#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

#### Summary of Effects<sup>1</sup>

As of 31 March 2020, a total of 2,084 confirmed COVID-19 cases were monitored and reported in the Philippines, of which 88 persons were declared dead while 49 persons have already recovered. Meanwhile, a total of 968 persons are considered Patients Under Investigation (PUIs).

Below is the graphical presentation on the trend of COVID-19 cases from 30 March 2020 to 31 March 2020.




Figure 1Trend of COVID-19 Cases from 30 March to 31 March 2020

From 30 March to 31 March 2020, the trends observed are as follows:

- There is **5% increase in PUIs** (48 cases)
- There is 35% increase in Confirmed Cases (538 cases)
- There is 13% increase in Deaths (10 cases)
- There is 17% increase in Recoveries (7 cases)

Figure 2 Confirmed COVID-19 cases by residence


As of **31 March 2020**, **NCR** has the **highest number** of COVID-19 cases while the **least number** of COVID-19 cases are from regions **SOCCSKARGEN**, **Eastern Visayas and Bicol**. The data for CARAGA is subject for verification.

## Summary of Effects to Overseas Filipinos<sup>3</sup>

As of 31 March 2020, a total of 368 confirmed COVID-19 cases for Overseas Filipinos were monitored and reported, of which 9 were declared dead while 117 persons have already recovered. Meanwhile, a total of 368 persons are considered Patients Under Investigation (PUIs).

A total of **30 countries** have Overseas Filipinos with confirmed COVID-19 cases. The breakdown of cases is as follows:

Graph 1 Total COVID-19 cases affecting overseas Filipinos per region


Based on the above graph, the region of Asia and the Pacific has the highest number of confirmed COVID-19 cases for overseas Filipinos (193 cases) while the region of Middle East and Africa has the lowest number of confirmed cases (48 cases).

According to the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), around **9,526 Overseas** Filipinos are expected to be repatriated, of which 4,368 are now undergoing the necessary arrangements.

# II. TASK GROUP UPDATES Task Group Response Operations

## Initiation of Community Quarantine Declaration<sup>5</sup>

A total of **67 provinces**, **113 cities** and **1,336 municipalities** have delcared community quarantine. Below is the index map the presents the




Figure 3 Index map of LGUs with community quarantine declarations

#### Number of Response Personnel Deployed<sup>6</sup>

With the instructions from the Department of Health (DOH), Regional Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (RESU) staff and nurses were deployed to undertake contact tracing. The Philippine National Police (PNP) and Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) also mobilized the respective personnel.



Graph 3 Total RESU staff, nurses, PNP personnel and BFP personnel per region

As of 31 March 2020, the total workforce deployment is composed of 219 RESU staff, 16,181 nurses, 16,766 personnel from PNP, and 6718 personnel from BFP.

CALABARZON has the highest number of RESU staff deployed (36 personnel) while BARMM has the lowest number of RESU staff deployed (5 personnel).

Region VIII has the highest number of nurses deployed (2,124 personnel) while NCR has the lowest number of nurses deployed (328). Given the highest number of confirmed cases in NCR, the region needs more nurses and medical workers in hospitals.

Data from Regions I, IX and XI are still for verification.

NCR has the highest number of PNP personnel deployed (5,117 personnel) while Region I has the lowest number of PNP personnel deployed (110 personnel).


Region V has the highest number of BFP personnel deployed (1,033 personnel) while CARAGA has the lowest number of BFP personnel deployed (642 personnel).

Region VIII has the highest number of functional BHERTs. MIMAROPA has 0 reported functional BHERTs while Region XI has no report submitted.

Report on the number of funcitonal Barangay Health Emergency Response Teams (BHERTs) are to be determined.

#### Establishment of Quarantine Control Points7

Quarantine control points (QCPs) have been established by the local government units (LGUs) under the supervision of the PNP to implement the procedures for community quarantine. The Joint Task Force Coronavirus (JTF CV) Shield composed PNP, BFP, Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) and Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) has also been organized and stationed at the QCPs. Further, QCPs have been established in sea and airports and operated by JTF CV Shield.

As of 31 March 2020, a total of 1,813 QCPs were operated by the PNP, 2,380 were operated by the JTF CV Shield, 94 were operated at airports, and 472 were operated at seaports.

BARMM has the highest number of total QCPs (718 QCPs) operated:

- 501 QCPs operated by PNP
- 167 QCPs operated by JTF CV Shield
- · 6 QCPs operated at the airports
- 44 QCPs operated at the sea ports.


On the other hand, Region I has the lowest number of total QCPs (63 QCPs) operated:

- 2 QCPs operated by PNP
- 49 QCPs operated by JTF CV Shield
- 6 QCPs operated at the airports
- 6 operated at the sea ports

#### TASK GROUP RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AND LOGISTICS

#### Status of Health Facilities for Referral and Isolation Facilities<sup>8</sup>

Health facilities (both public and private facilities) are in operation. The health facilities are classified as Level 1 (basic level with no intensive care units (ICU), and caters to patients with minor care and supervision), Level 2 (with additional facilities such as ICU and specialist doctors) and Level 3 (with high-level specialty services). Further, isolation units have been established.

As of 31 March 2020, a total of 795 Level 1 health facilities and 450 Levels 2-3 health facilities are in operation. Further, a total of 841 isolation facilities have been established.

CALARAZON has the highest number of health facilities (219):

- 137 Level 1 health facilities
- 82 Levels 2 3 health facilities


CARAGA has the least number of health facilities (23):

- 13 Level 1 health facilities
- 10 Levels 2 3 health facilities

Region VII has the highest number of isolation facilities (159 isolation facilities). BARMM has 0 reported isolation facilities while Region XI has no report submitted.

#### Status of Transportation Assets<sup>9</sup>

In terms of transportation assets, the DOH has provided ambulances and the DILG has provided vehicles.

As of **31 March 2020**, a total of **188 ambulances** from DOH are in operation. Further, a total of **263 vehicles from DILG** are in operation.

Metro Manila has the highest number of DOH ambulances (58 ambulances) while CALABARZON has the lowest number of DOH ambulances (2 ambulances).

Region X has the highest number of DILG vehicles (26 vehicles) while Region I has the lowest number of DILG vehicles (10 vehicles).


