. SITUATION OVERVIEW

10 May 2020

THE LOW PRESSURE AREA (LPA) EAST OF MINDANAO HAS DEVELOPED INTO TROPICAL DEPRESSION "AMBO".

At 2:00 PM, the LPA over the Philippine Sea east of Mindanao developed into a TD.

At 4:00 PM, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "AMBO" was estimated based on all available data at 545 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (7.6°N, 131.2°E) with maximum winds of up to 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h. It was moving West Northwest at 15 km/h.

11 May 2020

"AMBO" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIED WHILE MOVING SLOWLY WESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA.

At 10:00 AM today, the center of TD "AMBO" was estimated based on all available data at 340 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (08.6 °N, 129.4 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 70 kph. It was moving west slowly.

In the next 24 hours, the trough of TD "AMBO" was forecasted to bring scattered light to moderate with isolated heavy rains during thunderstorms over Mindanao

12 May 2020

"AMBO" MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH WHILE REMAINING ALMOST STATIONARY OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA. ON THE SAME DAY, IT INTENSIFIED INTO A TROPICAL STORM (TS).

At 10:00 PM, the center of TS "AMBO" was estimated based on all available data at 455 km East Northeast of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte or 400 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (11.2 °N, 129.4 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 65 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 80 kph. As of 11:00 PM, there is no Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) issued.

13 May 2020

"AMBO" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH AS IT MOVES NORTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA EAST OF SAMAR ISLAND.

At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Storm "AMBO" was estimated based on all available data at 360 km East of Borongan City, Eastern Samar (11.9°N, 128.7°E) with maximum sustained winds of up to 85 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 105 km/h. TCWS No. 01 was raised over the Northern Samar, northern portion of Samar (Calbayog, Sta. Margarita, Gandara, Matuguinao, Pagsanghan, San Jorge, San Jose De Buan, Tarangnan, Catbalogan City, Jiabong, Motiong,San Sebastian, Paranas, Hinabangan),and Northern portion of Eastern Samar (Jipapad, Maslog, Arteche, San Policarpio, Oras, Dolores, Can-avid, Taft, Sulat, San Julian).

II. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

A. NATIONAL DRRM COUNCIL (NDRRMC)

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. Continuous monitoring and ensure dissemination of Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, and General Flood Advisories to all concerned RDRRMCs/OCDROs through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs).
- b. Conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Meeting on 11 May 2020, 10:00 AM at the NDRRMOC Bldg., Camp Aguinaldo to discuss the preparedness measures of concerned agencies and regions.

2. DOST-PAGASA

- a. Presented weather updates during the PDRA Meeting on 11 May 2020
- b. Continuous weather monitoring and provision of weather updates.

3. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- a. DSWD-Central Office Operations Center is placed on standby for activation to **Blue Alert.**
- b. All transport logistics assets are ready for handling/hauling of relief resources.
- c. The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and the National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have prepositioned the following resources:
 - Total stockpiles and standby funds: ₱1.2 billion

- > <u>Standby Funds</u>: A total of ₱244,927,720.96 standby funds in the CO and FOs.
- ➤ <u>Stockpiles</u>: A total of 412,238 family food packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱179,569,503.06, other food and non-food items amounting to ₱612.029.357.52

B. REGIONAL DRRM COUNCILS (RDRRMC)

RDRRMCs CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, IX, and CAR are continuously monitoring their areas of responsibility. Further, said RDRRMCs are in coordination with their respective member agencies to ensure the widest dissemination of Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, and General Flood Advisories through SMS, facsimile, and official social media websites.

DSWD CALABARZON

- a. Coordinated with the National Food Authority (NFA) to facilitate the hauling of NFA Rice and the production of relief goods in preparation for any untoward incidents.
- b. Emergency Operations Center has been activated to monitor the possible effects of TS "AMBO".
- c. The DRMD has constant communication with the Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) with pre-disaster assessments being conducted.

d. DRMD maintains close coordination with the LGUs with regards to the preparedness efforts undertaken in the Flood, Landslide, and Storm Surge prone areas.

e. Coordinated with SWAD Team Leaders and Provincial Action Team of the CALABARZON and advised them to monitor and coordinate with the LGUs to

gather reports on the possible effects of TS AMBO.

f. Coordinated with LSWDOs and LDRRMOs and instructed them to be on standby alert and prepare their respective evacuation centers, and family food packs should need arises.

g. Coordinated with RDRRMC CALABARZON OpCen for updates on the preparedness level of the members of the Response Cluster of the region.

- h. Informed member agencies of the response cluster to be on-stand-by alert status and ready for mobilization in case of situation arises.
- i. Status of Prepositioned Resources:

Stockpiles and Standby Funds:

Family Food Packs:

A total of 5,614 family food packs is available in GMA and Dasmariñas warehouses amounting to ₱ 2,111,318.00 while there are available raw materials amounting to ₱12,977,170.58.

Standby Funds:

The Standby Fund amounting to ₱ 13,930,365.60 can be utilized to augment the response operation.

- j. HUMAN CAPACITY: Regional and Provincial Quick Response Team (QRT) members are placed on standby alert mode status and ready for mobilization should need arises.
- k. Trained personnel on Psychosocial Support Processing, Family Evacuation Preparedness and Camp Coordination & Camp Management, Inventory and Warehouse Management, Emergency Telecommunications, Incident Command System (ICS), Emergency Operation Center (EOC), Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis and Disaster Information Management that can be mobilized in case need arise.
