Severe Weather Bulletin No. 8 for Tropical Depression "CARINA"

"CARINA" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH AS IT CONTINUES TO MOVE CLOSER TOWARDS BATANES.

Track and Intensity Outlook:

- The center of Tropical Depression "CARINA" *is now moving over Luzon Strait and may pass near Batanes.* However, accounting for the forecast track probability cone, a landfall scenario over Batanes remains a possibility.
- *This tropical depression may weaken into a Low-Pressure Area today or tomorrow morning, 15 July 2020 (Wednesday).*

Heavy Rainfall Outlook:

- *Today: Scattered light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Ilocos Region, Zambales, Batanes, and Babuyan Islands.*
- *Flooding and rain-induced landslides may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards.* The public and disaster risk reduction and management offices are advised to take appropriate measures and monitor the Rainfall or Thunderstorm Advisories or Heavy Rainfall Warnings of PAGASA Regional Services Divisions.

Strong Winds:

- The areas under Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal # 1 may experience occasional gusts due to the Tropical Depression.

Coastal Water Conditions:

- *Moderate to rough seas (1.2-3.1 m)* will be experienced over *the seaboard of Northern Luzon* in the next 24 hours. Those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out to sea.

Location of eye/center:	At 1:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "CARINA" was estimated based on all available data at 115 km East Northeast of Calayan, Cagayan or 85 km South Southeast of Basco, Batanes (19.8°N, 122.4°E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h
Movement:	Moving North Northwestward at 20 km/h
Forecast Positions:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 Hour (Tomorrow evening): 180 km North Northwest of Basco, Batanes (22.0°N, 121.5°E)
