TROPICAL DEPRESSION "CARINA" SLOWS DOWN AS IT CONTINUES TO MOVE NORTHWESTWARD

- *All tropical cyclone wind signals have been lifted. However, coastal areas in Extreme Northern Luzon may experience intermittent gusts.*
- *"Carina" is forecast to weaken into a Low Pressure Area (LPA) tonight or tomorrow morning.*
- *Moderate to rough seas (1.2-3.1 m) will be experienced over the seaboards of Batanes, Ilocos Norte, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, and Isabela in the next 24 hours. Those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out to sea.*

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "CARINA" was estimated based on all available data at 140 km West Northwest of Basco, Batanes (20.9 °N, 120.7°E)
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h
Movement:	Moving Northwestward Slowly
Forecast Positions:	• 24 Hour (Tomorrow afternoon): 385 km North of Basco, Batanes (23.9°N, 121.5°E)
