Severe Weather Bulletin No. 3 for Tropical Depression "CARINA"

TROPICAL DEPRESSION "CARINA" TURNS TO THE NORTHWEST AS IT CONTINUES TO APPROACH EXTREME NORTHERN LUZON.

Track and Intensity Outlook:

- The center of Tropical Depression "CARINA" is forecast to *move northwestward towards the Luzon Strait, passing roughly 100 km off the northeastern tip of Luzon and near Babuyan Islands and Batanes*. However, accounting for the forecast track probability cone, a landfall scenario over these areas remains a possibility.
- This tropical depression is forecast to weaken into a Low Pressure Area on 15 July 2020 (Wednesday).

Heavy Rainfall Outlook:

- Today: **Moderate to heavy rains** over Babuyan Islands and Isabela. **Light to moderate with at times heavy rains** over Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, the rest of Cagayan Valley, Aurora, and the northern portion of Quezon including Polillo Islands. **Scattered rain showers and thunderstorms over Metro Manila, the rest of Central Luzon, the rest of CALABARZON, Mindoro Provinces, Marinduque, and Camarines Norte.**
- Flooding and rain-induced landslides may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards. The public and disaster risk reduction and management offices are advised to take appropriate measures and monitor the Rainfall or Thunderstorm Advisories or Heavy Rainfall Warnings of PAGASA Regional Services Divisions.

Strong Winds:

- The areas under Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal # 1 may experience occasional gusts due to the Tropical Depression.

Coastal Water Conditions:

- **Moderate to rough seas (1.2-3.1 m)** will be experienced over the northern and eastern seaboard of Luzon in the next 24 hours. **Those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out to sea.**

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 AM today, the center of " CARINA " was estimated based on all available data at 245 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (18.0 °N, 124.0°E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h
Movement:	Moving Northwestward at 15 km/h
Forecast Positions:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 20 km South Southwest of Basco, Batanes (20.3°N, 121.9°E) • 48 Hour (Wednesday morning): 420 km North of Basco, Batanes (24.2°N, 121.9°E)
