



P-D-I-T-R STRATEGY

With reference to the National Action Plan (NAP) for COVID-19, the National Task Force is intensifying efforts to PREVENT the spread of the COVID-19, TEST individuals and communities, ISOLATE those that are identified to be confirmed cases, TREAT and provide with appropriate health care, and REINTEGRATE them back to the community.

PREVENT

PREVENT enables to change mindsets and behaviors to advocate for a shared responsibility in ensuring compliance to minimum public health standards and protocols and address stigma and division in the communities, workplaces, schools. To implement the PREVENT strategy, community quarantine declarations are made in various localities, enforcing stricter regulations and disease preventive measures particular for areas with high cases. Status of community quarantine declarations is summarized as follows:



DETECT

DETECT entails active screening of those presenting with signs and symptoms of COVID-19 in the community as well as other disease surveillance activities. For this purpose, contact tracing teams have been organized and provided with appropriate training. Summary is as follows:





ISOLATE

Isolate involves implementation of measures to separate those identified as exposed and confirmed cases and provide medical interventions to further prevent the spread of the disease. This strategy involves setting up of Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMFs). The summary of TTMFs established is as follows:



For the TREAT strategy, One Hospital Command has been established to facilitate centralized referral system. Further, wards, isolation and intensive care units are in operation to provide treatment services for COVID-19 positives. The occupancy rate for all beds dedicated to COVID-19 (Ward, Isolation, Intensive Care) among reporting hospitals is summarized as follows.

Active Cases as of 5 November 2020 (net of recoveries and deaths)



Breakdown of Active Cases



A patient with an RT-PCR confirmed case of COVID-19 without symptoms.



27,199 (83.0%) Mild

A patient with mild symptoms and stable vital signs. Unless the patient belongs to high-risk subgroups or has comorbidities, they are often not admitted to a treatment facility.



A patient with difficulty breathing, altered mental status, considered high-risk or in need of hospital care.



A patient with impending or ongoing respiratory failure, in need of mechanical ventilation, or with evidence of end-organ damage.

Note. A person who is classified as having a mild case of COVID-19 but is considered high-risk due to age or the presence of comorbidities must be admitted to a treatment facility. Severe or critical cases must be admitted to a treatment facility, regardless of inclusion in high-risk subgroups or presence of comorbidities.





CONFIRMED CASES BY DATE OF ONSET OF ILLNESS (NATIONWIDE)




CONFIRMED DEATHS BY DATE OF DEATH (NATIONWIDE)

- 2. In cases where date of onset of illness is unreported, date of specimen collection was used as proxy. Cases that do not have both are not accounted for in the date of onset histogram. As of this situation report, around 10% of cases have unreported dates of specimen collection and onset of illness.
- 3. Owing to delays in reporting, case counts within the gray area are still incomplete. Hence, we urge caution in interpreting data beyond this 14-day cutoff. Rest assured that the DOH continues to work tirelessly to ensure the timely reporting of accurate data.

Time-varying Reproduction number



The time-varying **reproduction number** (R_{*}) indicates the possible number of people being infected by a sick person, at a specific time with control measures in place.

IMPORTANT NOTE. The reproduction number is measured using symptom onset, we do not include in the interpretation the past 14-16 days given the time between symptoms, health seeking, testing, and reporting. When interpreting the reproduction number keep in mind that it is a l<mark>agging indicator (that is, it provides a snapshot of the situation two weeks ago)</mark>. Please do not expect this number to change daily.

- The reproduction number (R₂) was around 2 early on in the outbreak. This meant that each confirmed person with COVID was infecting 2 other people.
- Based on the latest data, we are 95 percent confident that $R_{\star} = 0.96 \pm 0.02$, which means each infected individual was infecting an average of 0.96 other persons around two weeks ago.
- Lowering this value is made possible through efforts such as social distancing, wearing of PPE, and other means to stop the spread of the virus.
- The goal is for R, to be less than 1, which would mean that, on average, an infected person is infecting less than one person, eventually stopping the transmission of COVID-19.


UTILIZATION OF COVID-19 BEDS





RECENT UPDATES ON COVID-19


As of November 5, 2020

- DOH recorded **32,773 active cases** with the majority of the patients exhibiting mild symptoms (27,199; 83.0%) while 1,454 patients are in critical condition (4.4%).
- DOH recorded 11,346 health care workers positive for COVID-19. Of these, **11,002** (97.0%) have recovered, 71 (0.6%) have died and 273 (2.4%) were active cases. Of these active cases, 132 (48.4%) were mild cases, 107 (39.2%) were asymptomatic, 23 (8.4%) in severe condition and 11 (4.0%) in critical condition.
- A total of 556,762 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) have arrived in the country (Land-based: 313,669; Sea-based: 241,507; and Transferees from Sabah 1,586). Of these, 552,866 were released from facility quarantine (Land-based: 311,516; Sea-based: 239,764; and Sabah: 1,586). Among the ROFs, **9,639 were confirmed COVID-19 patients** (Land-based: 6,049; Sea-based: 3,590). Among these, 262 are currently admitted, 9,347 have already recovered; and 5 have died.



NARRATIVE REPORT 6 November 2020

ACTIONS TAKEN: Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (MROF)

The Task Group on Management of Returning Overseas Filipinos (TG-MROF) was created by the National Incident Command-National Task Force COVID 19 to solely cater to the medical and social needs of Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs). The TG-MROF in coordination with various government agencies, private entities, and other task groups created to respo nse with the prevailing crisis, regional task units, and local government agencies that are task to facilitate the safe return of the ROFs back to their home provinces.

Members: DND, DOTr, DOLE, DILG, DFA, DOT, DSWD, DOH, OCD, OWWA, BOQ, CAAP, MARINA, PCG, PNP and AFP

ARRIVALS: As of 4 November 2020, a total of <u>501,972</u> Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) arrived at the NAIA Terminals 1, 2, and 3, Clark International Airport, Mactan-Cebu International Airport, South Harbor, Subic, Bataan, and Zamboanga Port. Of which, <u>219,037</u> are land-based OFWs, <u>203,101</u> are sea-based OFWs and <u>77,825</u> are Non-OFWs.

A total of $\frac{2,009}{4}$ deceased OFs had arrived in the country from 01 July – 5 November 2020. Of which, 314 died due to COVID-19.

TESTING: As of 4 November 2020, a total of <u>499,963</u> ROFs were all tested thru RT-PCR. Of which, <u>12,987</u> ROFs that was previously tested thru Rapid Test Kits have undergone a re-test thru RT-PCR.

QUARANTINE: As of 5 November 2020, a total of <u>9,600</u> ROFs were confirmed positive with COVID-19. Of which, <u>277</u> are admitted at <u>15</u> quarantine facilities, <u>9,308</u> were able to recover and <u>5</u> died.

As of 04 August 2020, a total of <u>642</u> Non-OFWs under quarantine in <u>141</u> Accommodation Establishments (AEs) in NCR.

DEPARTURES: As of 4 November 2020, TG-MROF was able to assist <u>221,963</u> ROFs back to their home provinces. Of which, <u>77,499</u> were assisted by land, <u>139,574</u> by air, and <u>4,890</u> by sea.

ASSISTANCE: As of 24 September 2020, a total of <u>333,985</u> OFWs were assisted thru OWWA. Of which, <u>151,017</u> were assisted through the "*Hatid-sundo*" *Program*, <u>156,378</u> through the "*OFW Kalinga*" *Program*, <u>7,123</u> were assisted through the "*Tulong Marino*" *Program* and <u>19,467</u> assistances to stranded OFWs in the region.

RETURNING FILIPINOS (REFs) from SABAH: As of 02 October 2020, a total of <u>1,986</u> REFs from Sabah arrived in the country and were assisted to go back in their home provinces.

MORATORIUM: As of 17 October 2020, a total of <u>4</u> areas in Region VI and BARMM had temporarily suspended the acceptance of ROFs and LSIs.
