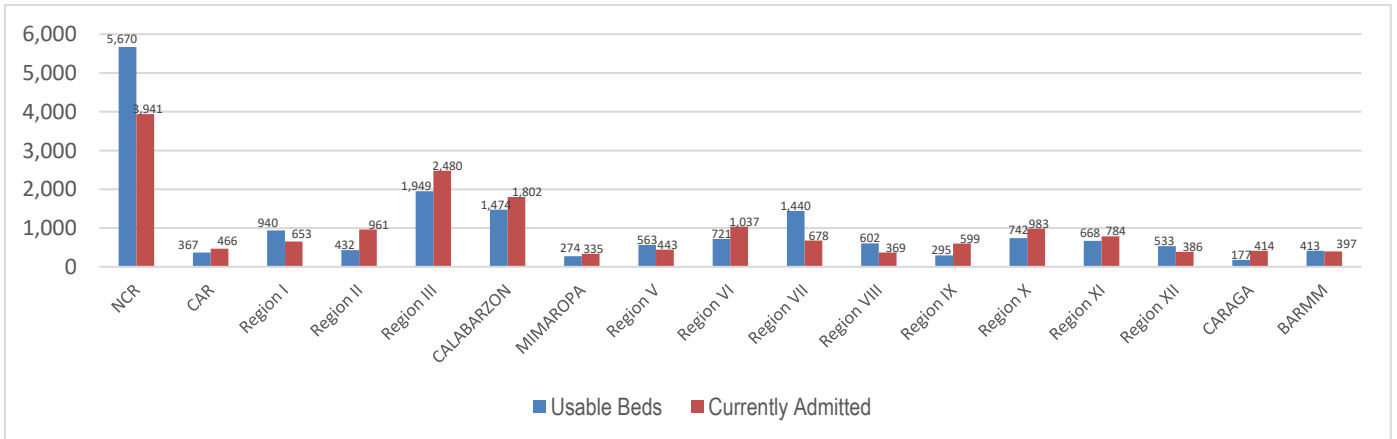

TREAT

For the TREAT strategy, One Hospital Command has been established to facilitate a centralized referral system. Further, wards, isolation, and intensive care units are in operation to provide treatment services for COVID-19 positives. 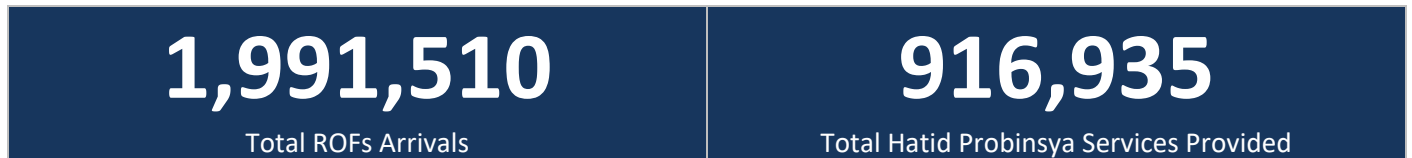
DONATIONS MONITORING

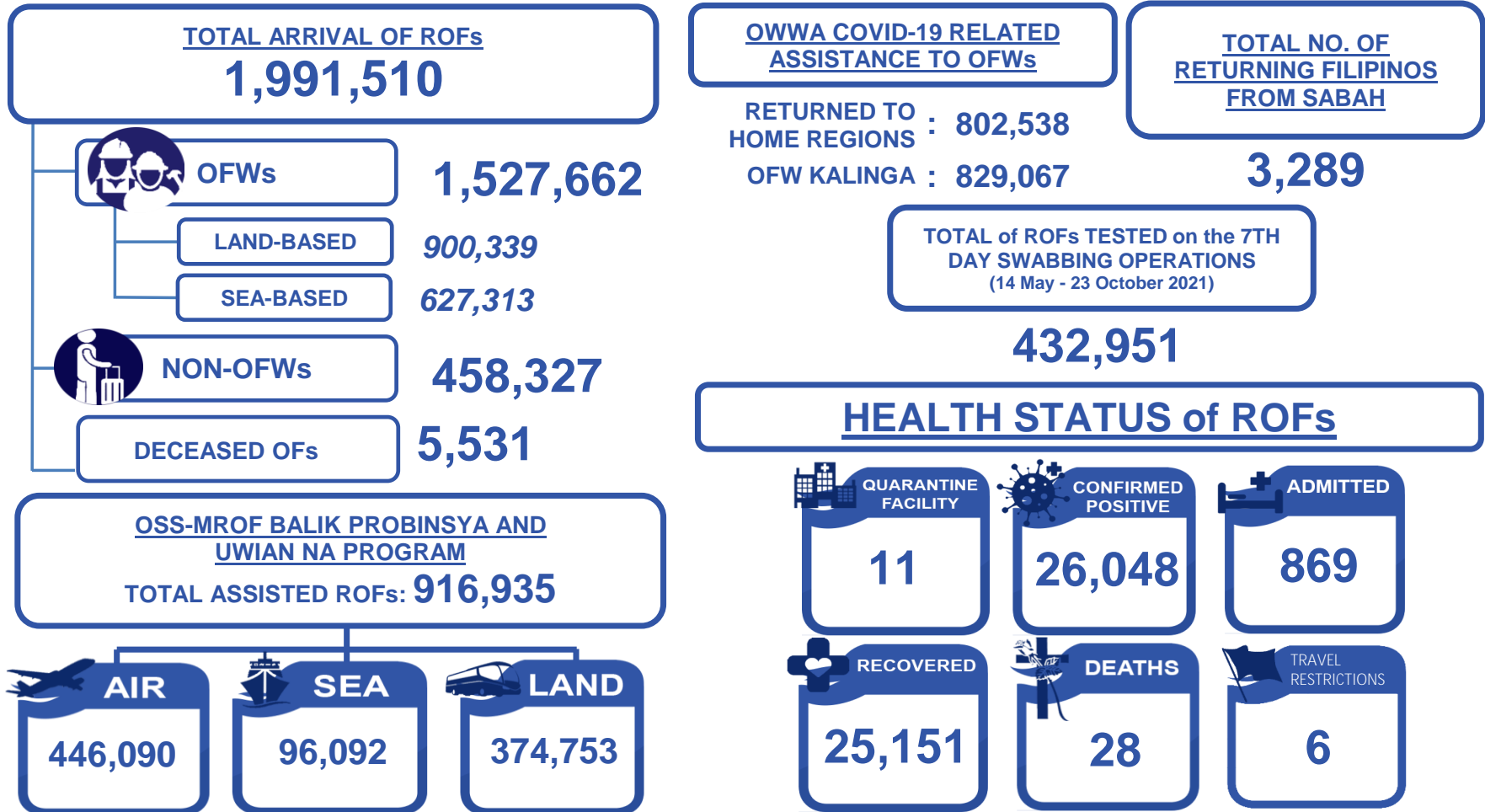

NARRATIVE REPORT
8 January 2022

ACTIONS TAKEN: Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (MROF)

The Task Group on Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (TG-MROF) was created by the National Incident Command-National Task Force COVID 19 to solely cater to the medical and social needs of Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs). The TG-MROF in coordination with various government agencies, private entities, and other task groups created to respond with the prevailing crisis, regional task units, and local government agencies that are task to facilitate the safe return of the ROFs back to their home provinces.

Members: DND, DOTr, DOLE, DILG, DFA, DOT, DSWD, DOH, OCD, OWWA, BOQ, CAAP, MARINA, PCG, PNP and AFP

ARRIVALS: As of 7 January 2022, a total of 1,991,510 **Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs)** arrived at the NAIA Terminals 1, 2, and 3, Clark International Airport, Mactan-Cebu International Airport, Laoag International Airport, South Harbor, Subic, Bataan, Zamboanga, and Batangas Port. Of which, a total of 1,527,652 are **OFWs** (900,339 are **land-based** and 627,313 are **sea-based**) and 458,327 are **non-OFWs**.

A total of 5,531 **deceased ROFs** had arrived in the country from 07 July 2020 – 8 January 2022. Of which, 633 died due to COVID-19.

TESTING: From May 9, 2020 to 31 January 2021, a total of 810,134 ROFs were tested thru RT-PCR.

6TH DAY OF SWABBING OPERATIONS: From 01 February to 13 May 2021, a total of 233,767 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) were tested thru RT-PCR, on the 6th day of their quarantine period.

7TH DAY OF SWABBING OPERATIONS: As of 23 October, a total of 432,951 **Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs)** were tested thru RT-PCR on the 7th day of their quarantine period. Of which, 247,206 were tested by PCG, 42,376 were tested by BOQ Clark, 36,528 were tested by Detoxicare, 41,629 were tested by PADL, 52,624 were tested by DOH-RESU 7, 266 were tested by M. Mariano Memorial Hospital, 3,945 were tested by Southern Philippine Medical Center, and 8,377 were tested by BOQ Subic.

QUARANTINE: As of 8 January 2022, a total of 26,048 ROFs were confirmed positive with COVID-19. Of which, 869 are admitted at 11 quarantine facilities, 25,151 were able to recover and 28 died.

OSS-MROF BALIK PROBINSYA AND UWIAN NA PROGRAM: As of 7 January 2022, a total of 916,935 ROFs were assisted back to their home provinces. Of which, 374,753 were assisted by land, 446,090 by air, and 96,092 by sea.

OWWA COVID-19 RELATED ASSISTANCE TO OFWs: From March 2020 to 10 October, 2021, a total of 829,067 OFWs were assisted by OWWA on their “Returned to Home Regions” program and 801,037 OFWs are also assisted through “OFW Kalinga” program.

RETURNING FILIPINOS (REFs) from SABAH: As of 22 May 2021, a total of 3,289 REFs from Sabah had arrived in the country. While as of 21 June 2021, a total of 4,683 remaining Filipinos are still in Sabah for transfer.

TRAVEL BANNED COUNTRIES: As of 29 December 2021, the IATF approved the imposition of travel restriction on Eswatini, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, and Spain by placing it under the Red List while 33 countries was listed under Green List effective from January 1, 2022 until January 15, 2022.

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
