**"AMBO" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH WHILE MOVING SLOWLY NORTHWESTWARD.**

- In the next 24 hours, the trough of TD AMBO will bring scattered light to moderate with **at times heavy rainshowers** during thunderstorms over Mindanao. Residents in these areas are advised to **take precautionary measures** and continue monitoring for updates, especially the local rainfall or thunderstorm advisories and heavy rainfall warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions (PRSD). **Flooding and rain-induced landslides may occur in highly to very highly susceptible areas during heavy or prolonged rainfall.**
- Moderate to rough seas will be experienced over the eastern seaboard of Eastern Visayas and Caraga. Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not venture out on these areas.
- **Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal No. 1 may be raised over portions of Eastern Visayas tomorrow in anticipation of potentially strong winds associated with the TD.**
- TD "AMBO" is forecast to intensify into a Tropical Storm in the next 24 hours.

<b>Location of eye/center:</b>	At 10:00 PM today, the center of <b>Tropical Depression "AMBO"</b> was estimated based on all available data at <b>300 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (9.0°N, 129.0°E).</b>
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of up to <b>55 km/h</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>70 km/h.</b>
<b>Movement:</b>	Moving <b>Northwest slowly</b>
