THE LOW PRESSURE AREA EAST OF CAGAYAN HAS DEVELOPED INTO TROPICAL DEPRESSION "DINDO".

Hazards affecting land:

- This tropical cyclone has no direct impact on the country at the moment. No tropical cyclone wind signal is in effect over the country.
- The **Southwest Monsoon enhanced by another Tropical Depression outside the PAR** will bring occasional monsoon rains (light to moderate with at times heavy) over Luzon, Western Visayas, and Zamboanga Peninsula.
- **Flooding and rain-induced landslide may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards.** The public and local disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to monitor the Rainfall/Thunderstorm Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

Coastal water conditions:

- **A Gale Warning is in effect** over the northern and western seaboard of Luzon. **Sea travel is risky over these areas due to rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 4.5 m).**
- Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out over the other seaboard of the country due to moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.5 m).

Other tropical cyclones being monitored:

- At **8:00 PM today**, the **Tropical Depression outside the PAR** was estimated based on all available data at 920 km West of Northern Luzon (17.8°N, 111.9°E). It has maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h. It is currently moving west northwestward at 10 km/h.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today , the center of Tropical Depression "DINDO" was estimated based on all available data at 825 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (18.1°N, 129.5°E).
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Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h
Movement:	West Northwestward at 10 km/h.
Forecast Positions:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 Hour (Tomorrow evening): 575 km East of Basco, Batanes (20.8°N, 127.5°E) • 48 Hour (Sunday evening): 460 km Northeast of Basco, Batanes (23.4°N, 125.1°E) • 72 Hour (Monday evening): 740 km North of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (27.1°N, 122.3°E) • 96 Hour (Tuesday evening): 1,180 km North of Basco, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (30.9°N, 120.0°E)
NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNAL	
The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next update to be incorporated in the 4:00 AM Public Weather Forecast and in the next Severe Weather Bulletin to be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.	

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Moreover, you are hereby directed to reiterate the guidelines on personal protection and hygiene such as respiratory etiquette and hand hygiene, social distancing, environmental, and food safety measures.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
