"AMBO" HAS RAPIDLY INTENSIFIED INTO A TYPHOON.

Heavy Rainfall Outlook:

- Tomorrow (14 May): **Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains** over Eastern Visayas, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, and Masbate.
- Friday (15 May): **Heavy to intense with at times torrential rains** over Bicol Region and Northern Samar. **Moderate to heavy rains over CALABARZON, Aurora, Marinduque, Romblon, and Mindoro Provinces.**
- Residents in these areas are advised to take precautionary measures, coordinate with local disaster risk reduction and management offices, and continue monitoring for updates, especially the local rainfall or thunderstorm advisories and heavy rainfall warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions (PRSD). **Flooding and rain-induced landslides may occur in highly to very highly susceptible areas during heavy or prolonged rainfall.**

Tropical Cyclone Winds:

- **Strong to near gale force winds will begin affecting Samar Provinces and Biliran tomorrow morning; Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, and Masbate tomorrow evening; Camarines Provinces Friday early morning.**
- **Damaging gale storm force winds will begin affecting the areas under Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) No. 2 tomorrow afternoon.**
- **TCWS No. 1 may be raised over Quezon and Marinduque in the next bulletin.**

Other Hazards and Warning Information:

- **Sea travel is risky for all types of seacrafts over the seaboard of areas under TCWS.**
- **AMBO intensified into a typhoon at 8:00 PM today. It is forecast to continuously intensify in the next 24 hours.**

- The typhoon may pass close to Northern Samar tomorrow evening before making landfall over Albay-Sorsogon area on Friday early morning.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Typhoon “AMBO” was estimated based on all available data at 245 km East Northeast of Borongan City, Eastern Samar or 325 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar (12.2°N, 127.6°E) .			
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 130 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 160 km/h .			
Movement:	Moving Westward at 15 km/h .

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next Severe Weather Bulletin to be issued at 5:00 AM tomorrow.				

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
