#### **TROPICAL DEPRESSION (TD) "AMBO" MOVES NORTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA EAST OF MINDANAO.**

- In the next 24 hours, the trough of TD AMBO will bring scattered light to moderate with isolated heavy rains during thunderstorms over Mindanao. Residents in these areas are advised to continue monitoring for updates, especially the local rainfall or thunderstorm advisories and heavy rainfall warnings of PAGASA Regional Services Division (PRSD).
- Moderate to rough seas will be experienced on the eastern seaboard of Eastern Visayas, Caraga, Davao Oriental, and Davao Occidental. Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not venture out on these areas.
- The raising of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal in any locality of the country remains less likely in the next 48 hours.

<b>Location of eye/center:</b>	At <b>10:00 PM</b> today, the center of Tropical Depression "AMBO" was estimated based on all available data at <b>405 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (8.4°N, 130.0°E)</b> .
<b>Strength:</b>	Maximum sustained winds of up to <b>45 km/h</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>55 km/h</b> .
<b>Movement:</b>	Moving <b>Northwest at 20 km/h</b>
