TROPICAL DEPRESSION "CARINA" CONTINUES TO MOVE AWAY FROM BATANES PROVINCE.**Track and Intensity Outlook:**

- Tropical Depression "CARINA" is forecast to turn northward while heading towards the Bashi Channel and the southern portion of Taiwan. It is forecast to weaken into a Low Pressure Area today or tomorrow morning.

Rainfall Outlook:

- Today: **Isolated light to moderate rains with at times heavy rain showers over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and Ilocos Norte.**
- Flooding and rain-induced landslides may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards. The public and disaster risk reduction and management offices are advised to take appropriate measures and monitor the Rainfall or Thunderstorm Advisories or Heavy Rainfall Warnings of PAGASA Regional Services Divisions.

Coastal Water Conditions:

- Moderate to rough seas (1.2-3.1 m) will be experienced over the northern and eastern seaboard of Luzon in the next 24 hours. Those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out to sea.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "CARINA" was estimated based on all available data at 155 km West of Basco, Batanes (20.7 °N, 120.5°E)			
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h			
Movement:	Moving Northwestward at 25 km/h


