### The Low Pressure Area (LPA) East of Mindanao has developed into Tropical Depression “AMBO”.

- The LPA developed into a TD over the Philippine Sea East of Mindanao at 2:00 PM today.
- In the next 24 hours, the trough of TD “AMBO” will bring scattered light to moderate with isolated heavy rains during thunderstorms over CARAGA, Davao Region, SOCCSKSARGEN, and Maguindanao. Residents in these areas are advised to continue monitoring for updates, especially the local rainfall or thunderstorm advisories and heavy rainfall warnings of PAGASA Regional Services Division (PRSD).
- The raising of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal in any locality of the country remains less likely in the next 48 hours.

<b>Location of eye/center:</b>	At <b>4:00 PM</b> today, the center of <b>Tropical Depression “AMBO”</b> was estimated based on all available data at <b>545 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (7.6°N, 131.2°E)</b> .
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of up to <b>45 km/h</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>55 km/h</b> .
<b>Movement:</b>	Moving <b>West Northwest</b> at <b>15 km/h</b>
<b>Forecast Positions:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>24 Hour (Tomorrow afternoon): 460 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (9.6°N, 129.7°E)</b></li><li>• <b>48 Hour (Tuesday afternoon): 305 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (11.2°N, 128.5°E)</b></li><li>• <b>72 Hour (Wednesday afternoon): 325 km East of Legazpi City, Albay (12.9°N, 126.7°E)</b></li><li>• <b>96 Hour (Thursday afternoon): 85 km Northwest of Virac, Catanduanes or 90 km East of Daet, Camarines Norte (14.2°N, 123.8°E)</b></li><li>• <b>120 Hour (Friday afternoon): In the vicinity of Quirino, Ilocos Sur (17.1°N, 120.7°E)</b></li></ul>
