#### **DINDO" INTENSIFIES INTO A TROPICAL STORM.**

Track and intensity outlook:

- On the forecast track, Tropical Storm DINDO is forecast to move generally northwestward and will move near or over the southern islands of the Ryukyu archipelago on Monday morning. It is likely to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Monday morning. DINDO will remain far from the Philippine landmass throughout the forecast period.
- Additional intensification remains likely over the next two to three days ahead of its landfall over eastern China. DINDO may reach severe tropical storm category by Monday morning.

#### Hazards affecting land:

- This tropical cyclone has no direct impact on the country at the moment. No tropical cyclone wind signal is in effect over the country.
- Tonight through tomorrow evening, occasional rains (light to moderate with at times heavy) due to the Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Luzon, Western Visayas, Central Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, Northern Mindanao, and Bangsamoro.
- Flooding and rain-induced landslide may occur during heavy or prolonged rainfall especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards. The Public and Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices concerned are advised to monitor the Rainfall/Thunderstorm Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions and take appropriate measures.

#### Hazards affecting coastal waters:

- A Gale Warning is in effect over the seaboards of Northern Luzon and the western seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon. Sea travel is risky over these areas due to rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 4.5 m).
- Those with small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out over the other seaboards of the country due to moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 2.5 m).

# **Other information:**

• The international name "HAGUPIT" was contributed by the Republic of the Philippines.

Location of eye/center:	At 10:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Storm "DINDO" was estimated based on all available data at 500 km East Northeast of Basco, Batanes (21.6°N, 126.6°E).
Strength:	Maximum sustained winds of up to 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h.
Movement:	Moving West Northwestward at 20 km/h.
