
Summary of Effects³

As of **06 April 2020**, a total of **3,660 confirmed COVID-19 cases** were monitored and reported in the Philippines, of which **163** persons were declared **dead** while **73** persons have already **recovered**.

As of **04 April 2020**, a total of **67 provinces**, **113 cities** and **1,336 municipalities** have delcared community quarantine.




Figure 1 LGUs with community quarantine declarations



Summary of Effects to Overseas Filipinos7

As of **07 April 2020**, around **34** countries have Overseas Filipinos (OFs) with confirmed COVID-19 cases. A total of **535 confirmed COVID-19 cases** for OFs were monitored and reported, of which **55** were declared **dead** while **133** persons have already **recovered**. Meanwhile, a total of **347** persons are considered as **PUIs**.

The region of Asia and the Pacific has the highest number of confirmed COVID-19 cases for overseas Filipinos (216 cases) while the region of Middle East and Africa has the lowest number of confirmed cases (55 cases).

A total of 6,956 OFs have successfully been repatriated.

Status of Logistical Support Services⁸

The NDRRMC Emergency Operations Center (EOC), managed by the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), faciltaited the provision of logistics and transportation support for various items and goods for COVID-19 response:

As of **06 April 2020**, majority of the requests for transportation services are from government entities with a total of 39 requests: 25 or 64% of the total are already completed. Meanwhile, a total of 39 requests are from non-government intitutions, 18 or 46% of which are completed.

In total, 44 or 54% of the requests are completed while the remaining 37 requests are currently being processed for delivery.




Figure 2 Total logistical support requests delivered per region


As of 06 April 2020, there is an average of 66% dispatch of the total procured and donated medical supplies delivered. Based on the report of OCD, the office has **dispatched completely** N95 face masks while the other items have remaining balances in the OCD warehouse. The dispatch and delivery of resources of OCD is based on the verified and approved allocation of DOH.

As of **07 April 2020**, a total of **PHP 3,404,216,440.07 worth of assistance** was provided to the affected families. The assistance was jointly provided by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), local government units (LGUs), non-government organizations (NGOs) and private partners.



Status of Standby Family Foodpacks¹²

As of **07 April 2020**, a total of **421,238** family food packs are stockpiled in the DSWD warehouses nationwide. The **highest** number of stockpiling of FFPs is in **NRLMB-NROC** as the main warehouse of DSWD and the **least** number is in **NCR**. There's an **8%** increase of the production and stockpiling of food packs.




Graph 5 Summary of Stockpiled Family Food packs

Offers of International Assistance¹²

As of **07 April 2020**, the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) has processed/assisted in the facilitation of donations from 4 foreign governments, 1 international organization, and 15 private companies and individuals. Most of the assistance provided were testing kits, PPEs and other medical supplies.

Out of the total offers for international assistance, 41% have been received by the Philippines, 58% are currently being processed.

Crisis Communication Efforts14

Crisis Communication is the new Response Cluster organized by the NDRRMC, with the Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO) as the lead agency. Several strategies were used to deliver key messages to address the public health emergency. Information, education and communication IEC campaigns and efforts were conducted such social media postings, press briefings and press releases since 04 February 2020 to present

Key messages include the following:

- Highlights and milestones of government efforts
- Support of NDRRMC member agencies to Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF)
- Conduct of meetings to discuss response actions and priorities
- Distribution of donated personal protective equipment (PPEs) and other supplies
- Corrections on false information

Based on monitoring of the OCD's accounts, terms of people reached (total people who viewed the content) and impressions (total number of times the content is displayed in the webpage) are as follows:



Activation of Incident Command System (ICS)15

Incident Command System (ICS) is an on-scene all-hazard incident management tool that can be used to response at the tactical level. In response to the COVID-19 situation, several Incident Management Teams (IMTs) have been deployed to manage the tactical resources intended to deliver health, safety and security services to all affected communities.

As of 06 April 2020, a total of **340 IMTs** were deployed to manage the COVID19 in their respective LGUs.
