## Summary of Effects<sup>2</sup>

As of **02 April 2020**, a total of **2,633 confirmed COVID-19 cases** were monitored and reported in the Philippines, of which **107** persons were declared **dead** while **51** persons have already **recovered**.

Meanwhile, a total of **1,154** persons are considered **Patients Under Investigation (PUIs)** while **6,321** are considered **Persons under Monitoring (PUMs)**.

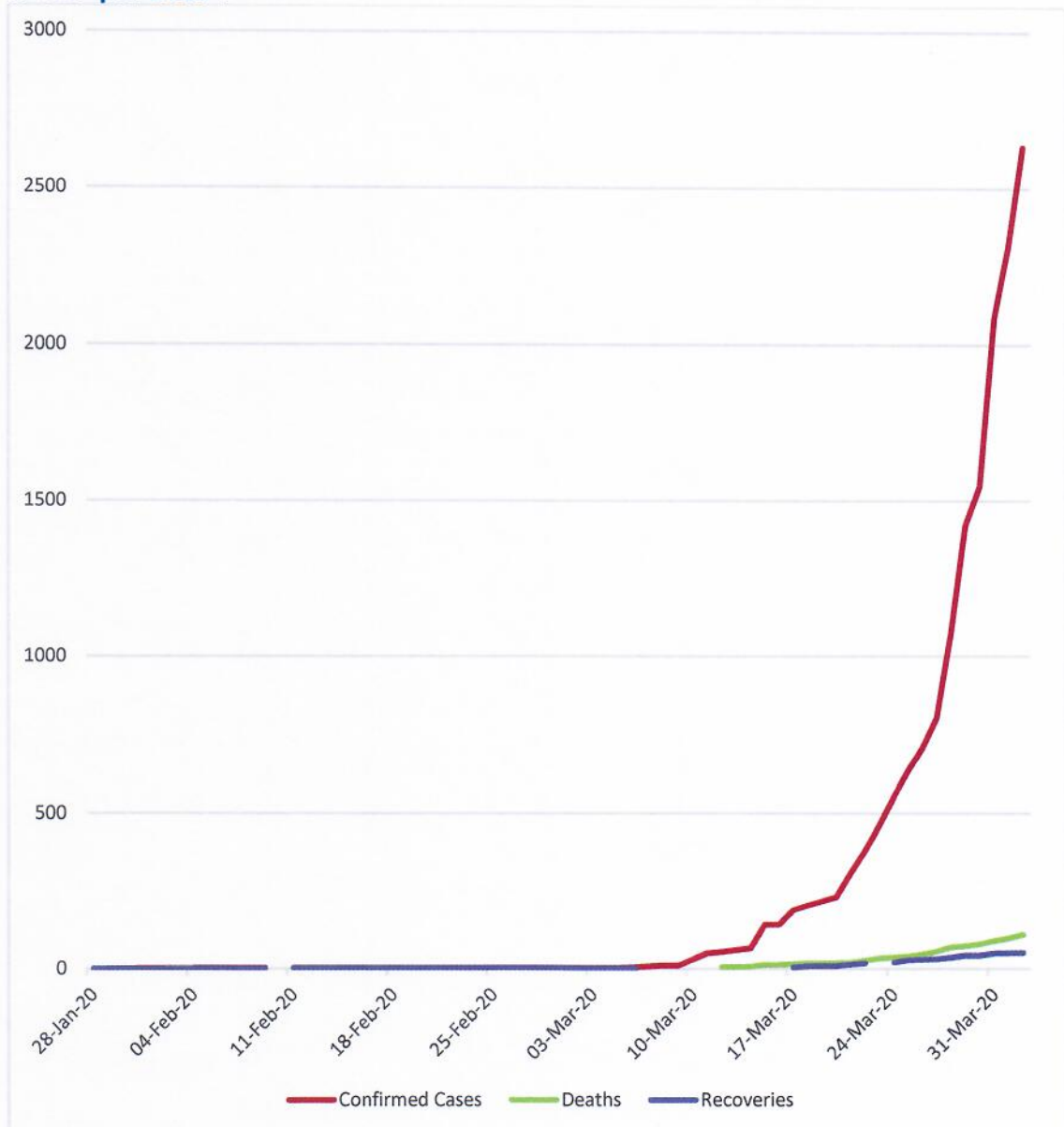


Figure 1 Trend of COVID-19 Cases from 28 January 2020 to 01 April 2020

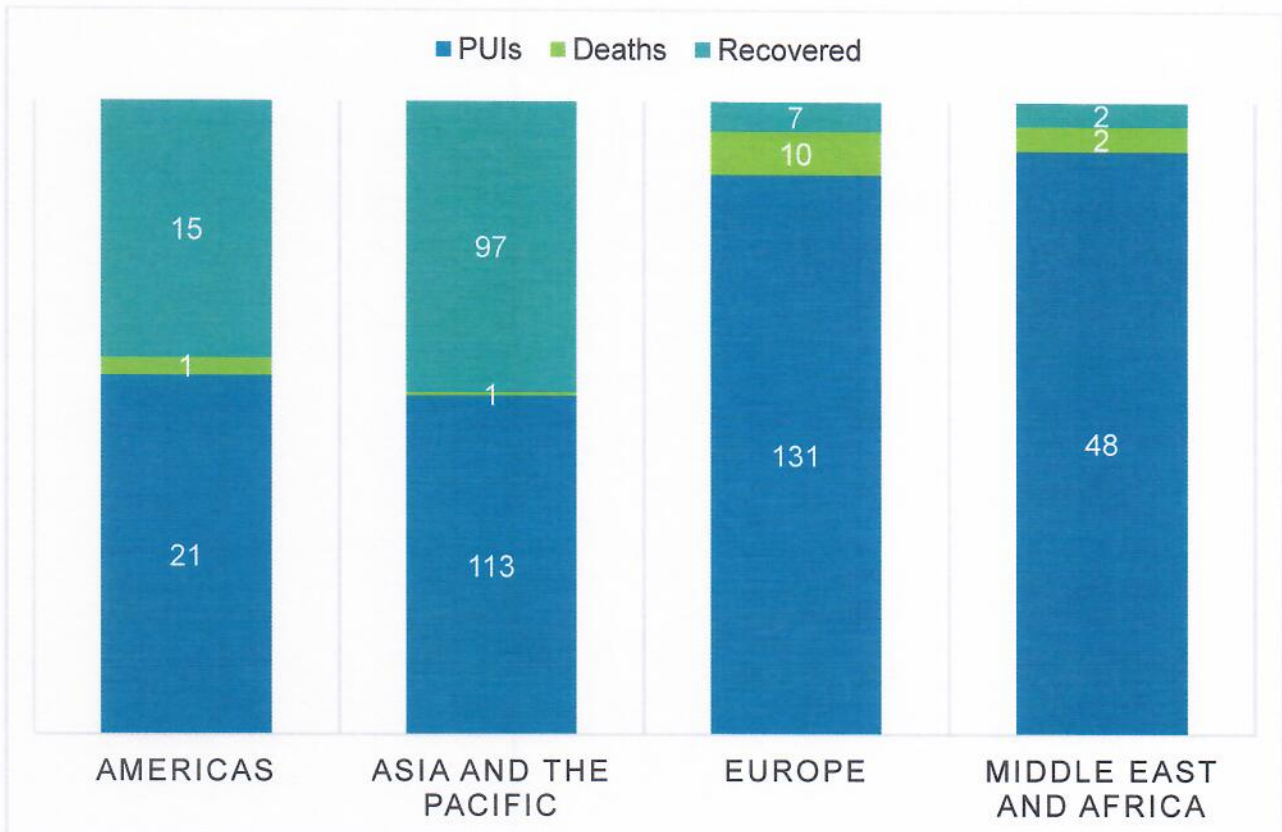

### Summary of Effects to Overseas Filipinos<sup>5</sup>

As of **02 April 2020**, a total of **448 confirmed COVID-19 cases for Overseas Filipinos** were monitored and reported, of which **14** were declared **dead** while **121** persons have already **recovered**. Meanwhile, a total of **313** persons are considered **Patients Under Investigation (PUIs)**.

A total of **32 countries** have Overseas Filipinos with confirmed COVID-19 cases. The breakdown of cases is as follows:

Graph 1 Total COVID-19 cases affecting overseas Filipinos per region

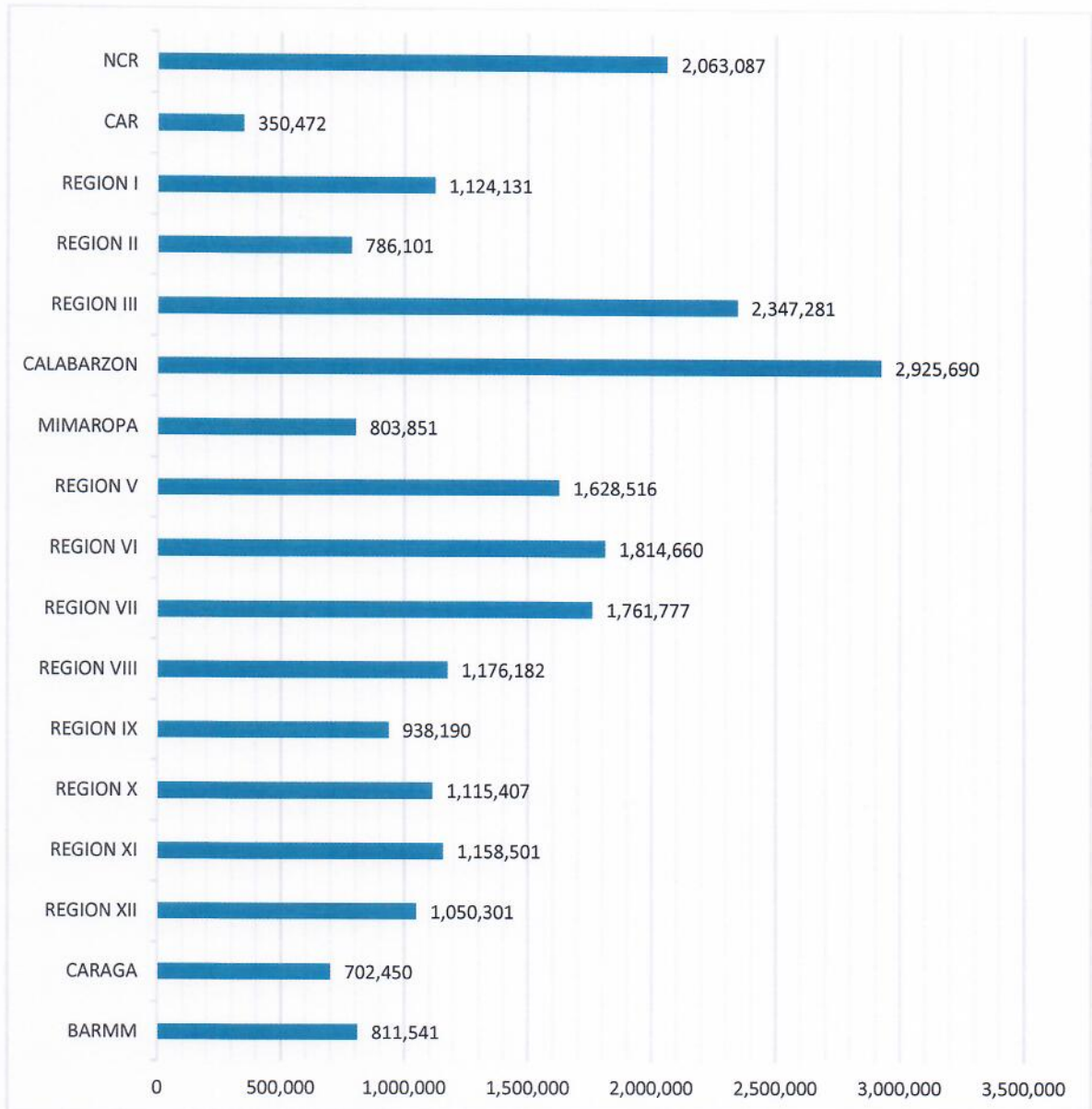
Based on the above graph, the region of **Asia and the Pacific** has the highest number of confirmed COVID-19 cases for overseas Filipinos (**211 cases**) while the region of **Americas** has the lowest number of confirmed cases (**37 cases**).

According to the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), around **8,695 Overseas Filipinos are expected to be repatriated**, of which **2,516** are now undergoing the necessary arrangements. A total of **3,587 Overseas Filipinos** have successfully been repatriated.

Graph 2 Total number of affected learners per region

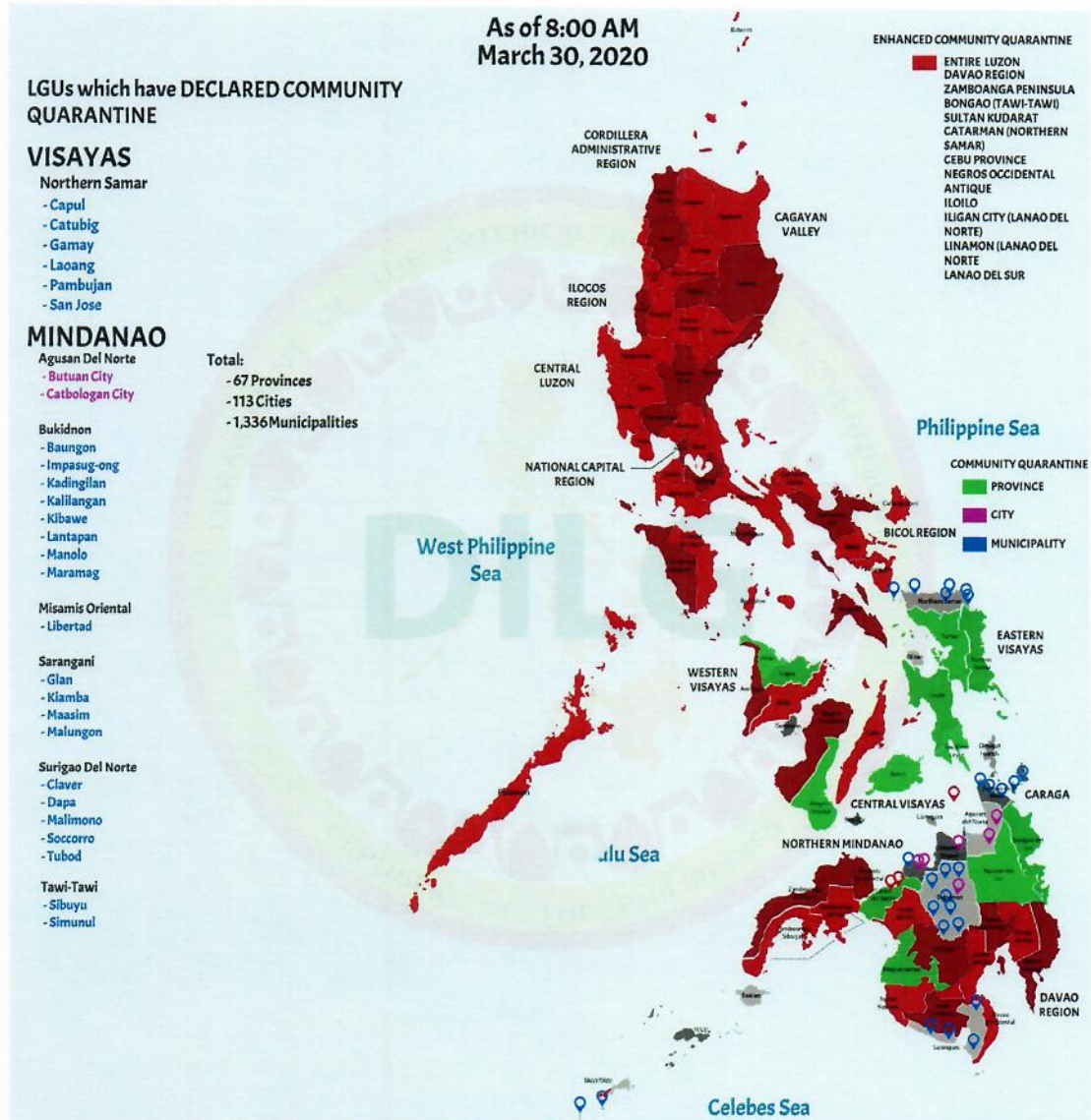

## II. TASK GROUP UPDATES Task Group Response Operations

### Initiation of Community Quarantine Declaration<sup>7</sup>

As of **02 April 2020**, a total of **67 provinces**, **113 cities** and **1,336 municipalities** have declared community quarantine. Below is the index map of the local government units (LGUs) with declared community quarantine:

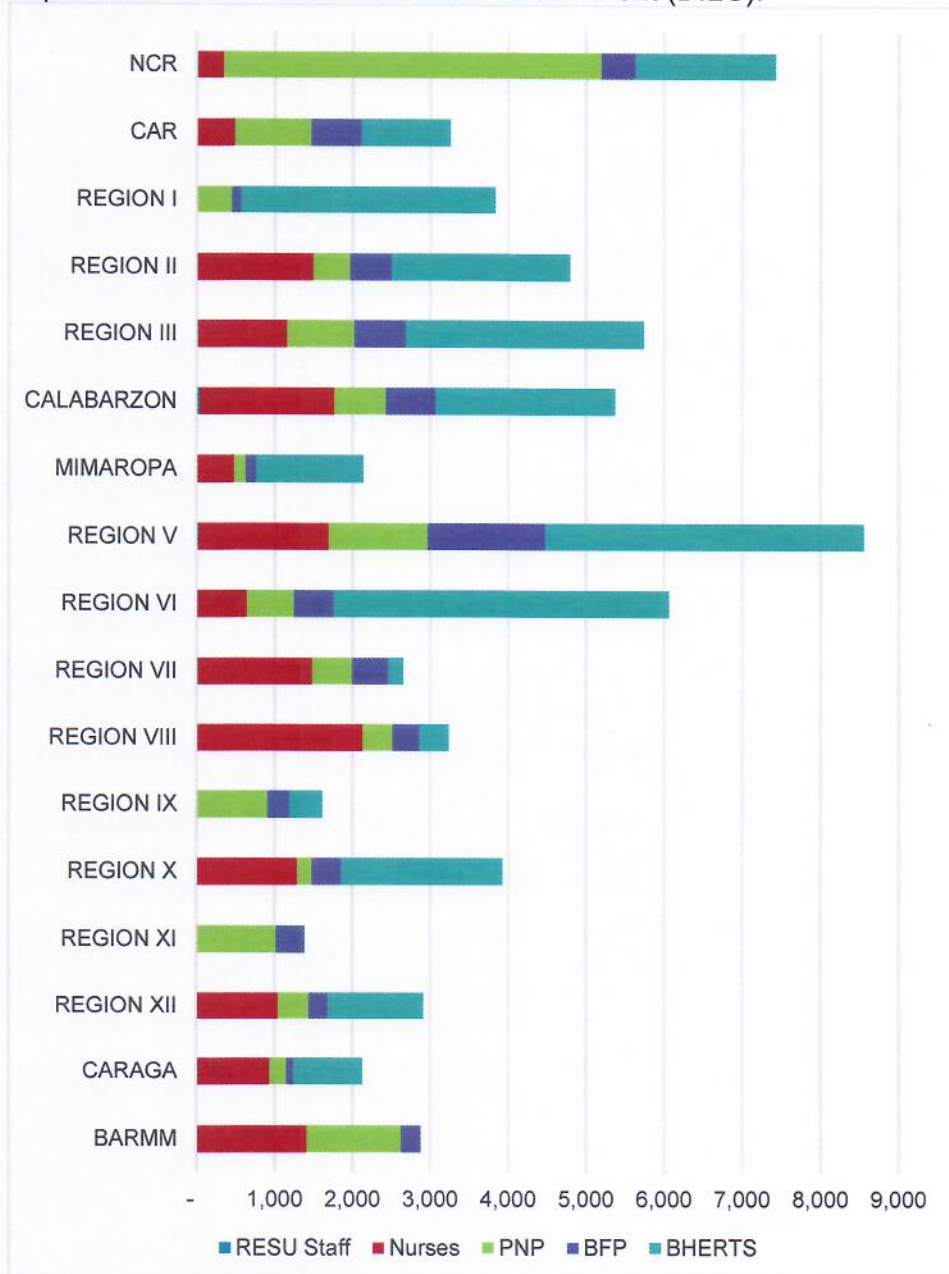


*Figure 3 Index map of LGUs with community quarantine declarations*

## Number of Response Personnel Deployed<sup>8</sup>

With the instructions from the Department of Health (DOH), Regional Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (RESU) staff and primary care personnel were deployed to undertake contact tracing. The Philippine National Police (PNP) and Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) also mobilized the respective personnel. Further, the Barangay Health Emergency Response Teams (BHERTs) were deployed under the instruction of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG).

**Updated data for 02 April 2020 are to be determined and obtained.** As of **01 April 2020**, the total workforce deployment is composed of **219 RESU staff, 16,181 primary care personnel, 15,194 personnel from PNP, 7,601 personnel from BFP, and 28,826 BHERTs.**

CALABARZON has the highest number of RESU staff (36 personnel) deployed while BARMM has the lowest number of RESU staff (5 personnel).

Region VIII has the highest number of primary care personnel (2,124 personnel) deployed while NCR has the lowest number of primary care personnel (328 personnel). Given the highest number of confirmed cases in NCR, the region needs more nurses and medical workers in hospitals.

Data from Regions I, IX and XI are still for verification.

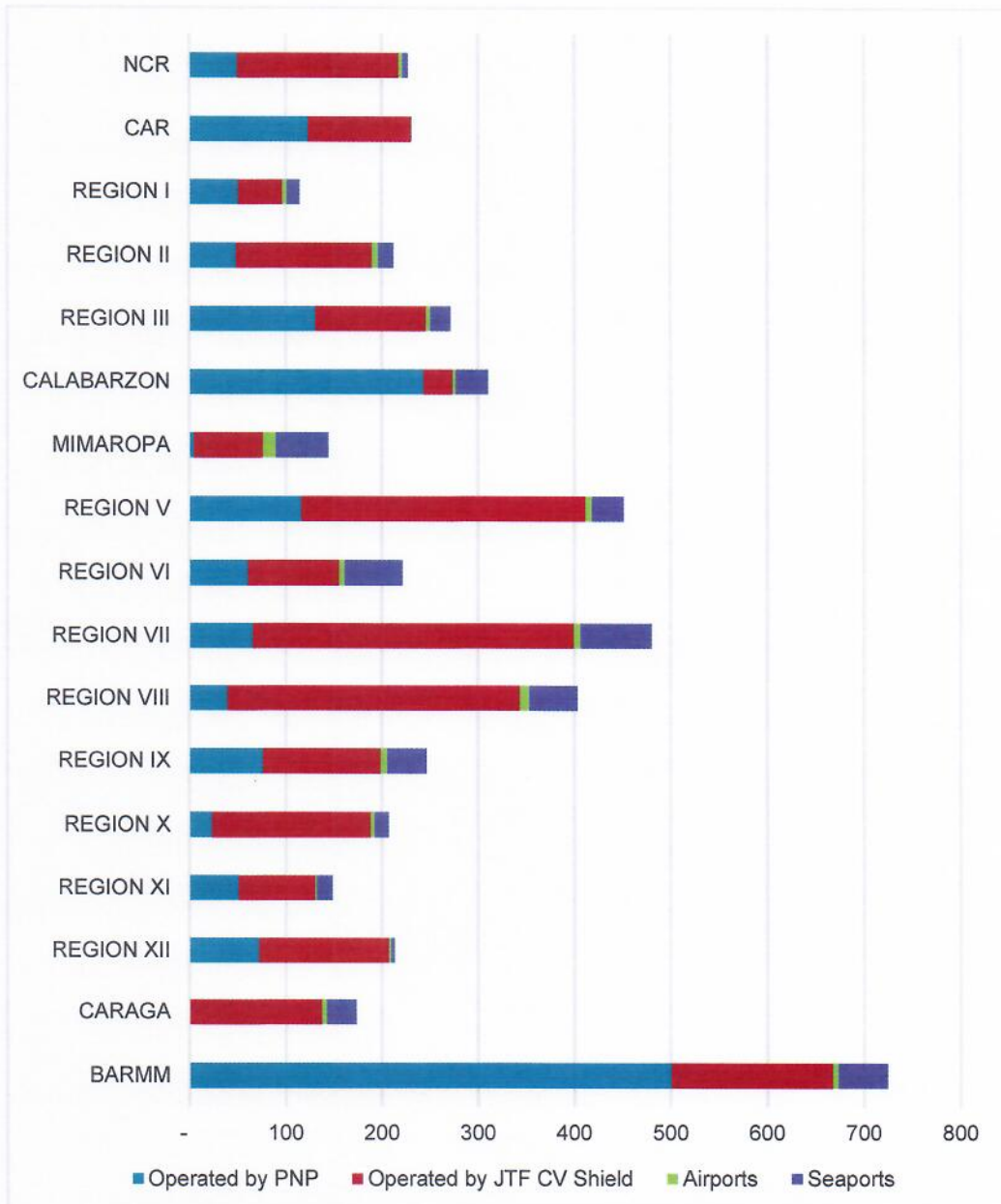
NCR has the highest number of PNP personnel (**4,855** personnel) deployed while **MIMAROPA** has the lowest number of PNP personnel (**156** personnel).

Region V has the highest number of BFP personnel (**1,512** personnel) deployed while CARAGA remains to have the lowest number of BFP personnel (**89** personnel).

**Region VI has the highest number of functional BHERTs (4,311 BHERTs). BARMM has zero (0) reported functional BHERTs while data from Region XI are to be obtained.**

## Establishment of Quarantine Control Points<sup>9</sup>

Quarantine control points (QCPs) have been established by the local government units (LGUs) under the supervision of the PNP to implement the procedures for community quarantine. The Joint Task Force Coronavirus (JTF CV) Shield composed PNP, BFP, Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) and Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) has also been organized and stationed at the QCPs. Further, QCPs have been established in sea and airports and operated by JTF CV Shield.



Graph 4 Total QCPs operated by PNP and JTF CV Shield; and established at airports and seaports per region

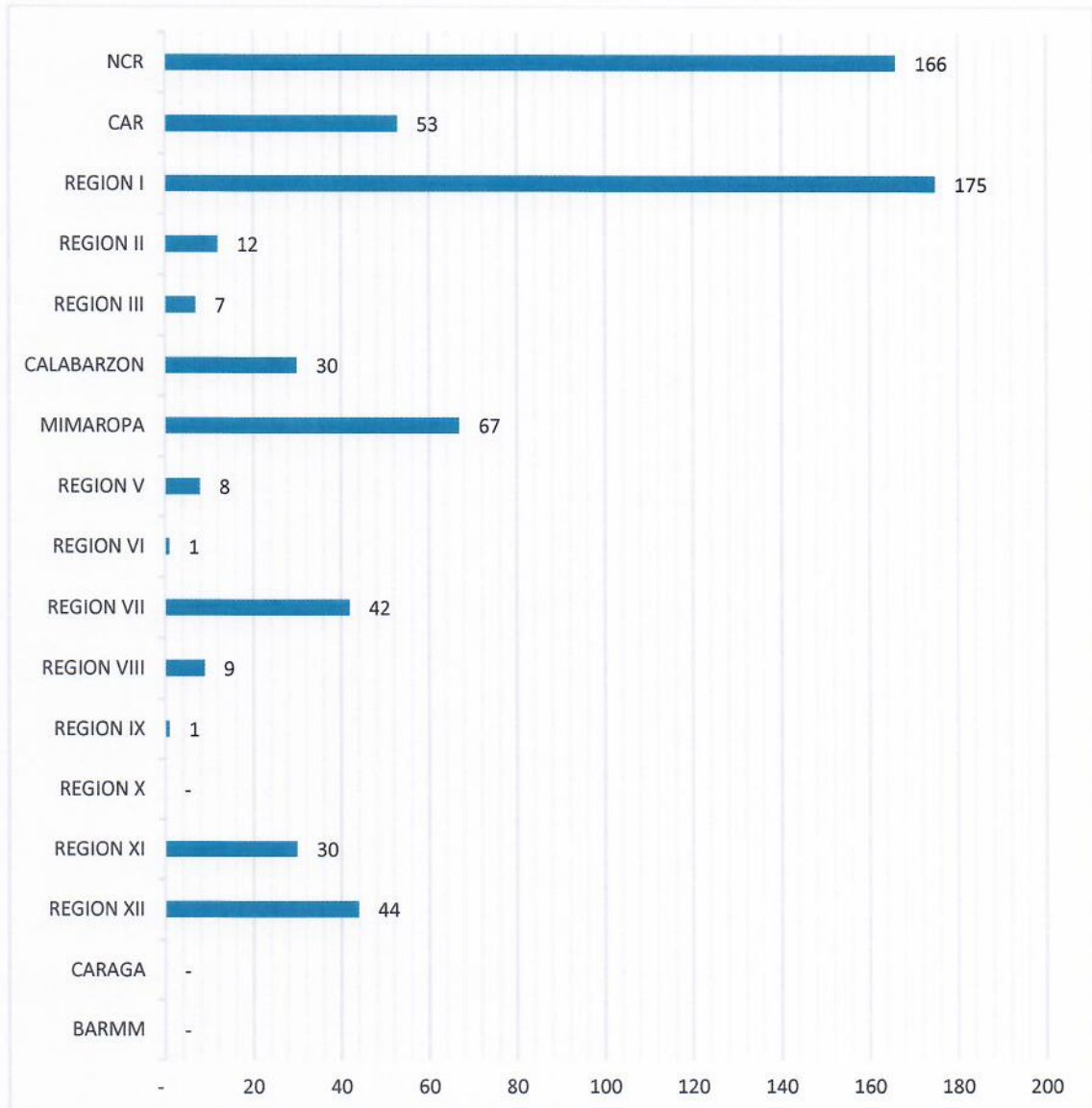

As of **02 April 2020**, a total of **1,665** QCPs were operated by the PNP, **2,513** were operated by the JTF CV Shield, **94** were operated at airports, and **520** were operated at seaports.

BARMM has the highest number of total QCPs (**725** QCPs) operated while Region I has the lowest number of total QCPs (**115** QCPs).

## Maintenance of Law and Order<sup>10</sup>

The PNP and other security forces implemented measures to maintain law and order. Persons involved in hoarding, profiteering or manipulation of prices have been arrested.

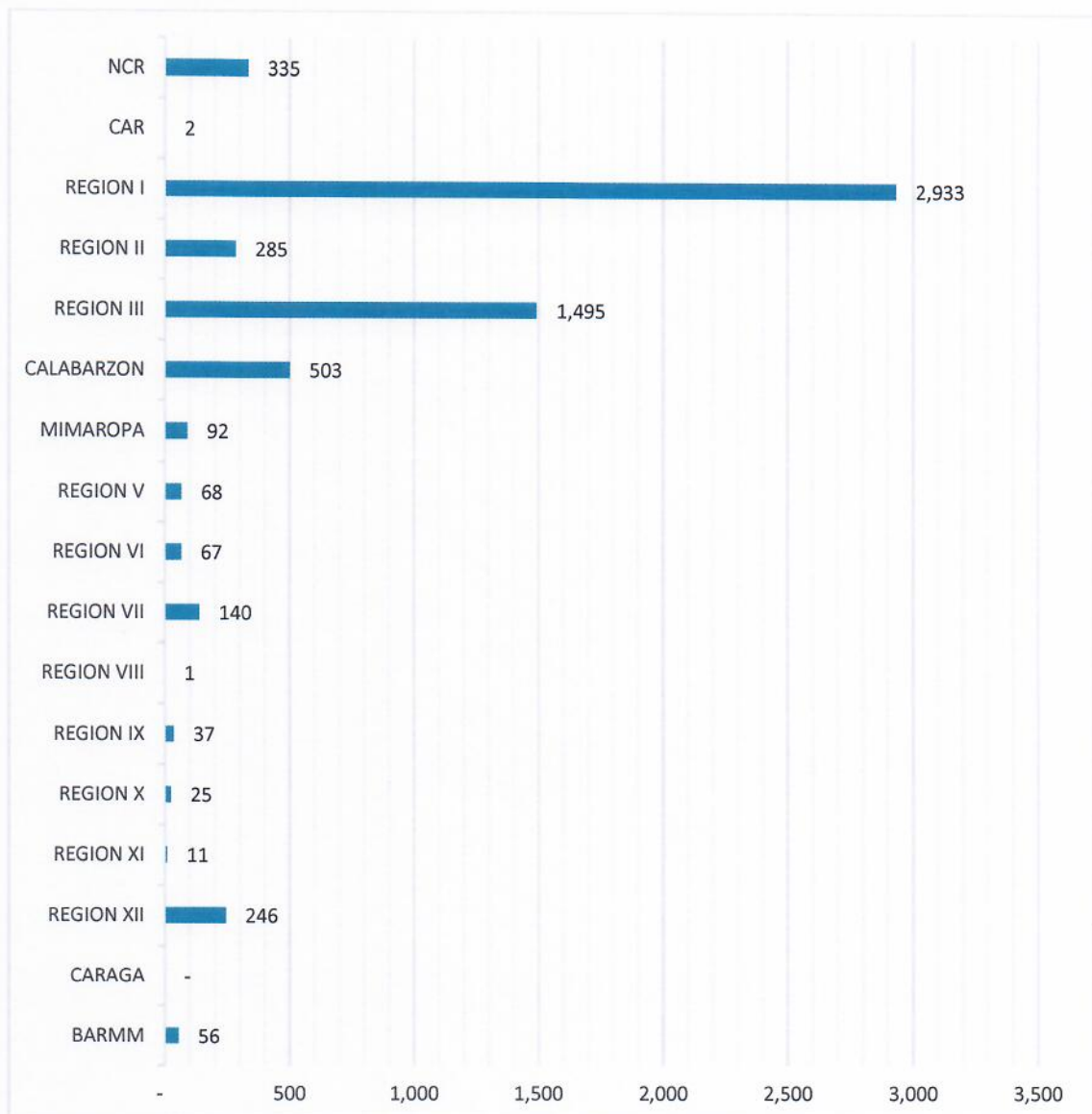


Graph 5 Total number of persons arrested for hoarding, profiteering and manipulation of prices per region

As of **02 April 2020**, a total of **645** persons have been arrested for hoarding, profiteering and manipulation of prices. **Region I** has the highest number of arrests (**175** persons) while **Region X**, **CARAGA** and **BARMM** have zero (0) arrests reported.

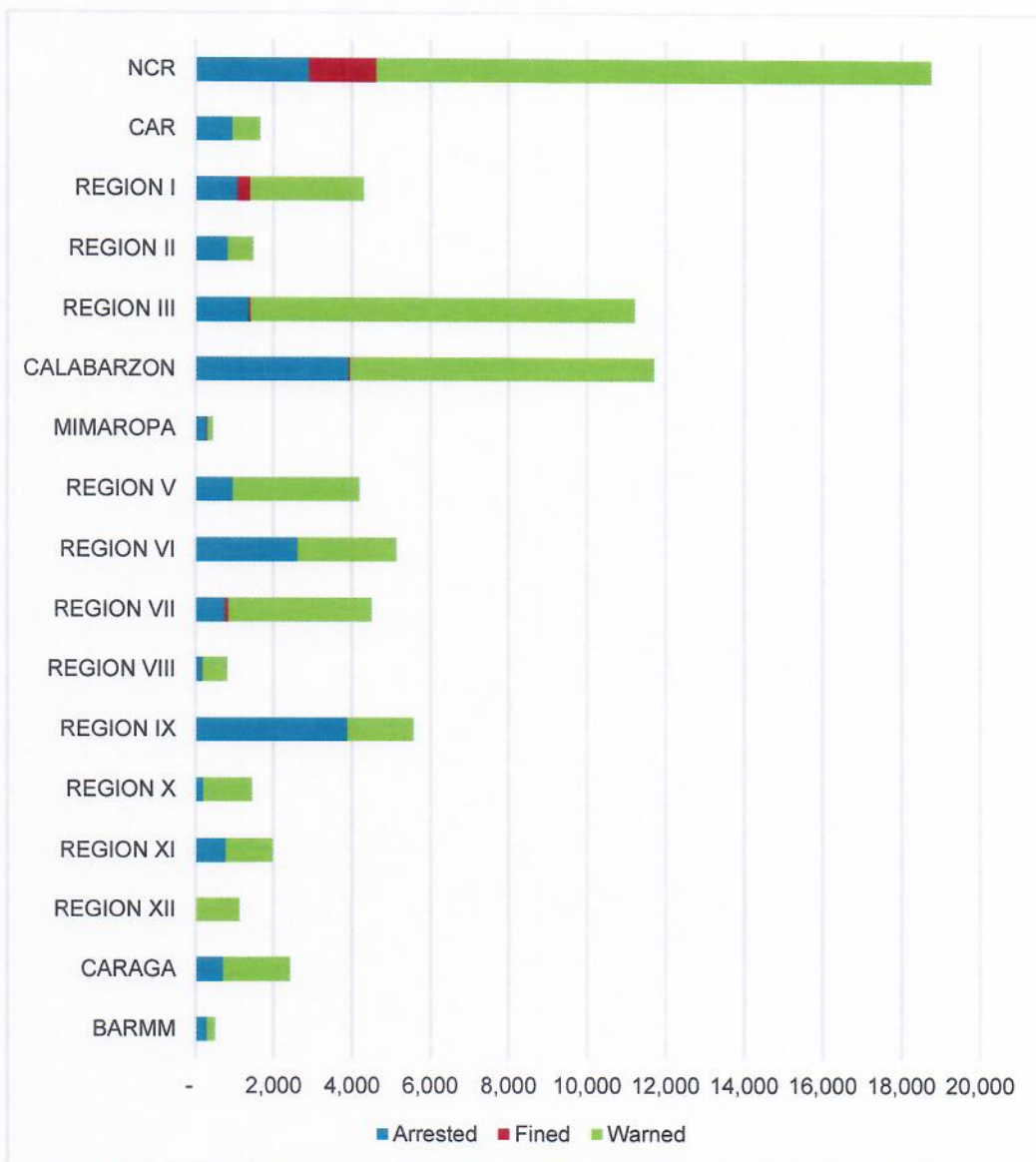
Given the implementation of community quarantine, the PNP also ensured the compliance of operators of public utility vehicles (PUVs).

As of **02 April 2020**, a total of **6,296** PUV operators with violators have been identified. Region I has the highest number of violators (2,933 violators) while CARAGA has zero (0) violators reported.

Further, the PNP implemented measures to arrest, fine and warn violators of curfew rules as well as other individuals who demonstrated disobedient behaviors.



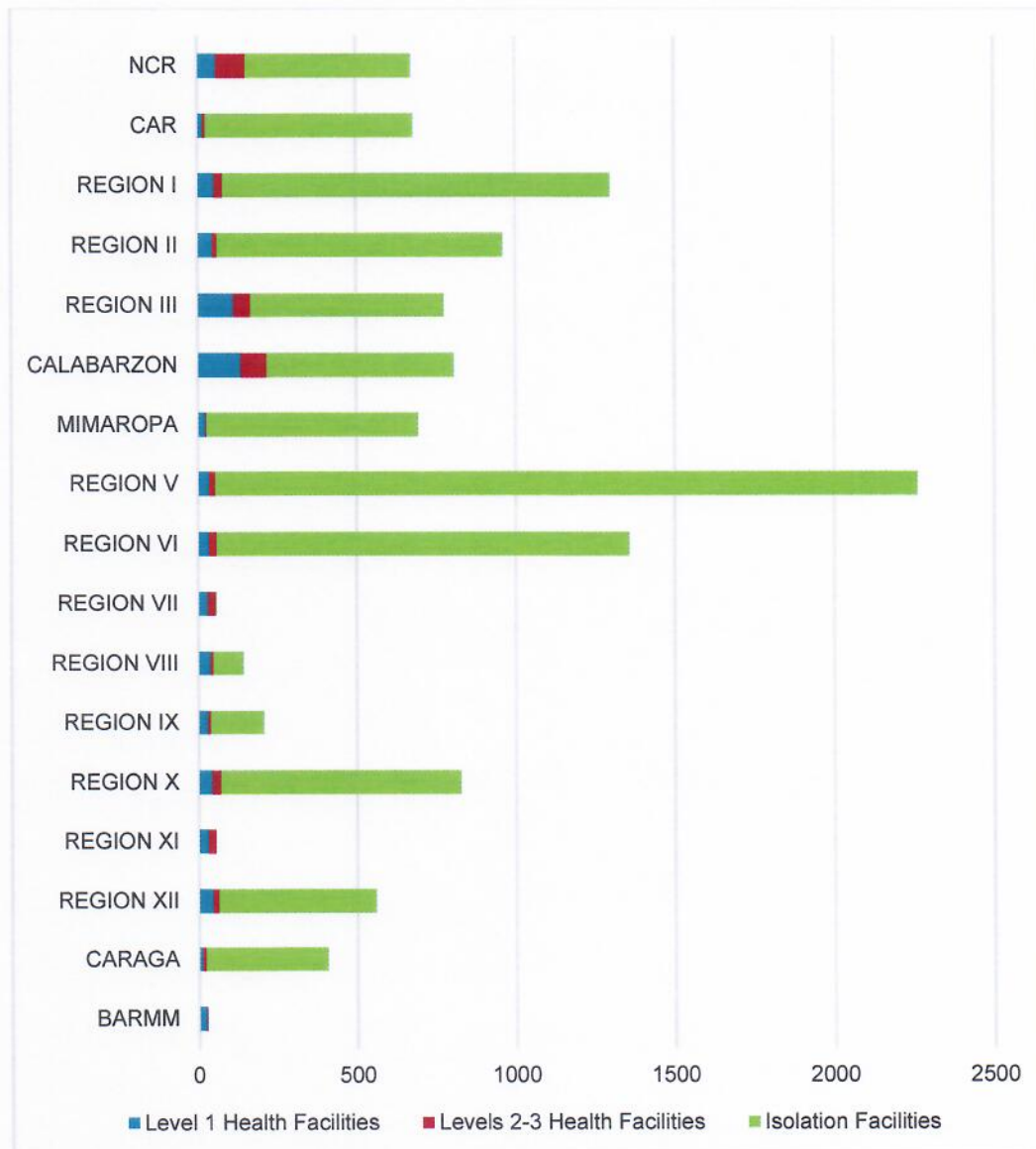
Graph 7 Total violators of curfew rules and other individuals with disobedient behaviors per region

As of **02 April 2020**, a total of **77,550** curfew violators and individuals with disobedient behaviors were identified. NCR has the highest number of violators (**14,150** violators) while MIMAROPA has lowest violators (**147** violators).

## TASK GROUP RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AND LOGISTICS

### Status of Health Facilities for Referral and Isolation Facilities<sup>11</sup>

Health facilities (both public and private facilities) are in operation. The health facilities are classified as **Level 1** (basic level with no intensive care units (ICU), and caters to patients with minor care and supervision), **Level 2** (with additional facilities such as ICU and specialist doctors) and **Level 3** (with high-level specialty services). Further, isolation units have been established.

As of **01 April 2020**, a total of **795 Level 1 health facilities** and **450 Levels 2 – 3 health facilities** are in operation. Further, a total of **10,575 isolation facilities** have been established. As of reporting time, there's an increase of monitored and reported isolation facilities in the country.

CALARAZON has the highest number of health facilities (219):

- 137 Level 1 health facilities
- 82 Levels 2 – 3 health facilities

CARAGA has the least number of health facilities (23):

- 13 Level 1 health facilities
- 10 Levels 2 – 3 health facilities

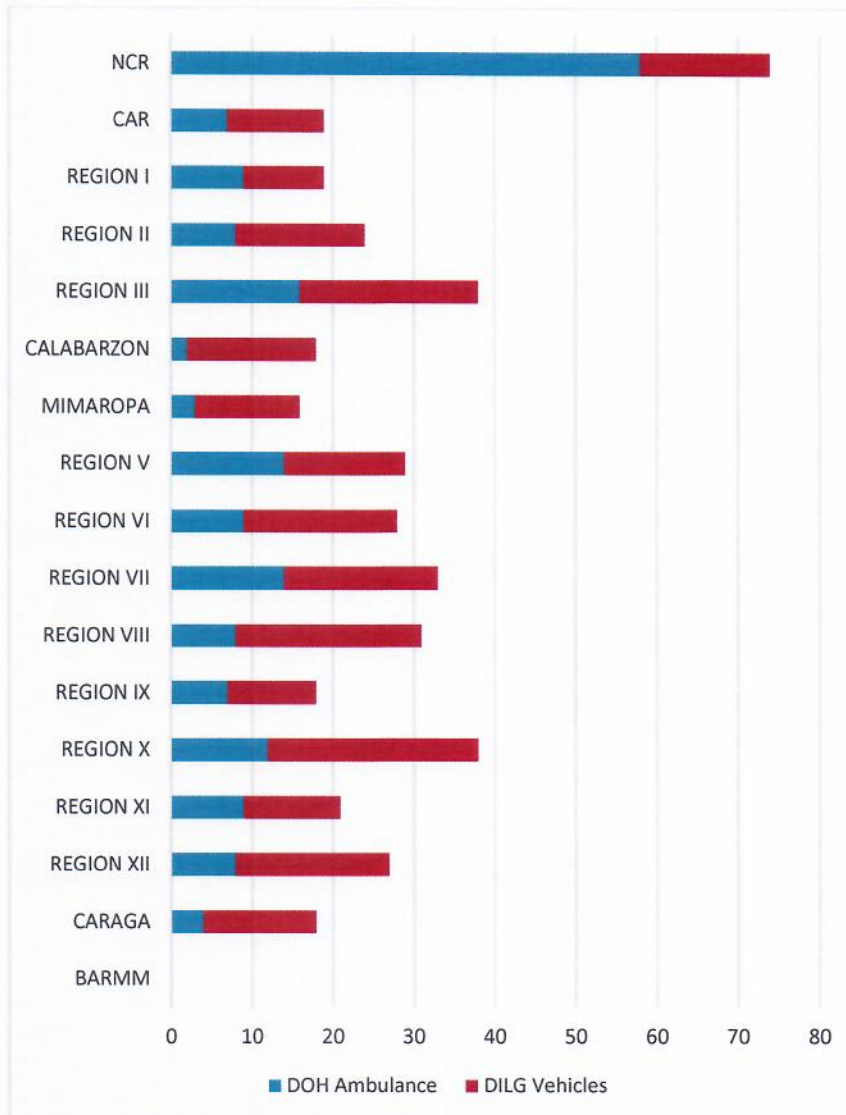
Region V has the highest number of isolation facilities (2,206 isolation facilities). BARMM has 3 reported isolation facilities while Region XI has no report submitted.

## Status of Transportation Assets<sup>12</sup>

In terms of transportation assets, the DOH has provided ambulances and the DILG has provided vehicles.

As of **01 April 2020**, a total of **188 ambulances** from DOH are in operation. Further, a total of **263 vehicles from DILG** are in operation.

Metro Manila has the highest number of DOH ambulances (58 ambulances) while CALABARZON has the lowest number of DOH ambulances (2 ambulances).

Region X has the highest number of DILG vehicles (26 vehicles) while Region I has the lowest number of DILG vehicles (10 vehicles).

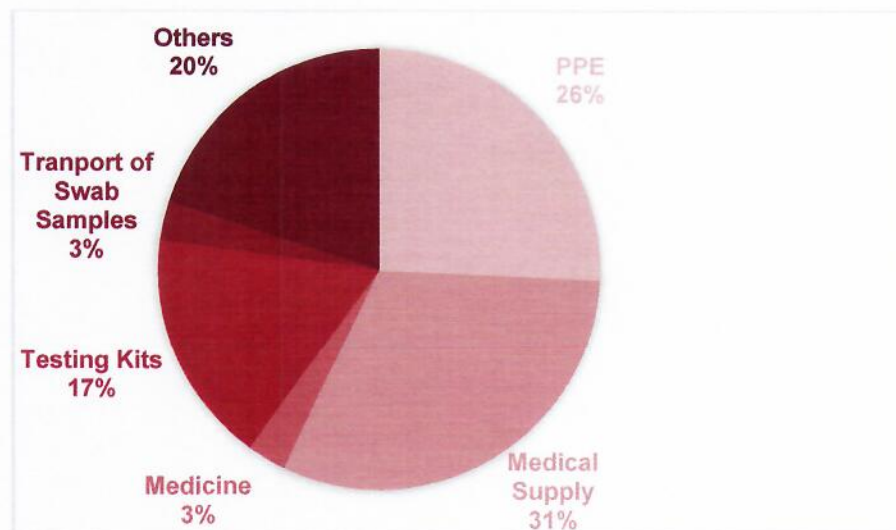

Medical supplies account for **31%** for the items delivered with the logistical support services of OCD while medicines and swab samples account with **3 %**, respectively.

As of **02 April 2020**, OCD was able to receive a total of **37 requests** from government and private sector where **73%** of the requests are from government offices. Fifteen (15) out of the thirty seven (37) requests are already delivered while twenty two (22) are already processed and endorsed to the transport services for scheduling.

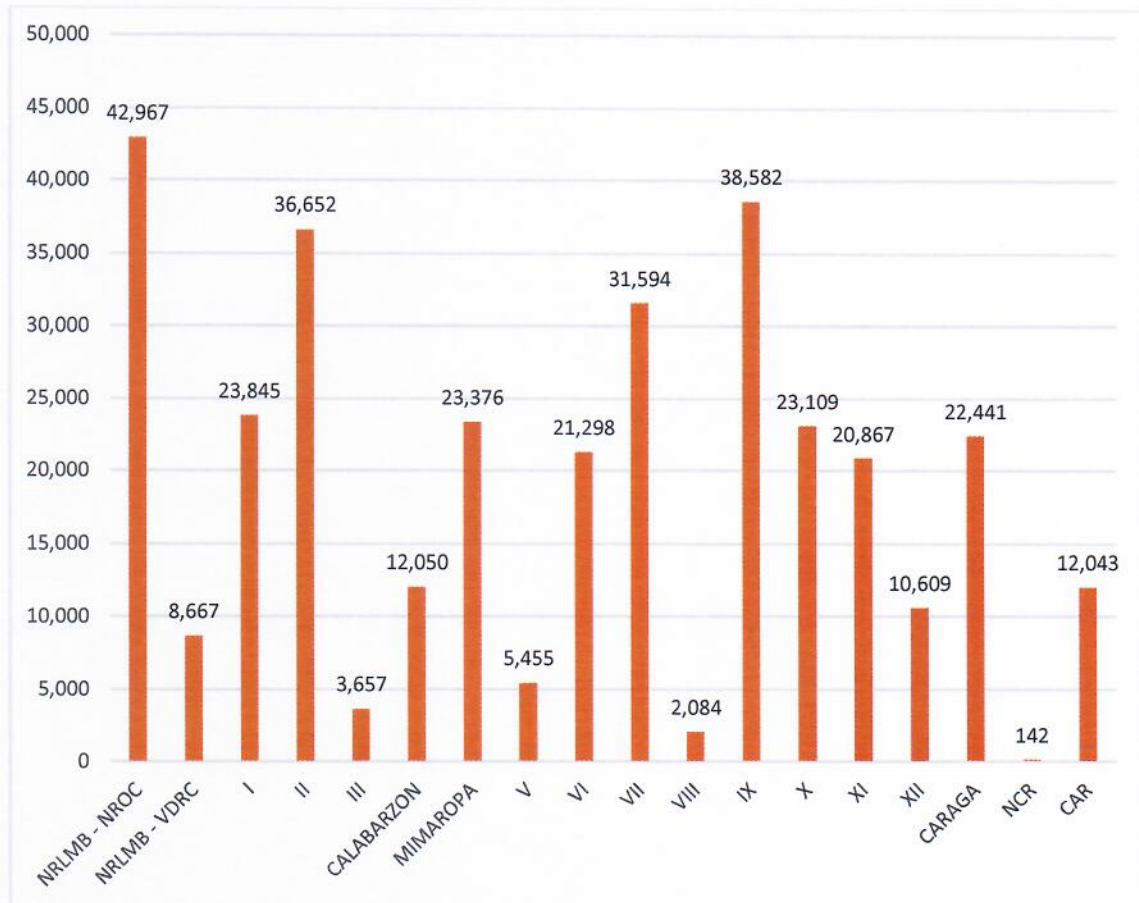
